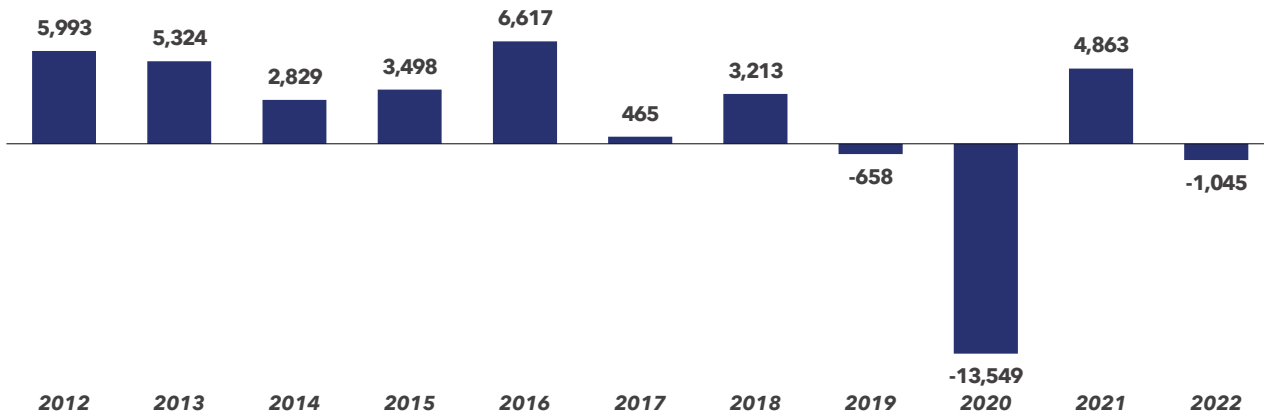

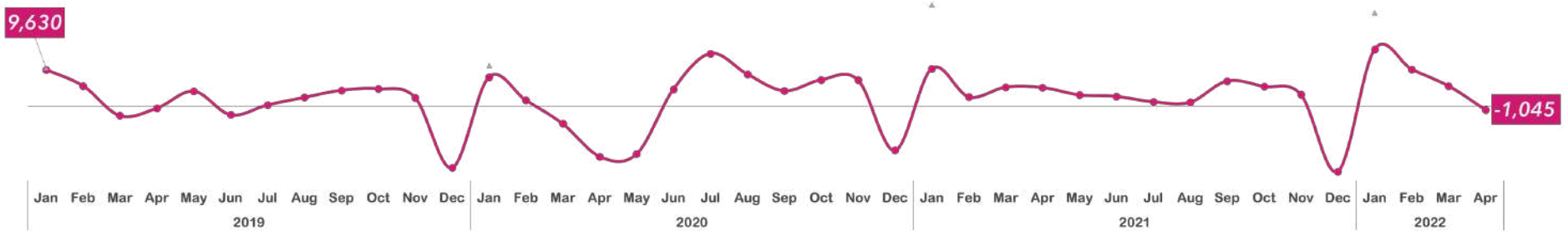

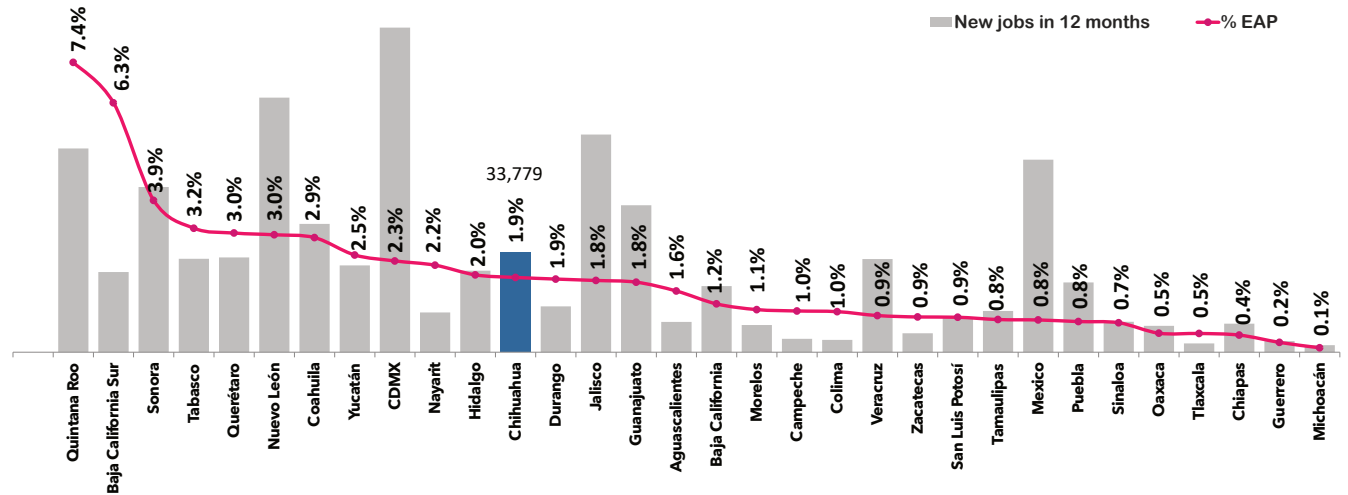

BY STATE PROPORTIONALLY TO THE EAP*

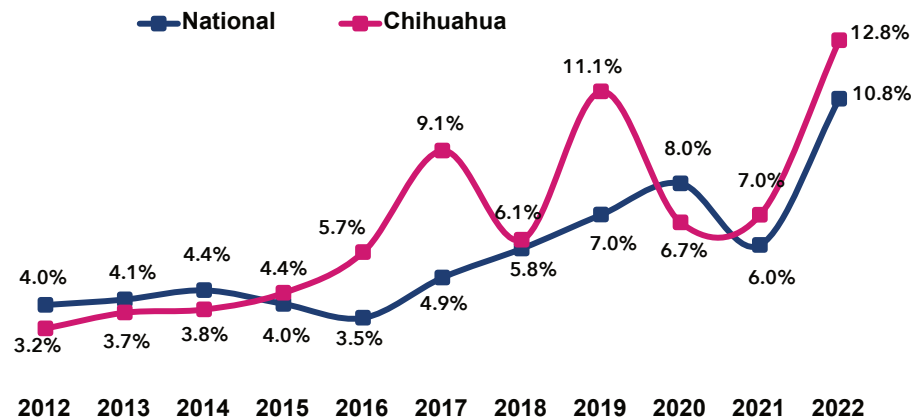
In the period from April 2021 to the same period of 2022, there is a growth of **33,779** jobs, being the state with the eleventh place in jobs created as a proportion of the EAP.



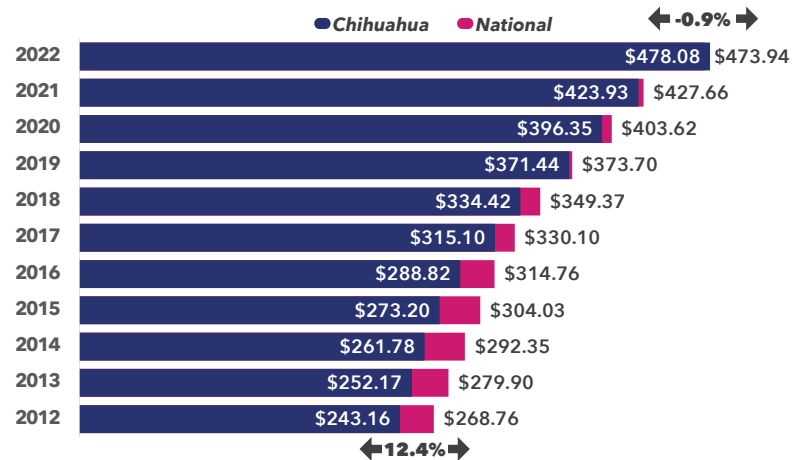
DAILY SALARY ASSOCIATED

ANNUAL GROWTH OF THE DAILY SALARY ASSOCIATED TO WORKERS ANNUAL RATE AS OF APRIL

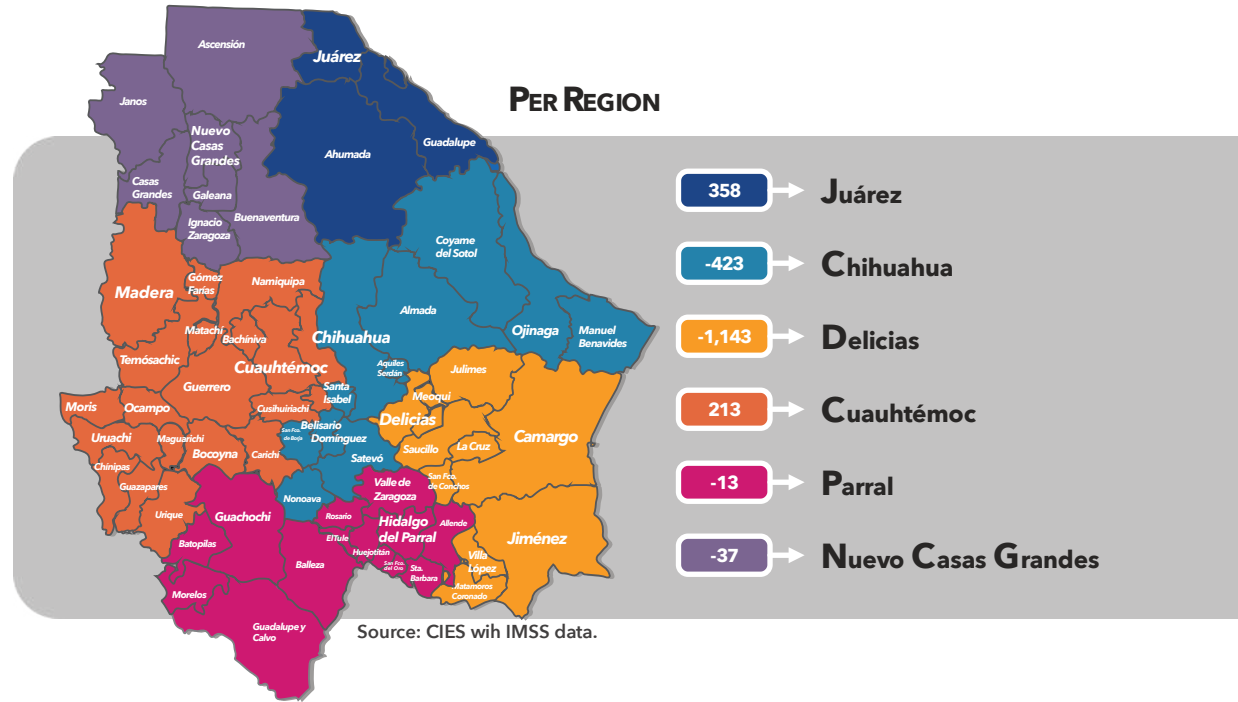
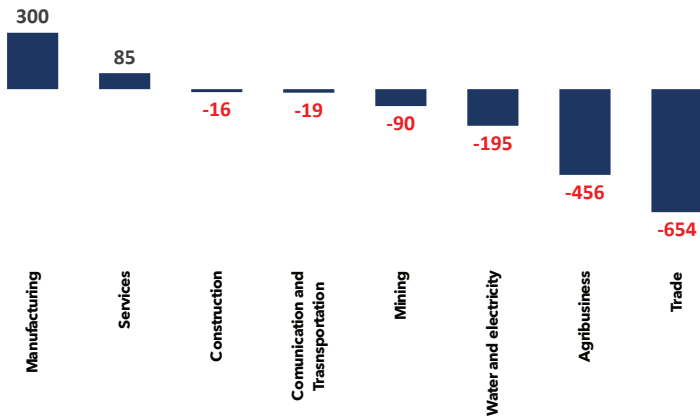

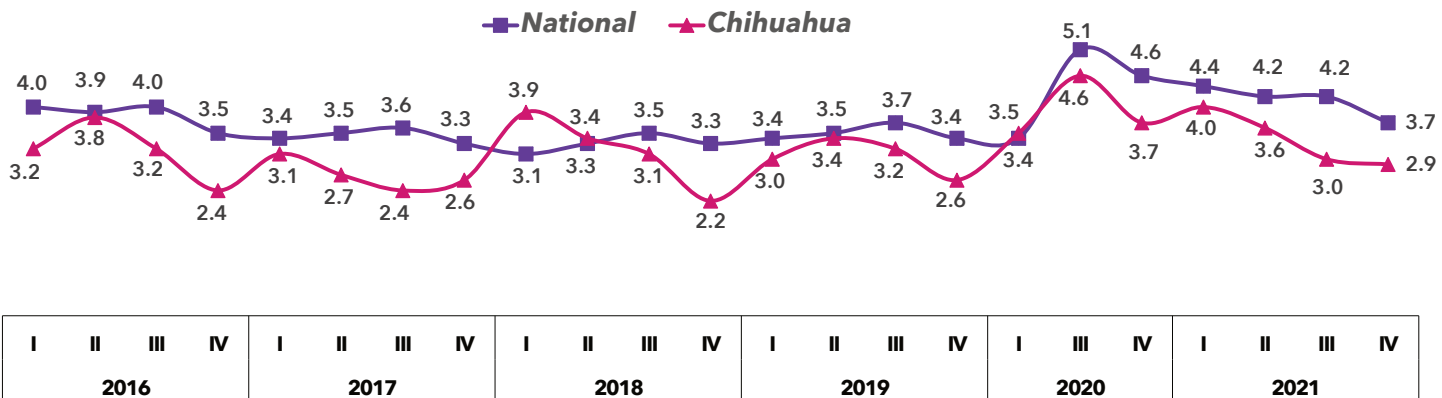

UNEMPLOYMENT RATE



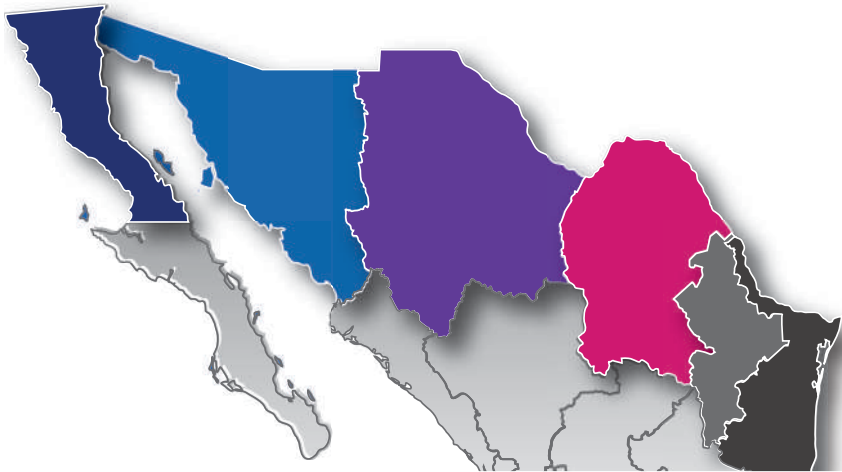

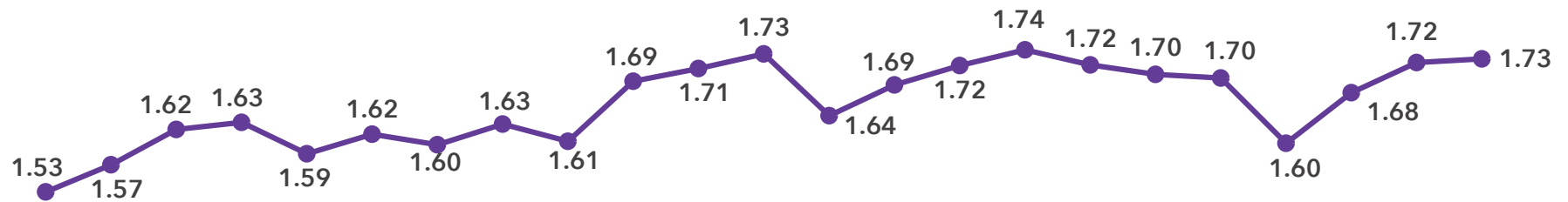

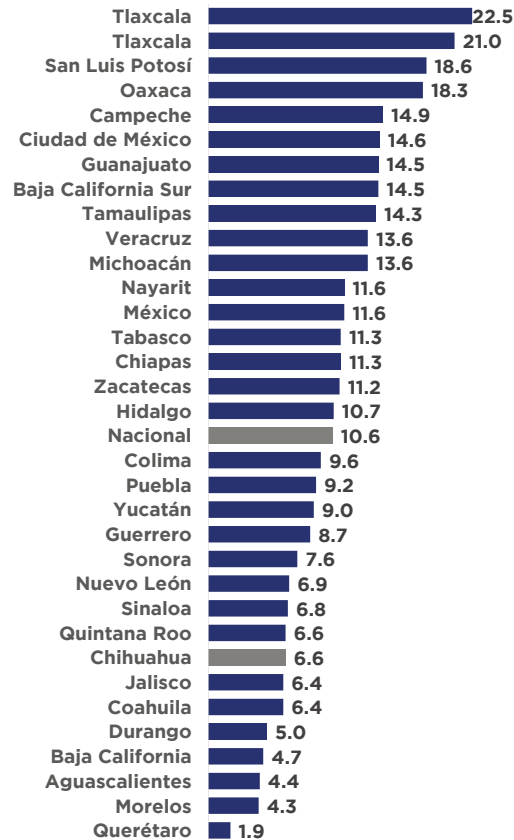

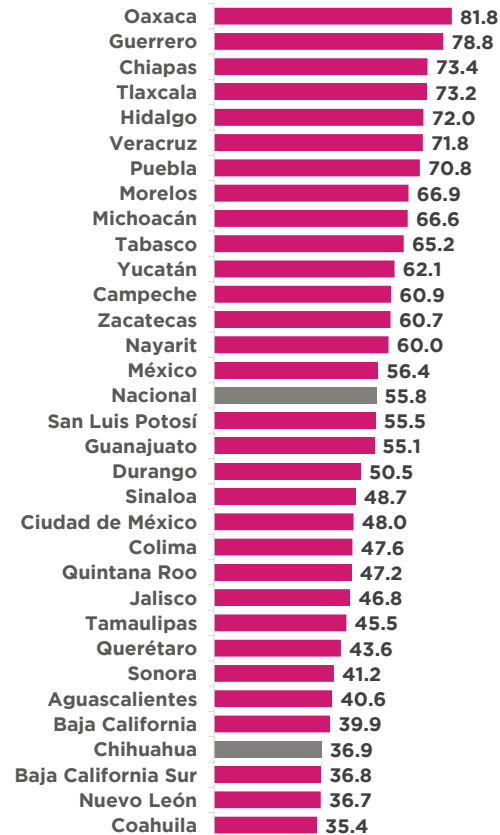

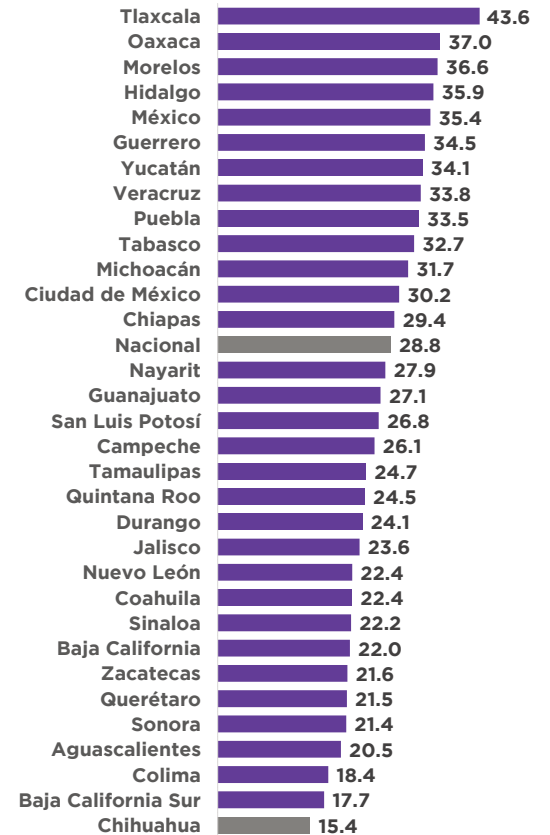
Informal Labor Rate*

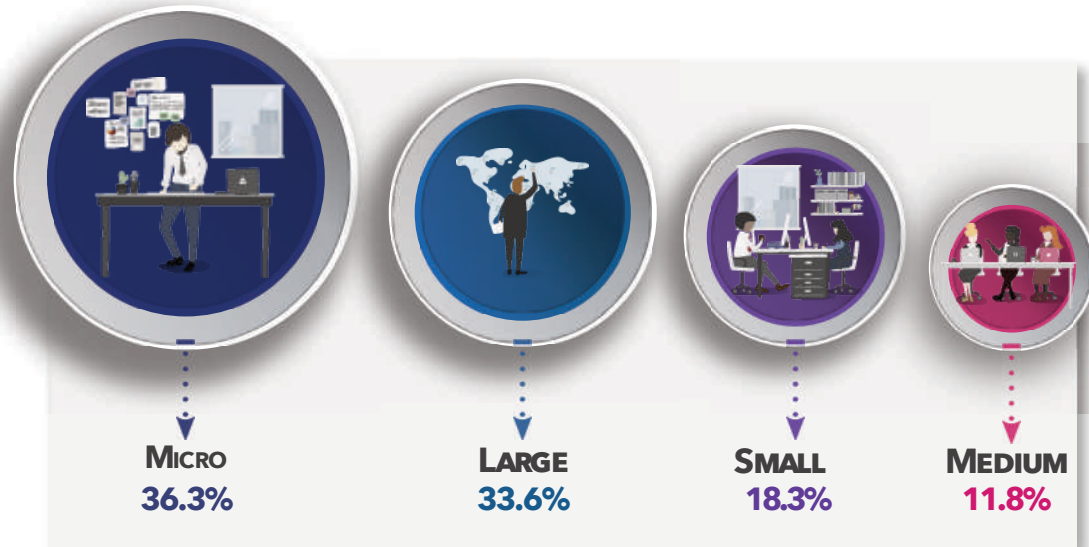

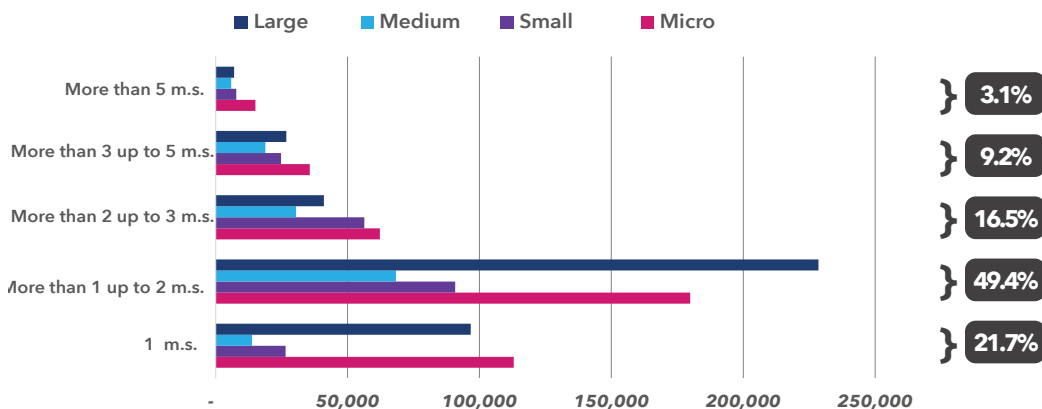

IN THE STATE OF CHIHUAHUA TO IV QUARTER 2021



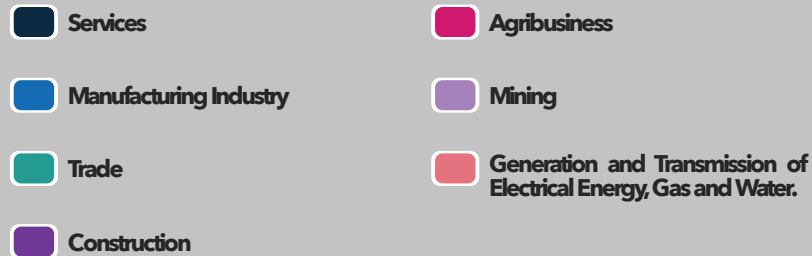

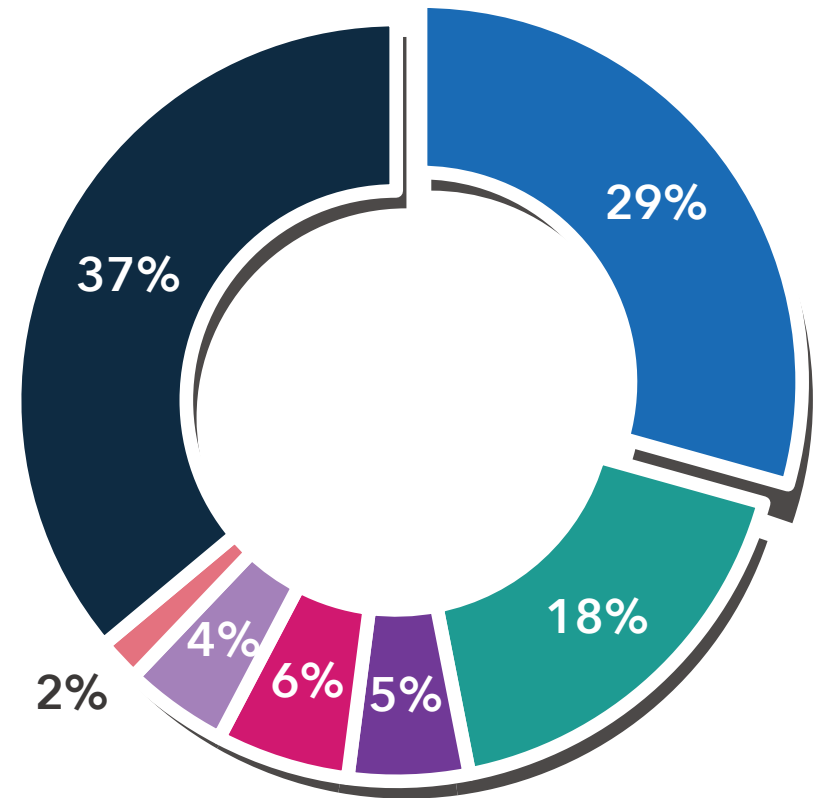

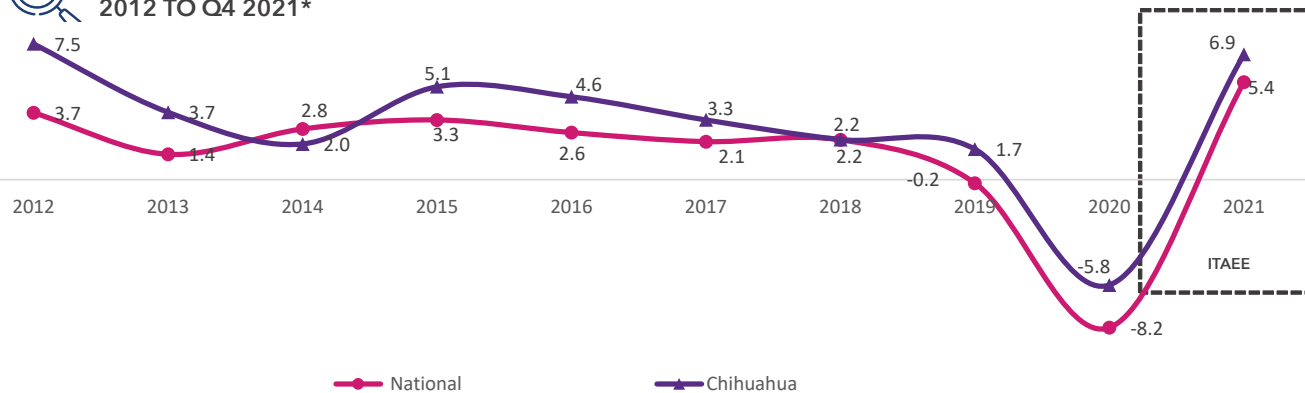

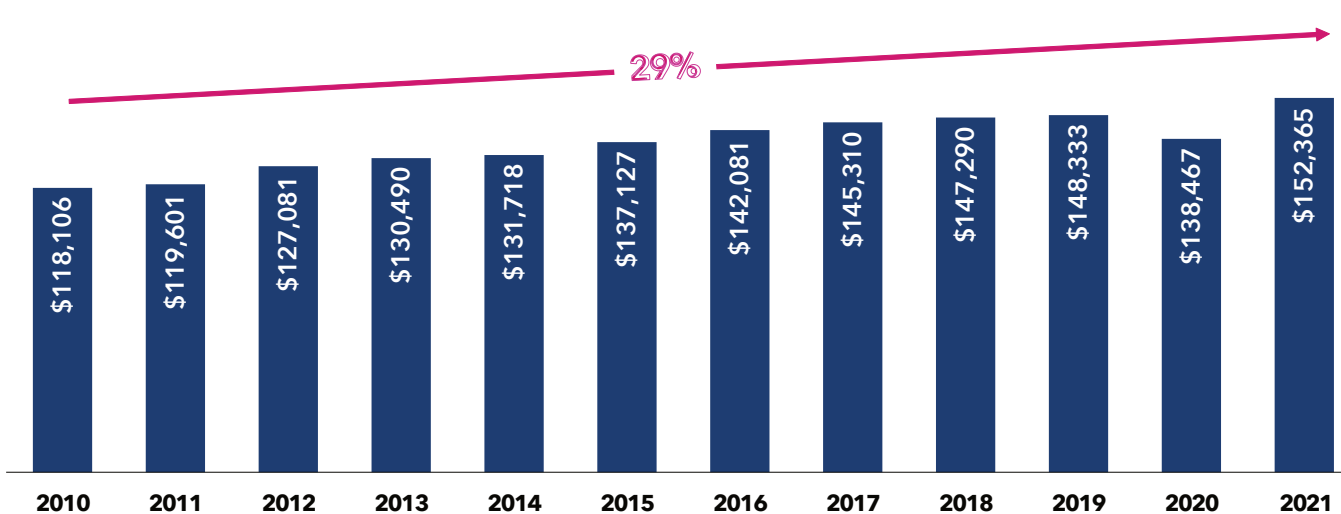

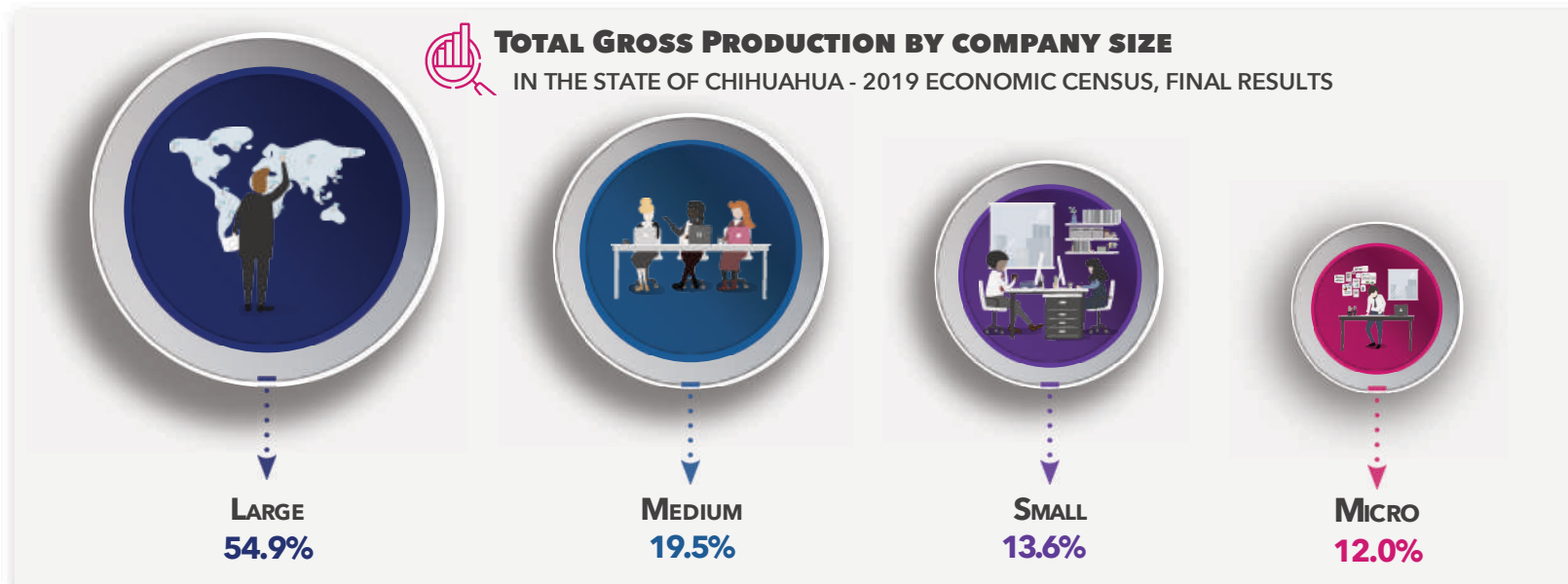

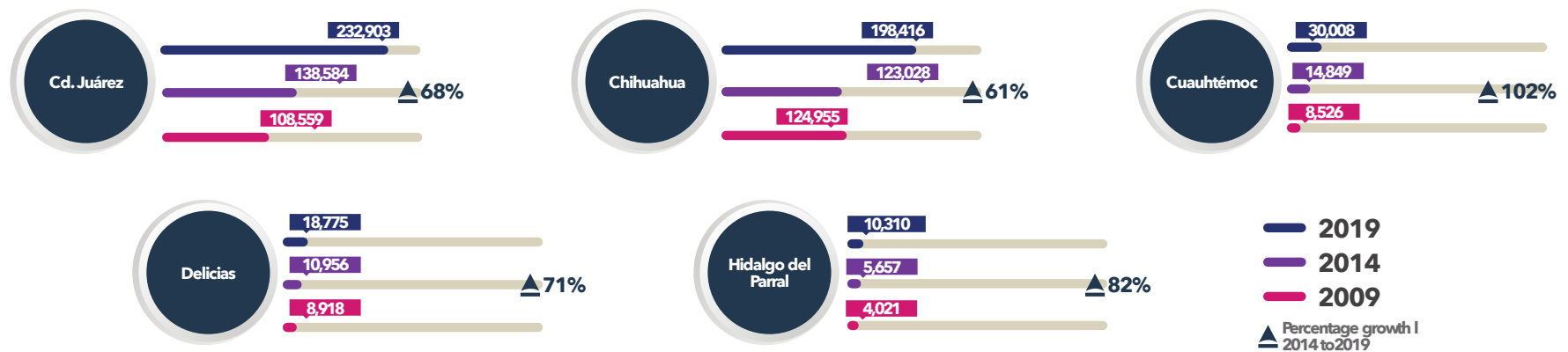

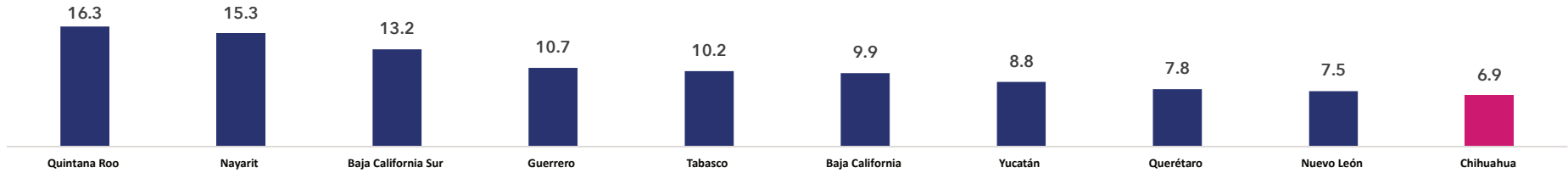

QUARTERLY INDICATOR OF STATE ECONOMIC ACTIVITY



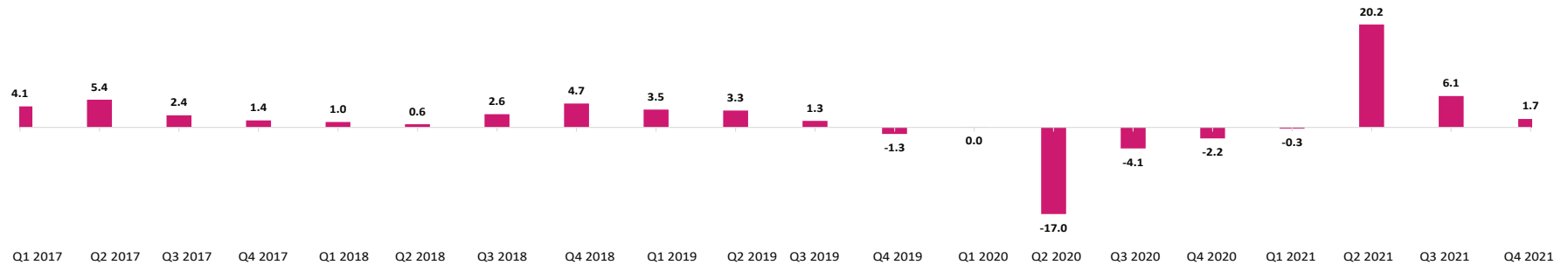
AVERAGE ECONOMIC GROWTH BY STATE

ANNUAL PERCENTAGE CHANGE - AVERAGE AS OF Q4 2021 (SEASONALLY ADJUSTED SERIES)



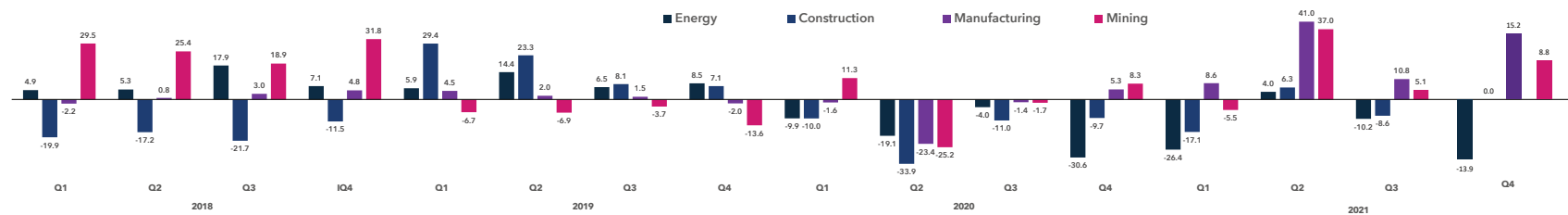
ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN CHIHUAHUA

ANNUAL VARIATION OF THE ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN INDUSTRIAL SECTORS

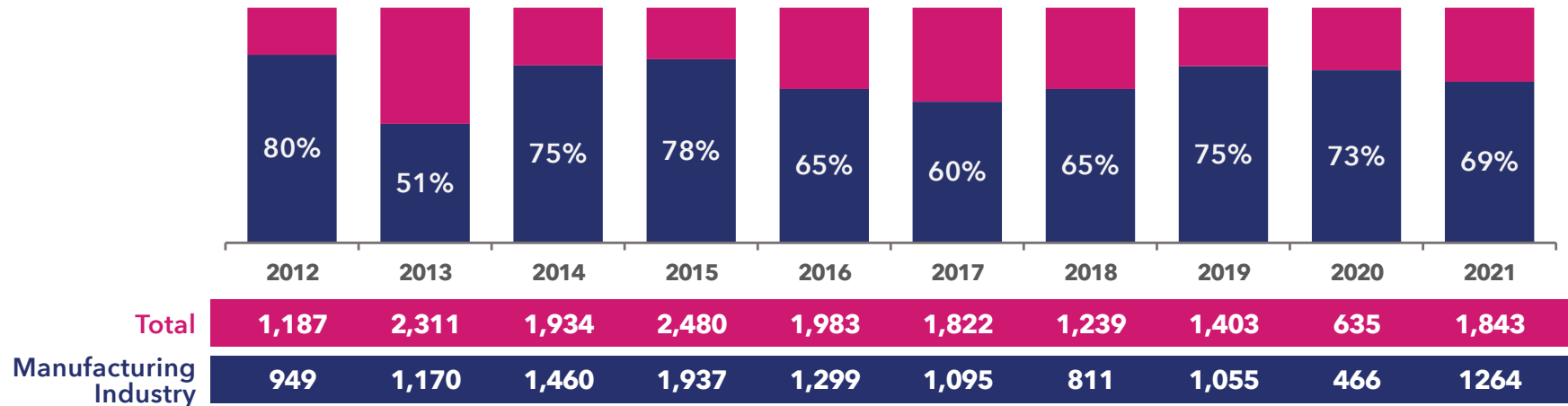

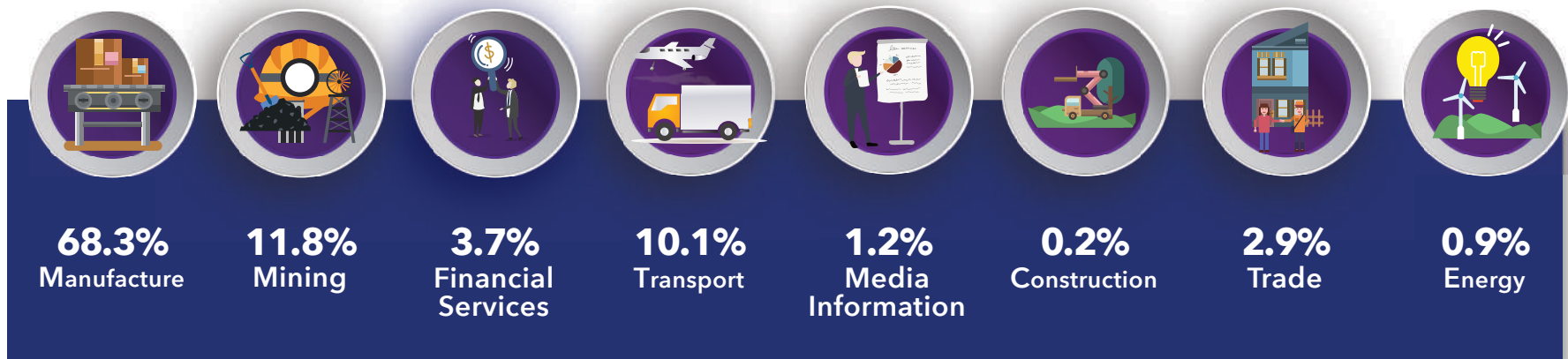

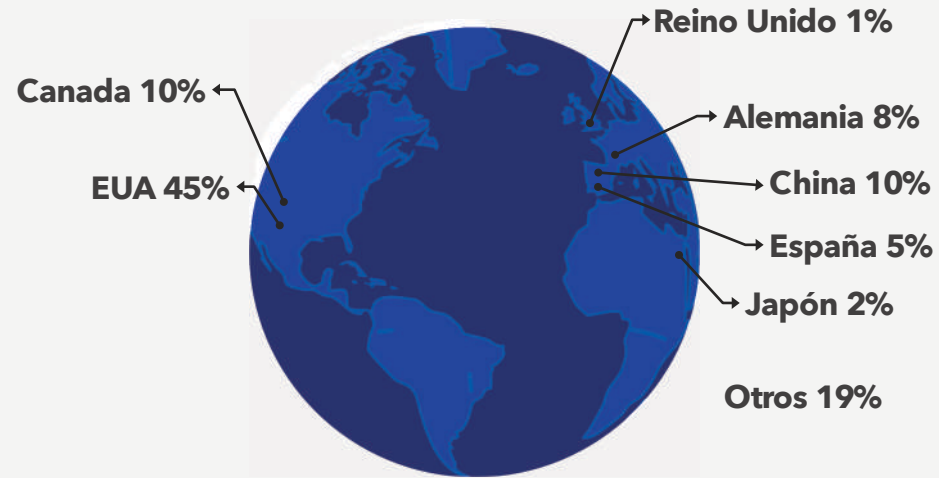


FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT IN THE STATE BY COUNTRY

THIRD QUARTER 2021

Based on the Federal Secretary of Economy data, Mexico registered 24.832 billion dollars in Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) as of the third quarter of 2021.

During the same period, Chihuahua received 1,169.6 million dollars, contributing 4.7% of the national total, and the state is ranked 6th as the recipient of FDI after Mexico City, Nuevo Leon, Baja California, Guanajuato and Jalisco.

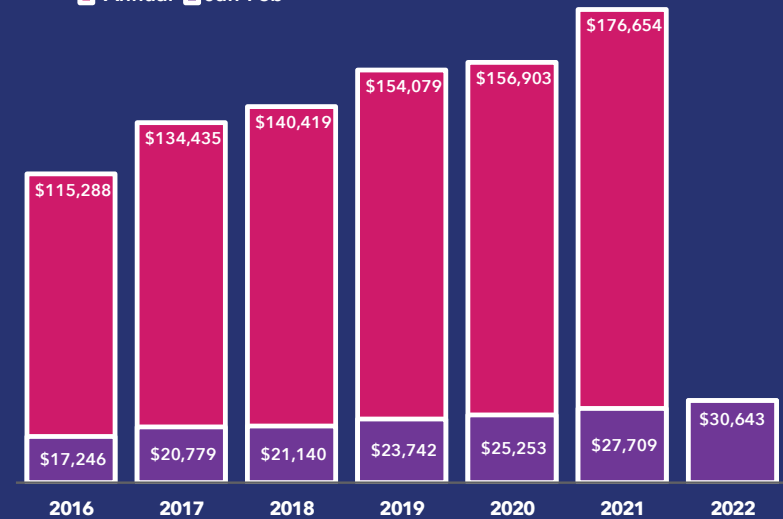

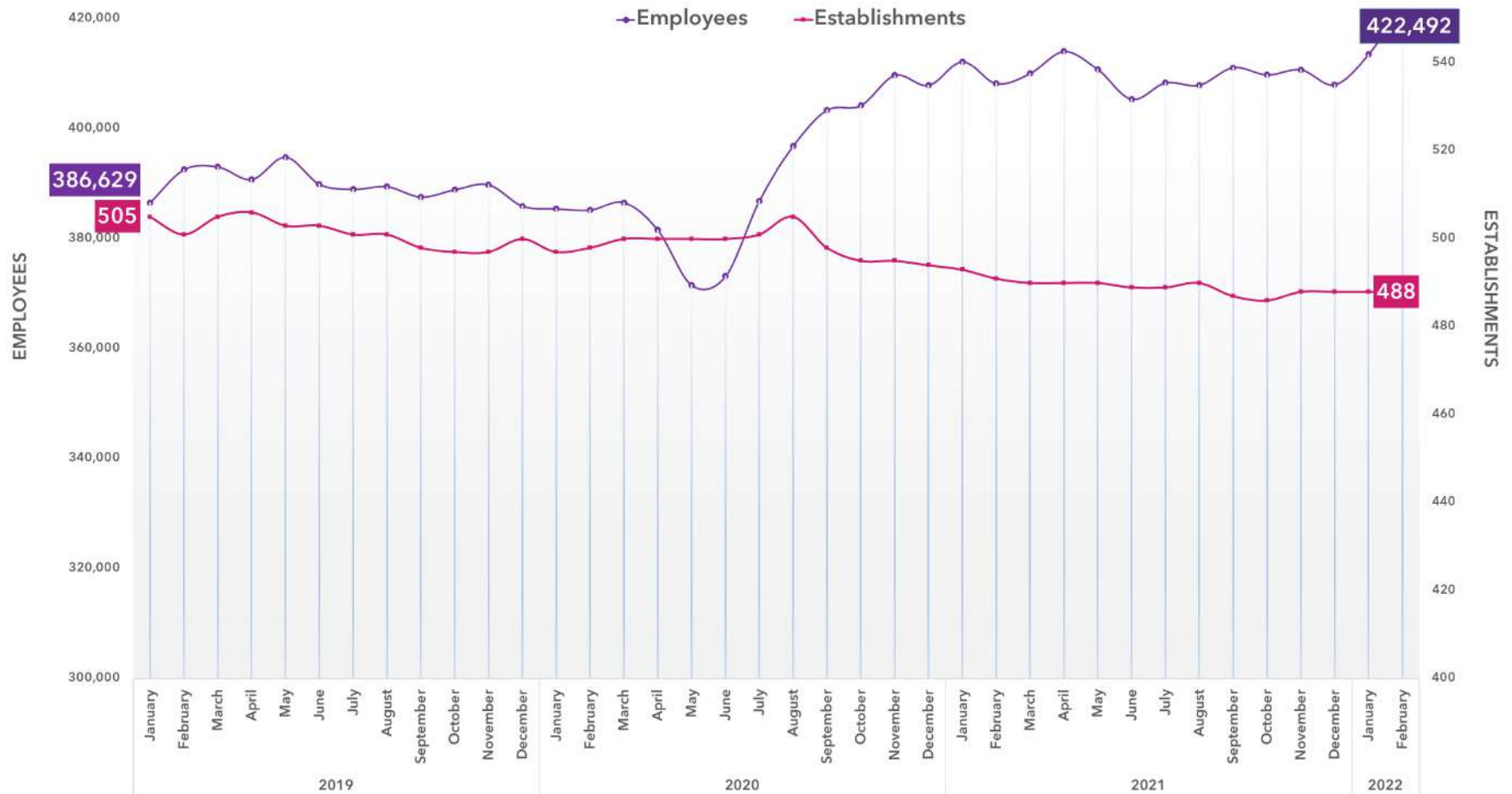

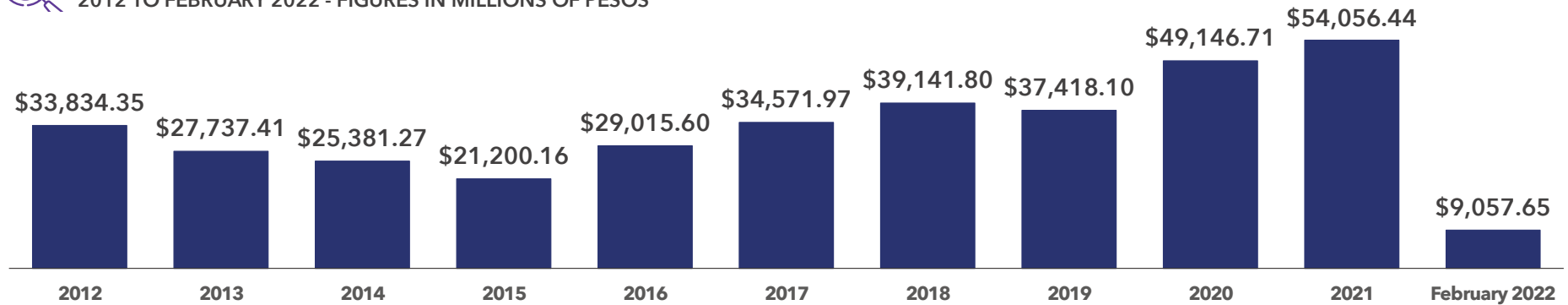

2012 TO FEBRUARY 2022 - FIGURES IN MILLIONS OF PESOS

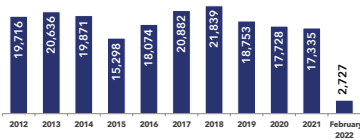

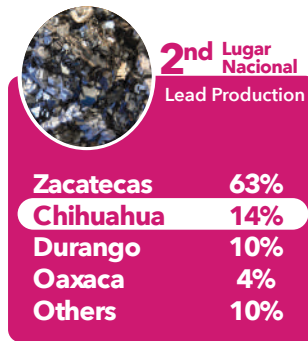
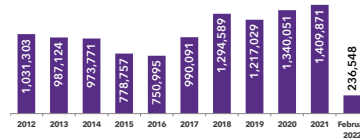

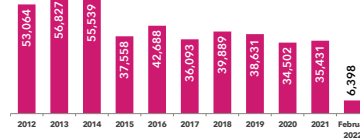
GOLD PRODUCTION
2012 TO FEBRUARY 2022 - KILOGRAMS



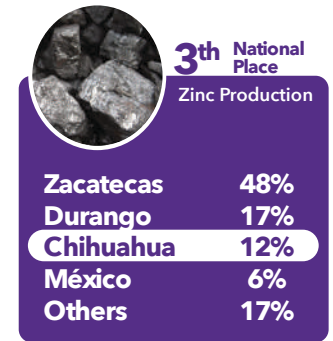
SILVER PRODUCTION

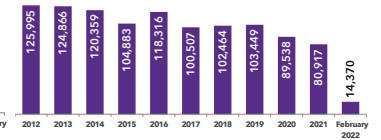

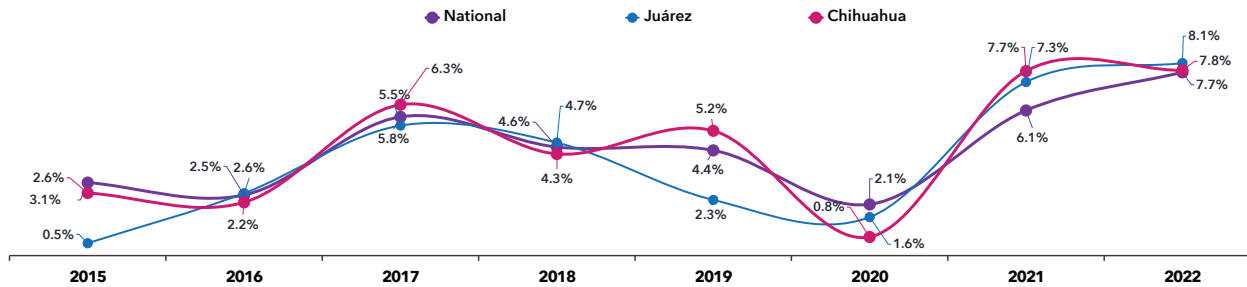

ANNUAL INFLATION 2015 - 2022 UP TO APRIL



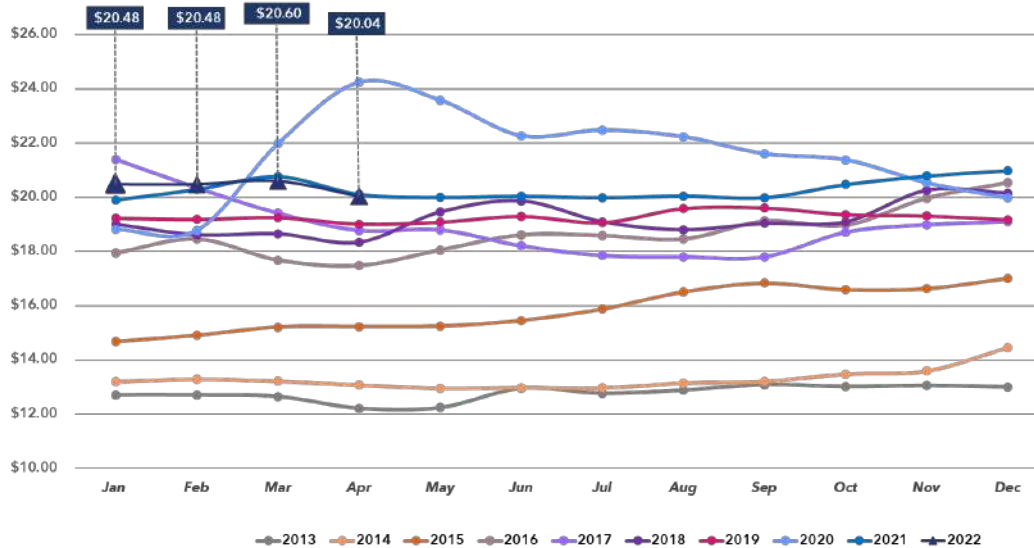

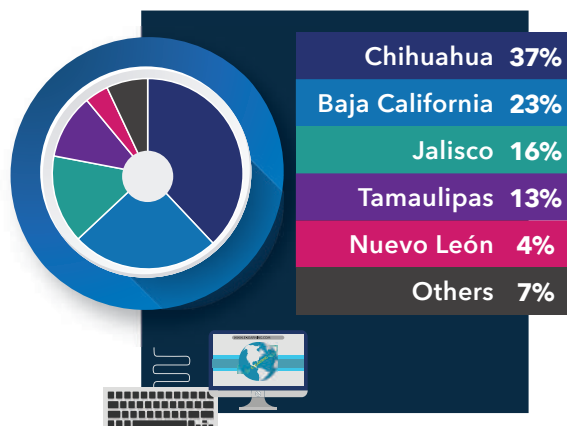

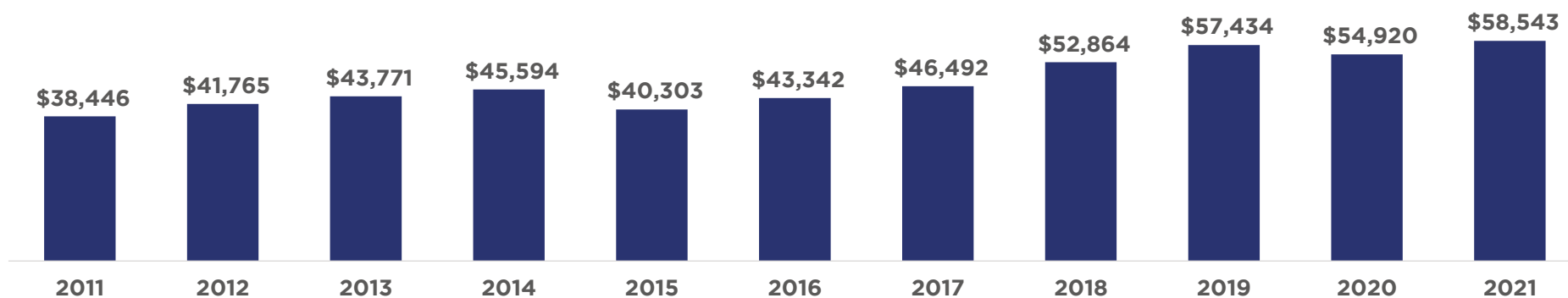

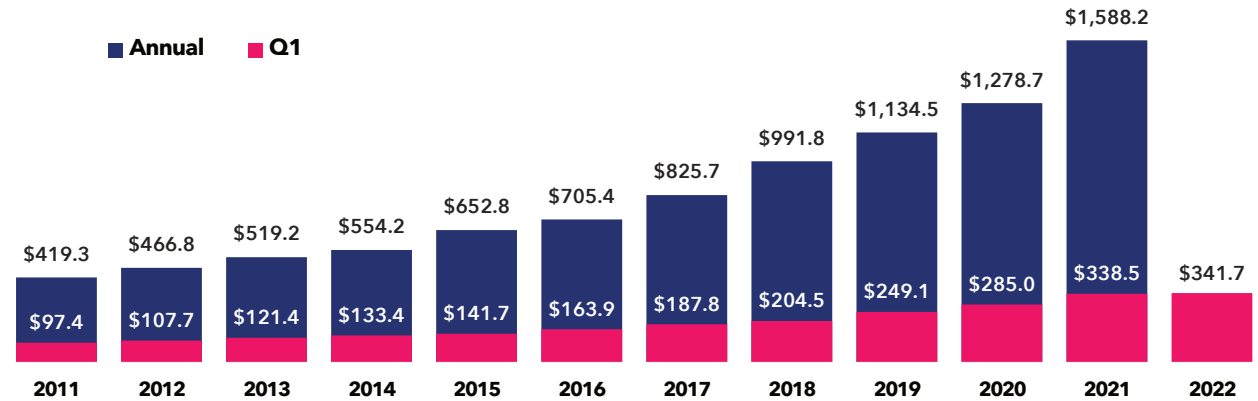

FAMILY REMITTANCE INCOME IN THE STATE OF CHIHUAHUA

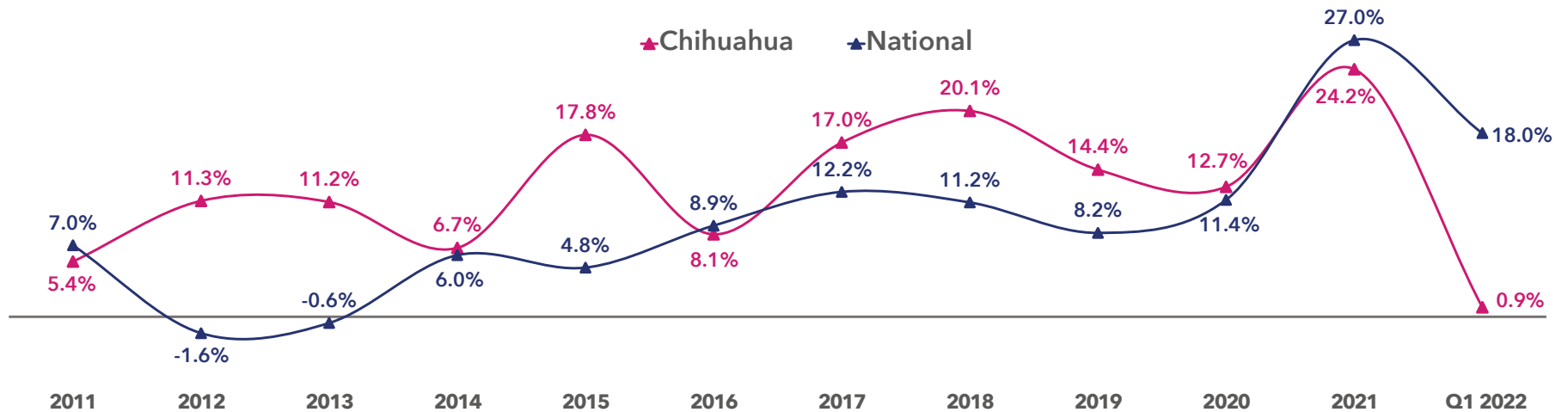

2011 TO FIRST QUARTER OF 2022



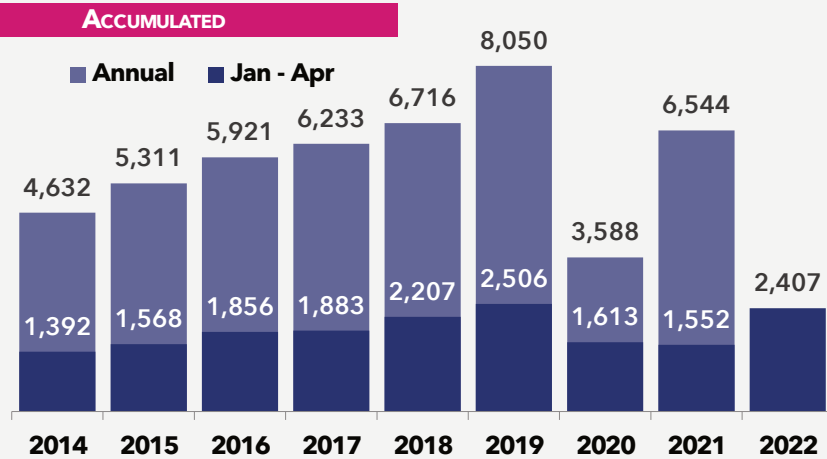

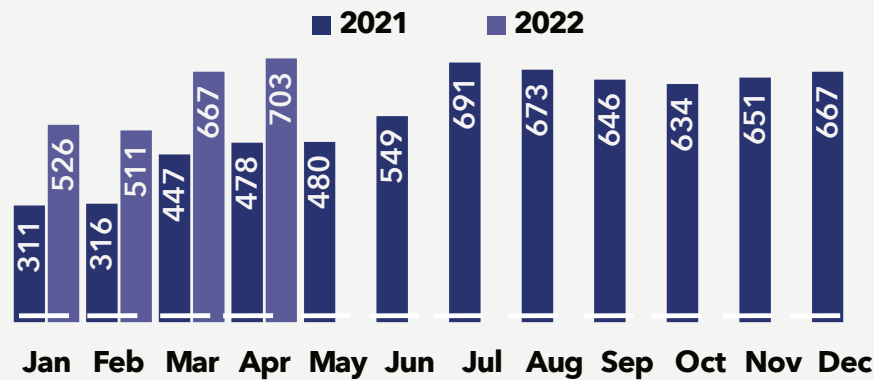


NUMBER OF VISITORS IN THE STATE

2014 - APRIL 2022. FIGURES IN THOUSANDS OF VISITORS

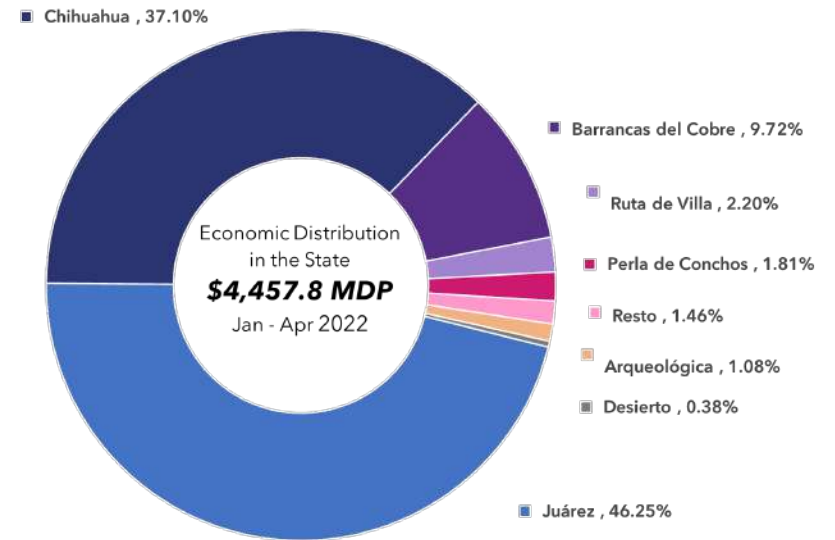

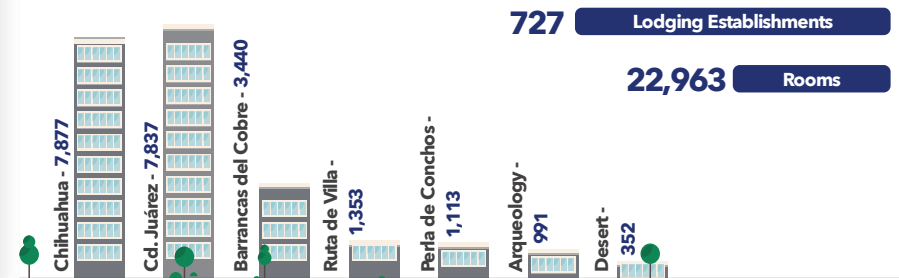
ECONOMIC DISTRIBUTION 2022

ROOMS BY TOURISTIC REGION

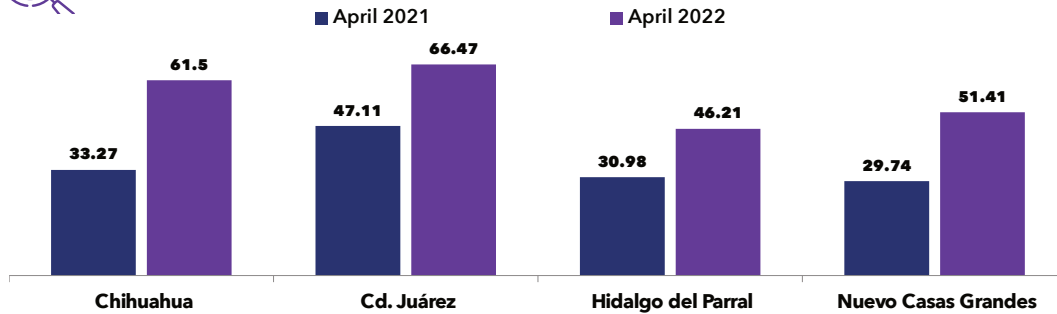

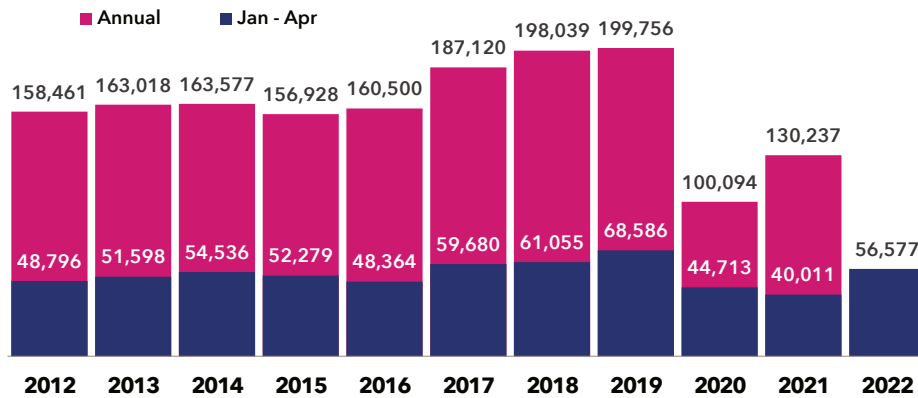

2012 TO APRIL 2022

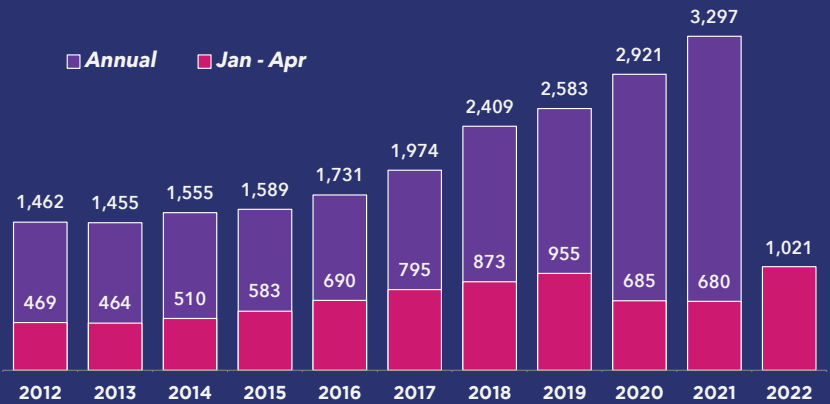

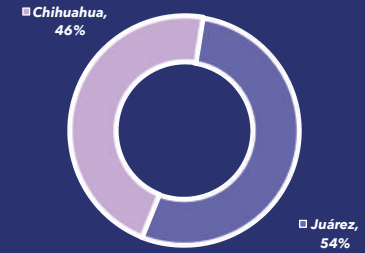


AIRPORT TRAFFIC
