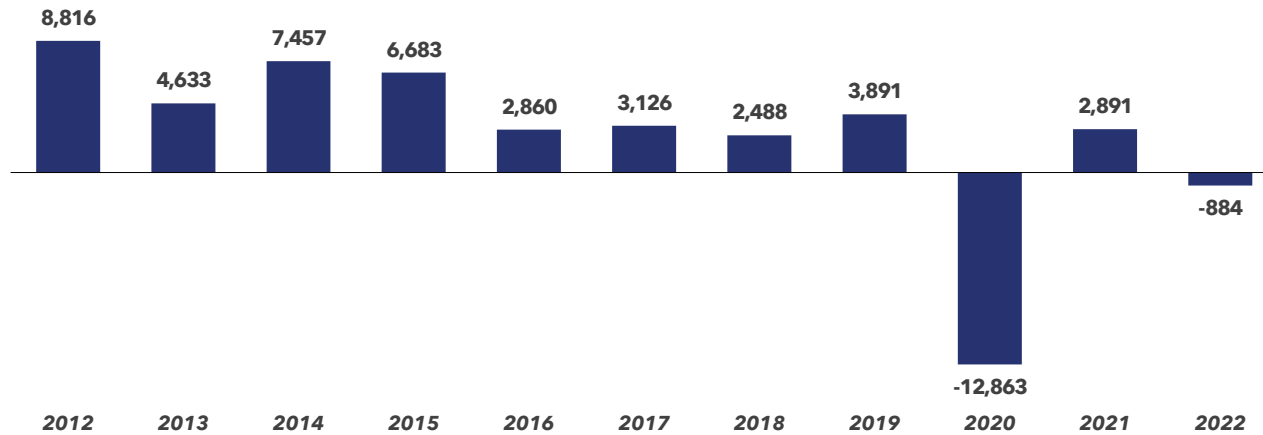

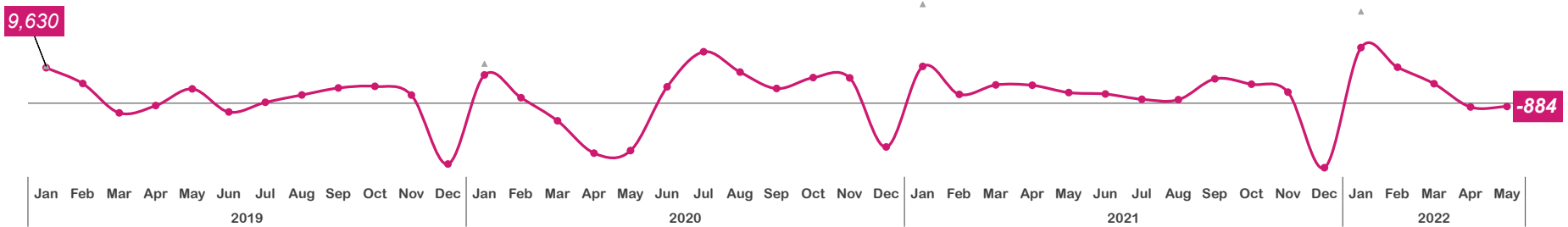

JANUARY 2019 - MAY 2022

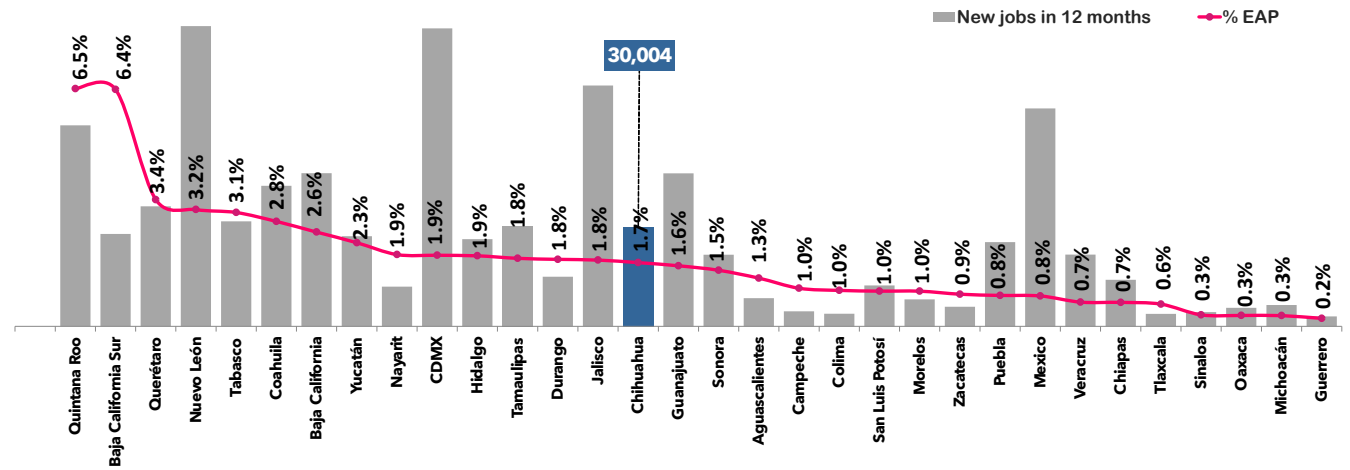




EMPLOYMENT GENERATED IN THE LAST 12 MONTHS

BY STATE PROPORTIONALLY TO THE EAP*

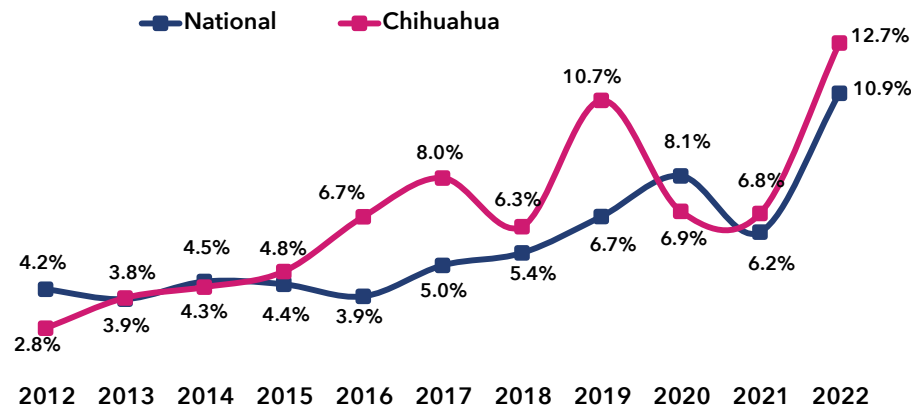
In the period from May 2021 to the same period of 2022, there is a growth of **30,004** jobs, being the state with the eleventh place in jobs created as a proportion of the EAP.



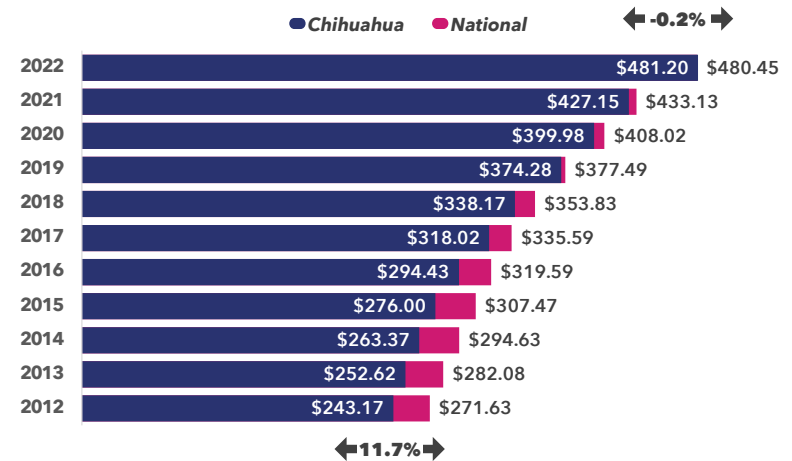
DAILY SALARY ASSOCIATED

ANNUAL GROWTH OF THE DAILY SALARY ASSOCIATED TO WORKERS ANNUAL RATE AS OF MAY

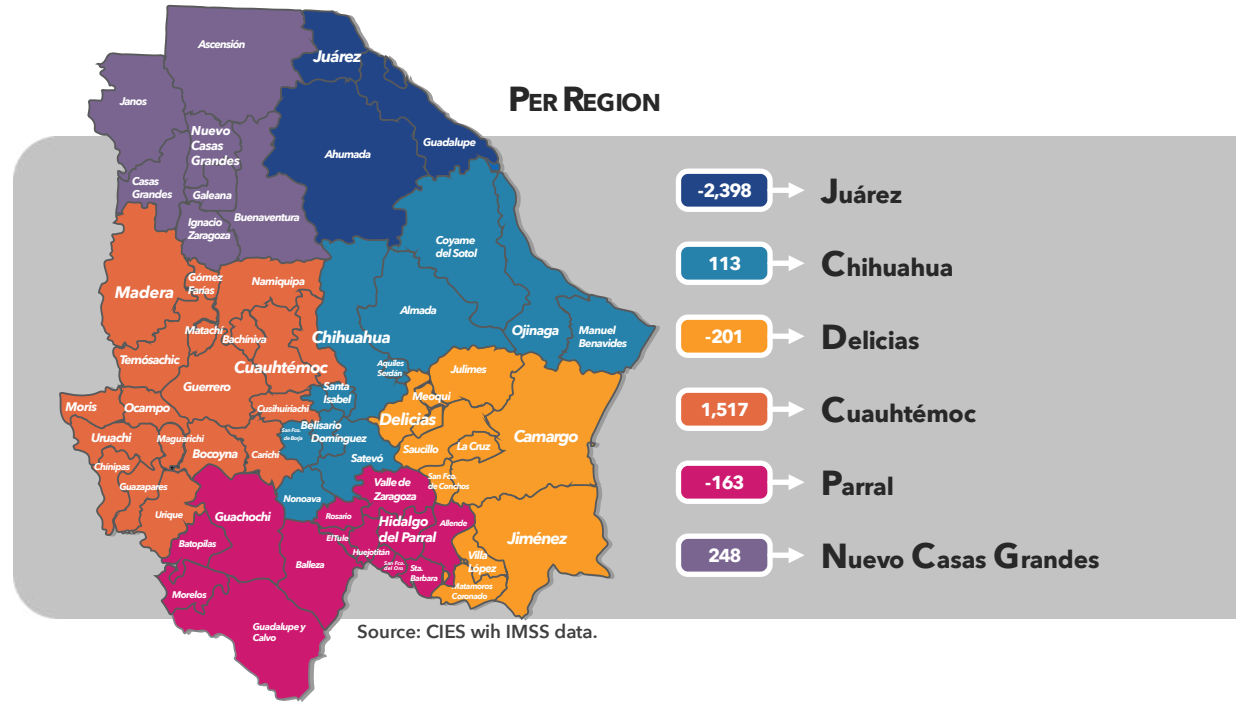
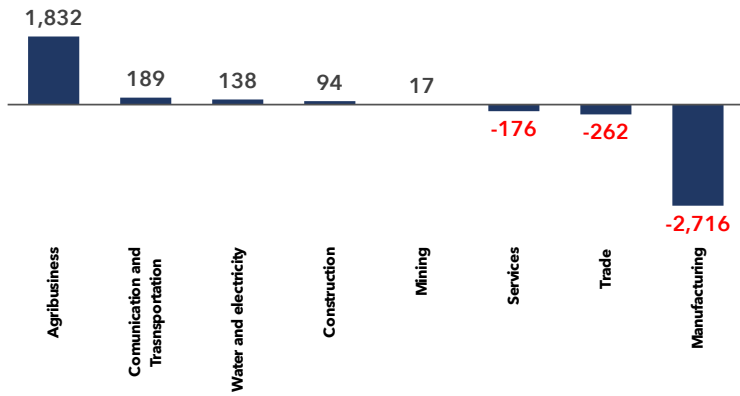

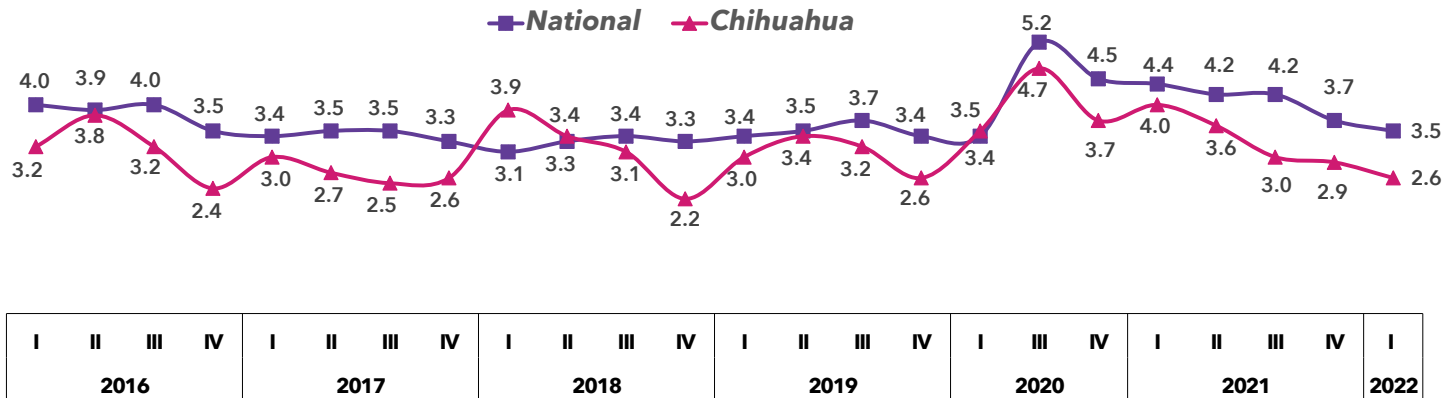

UNEMPLOYMENT RATE



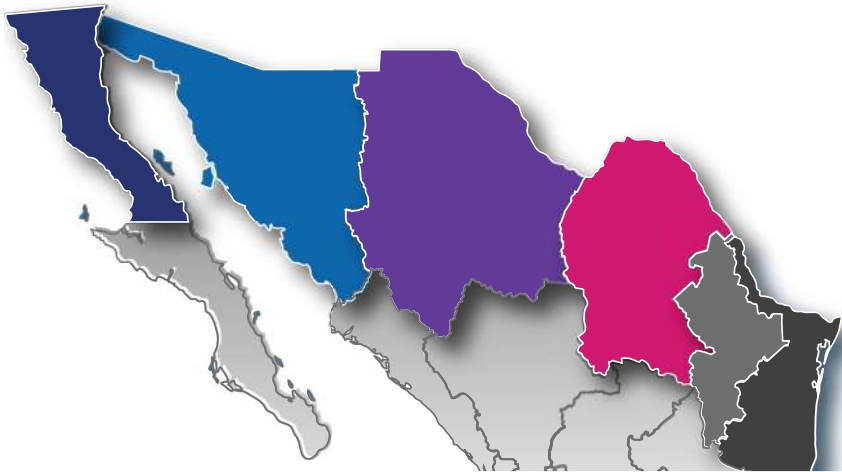

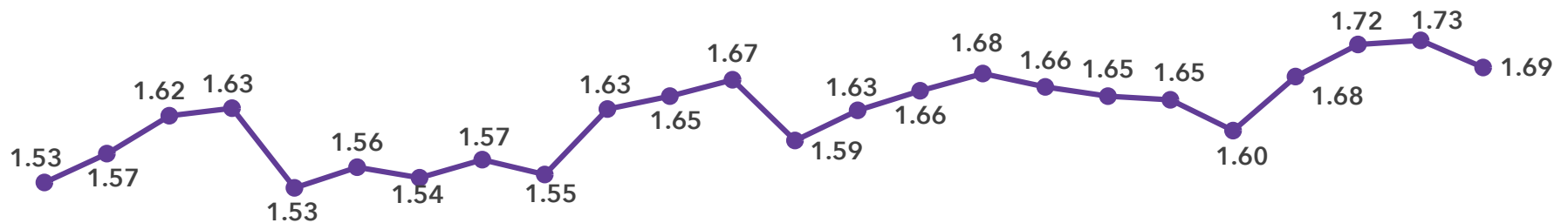

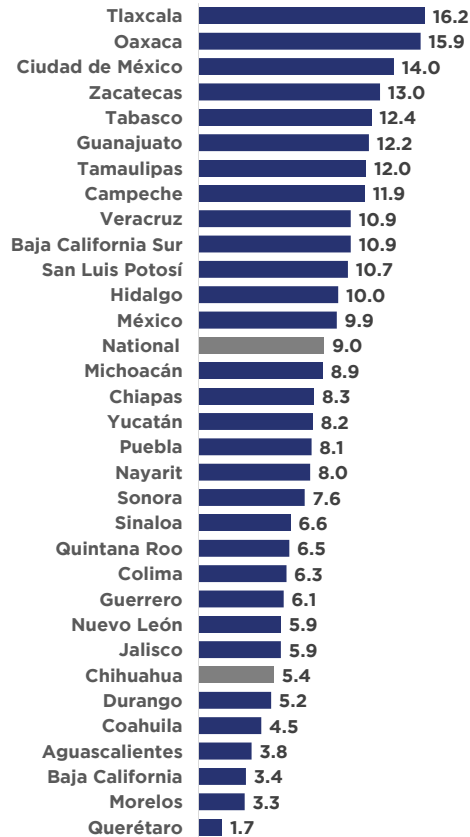

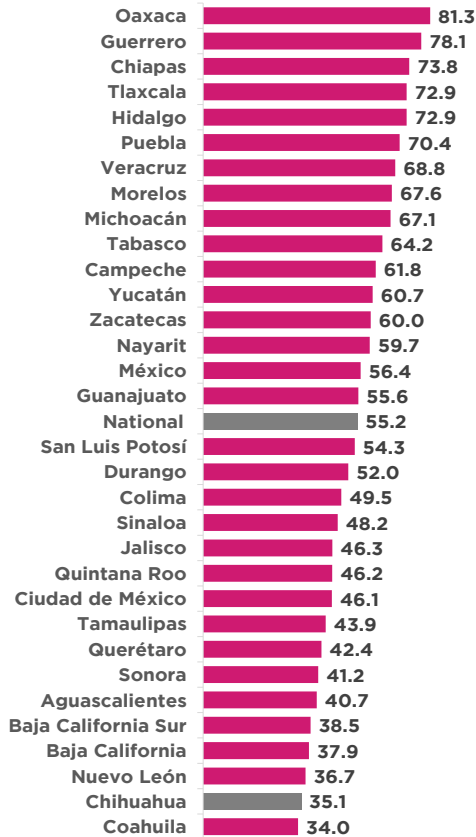

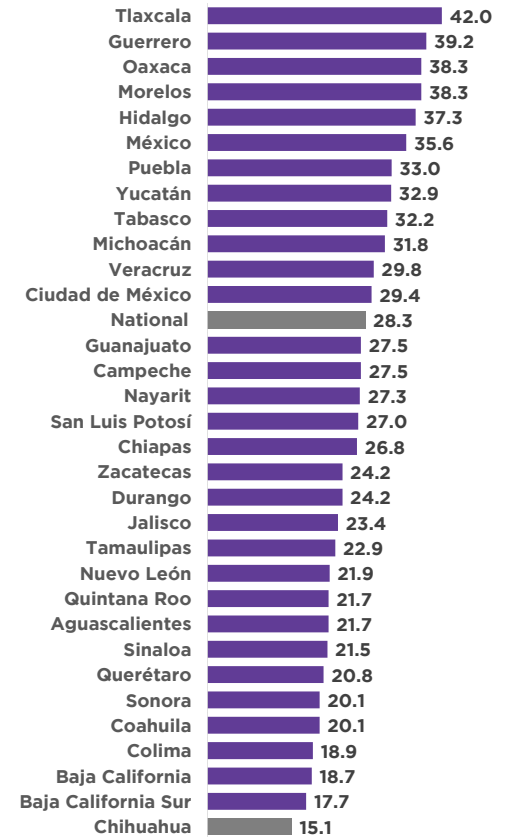
Informal Labor Rate*

The state has the lowest employment rate in the informal sector with a rate of 15.1%, 13.2 points lower than the national rate.

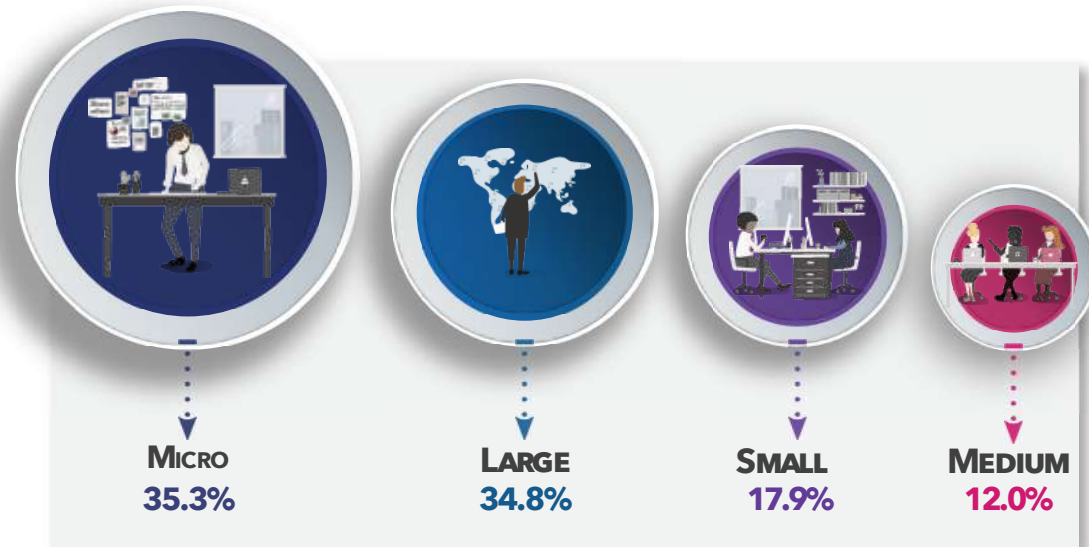

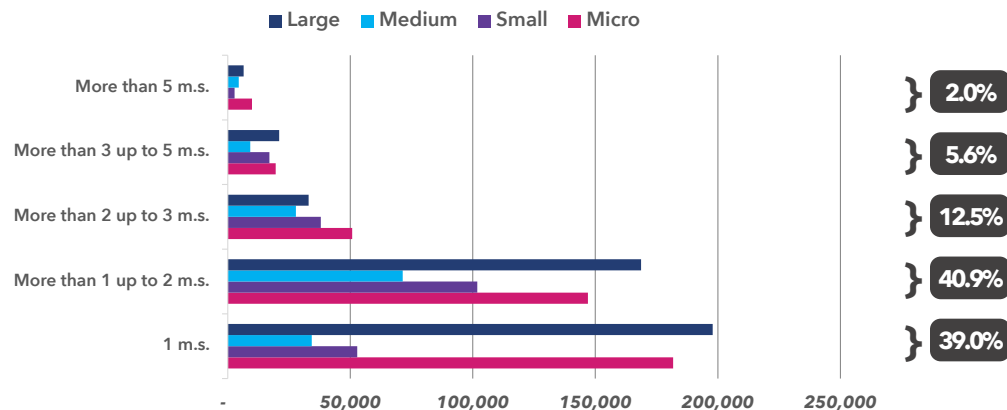

IN THE STATE OF CHIHUAHUA TO I QUARTER 2022



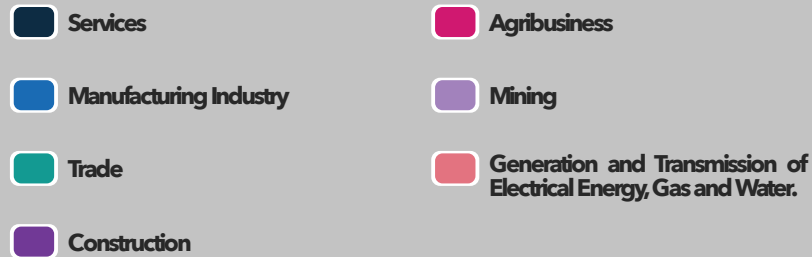

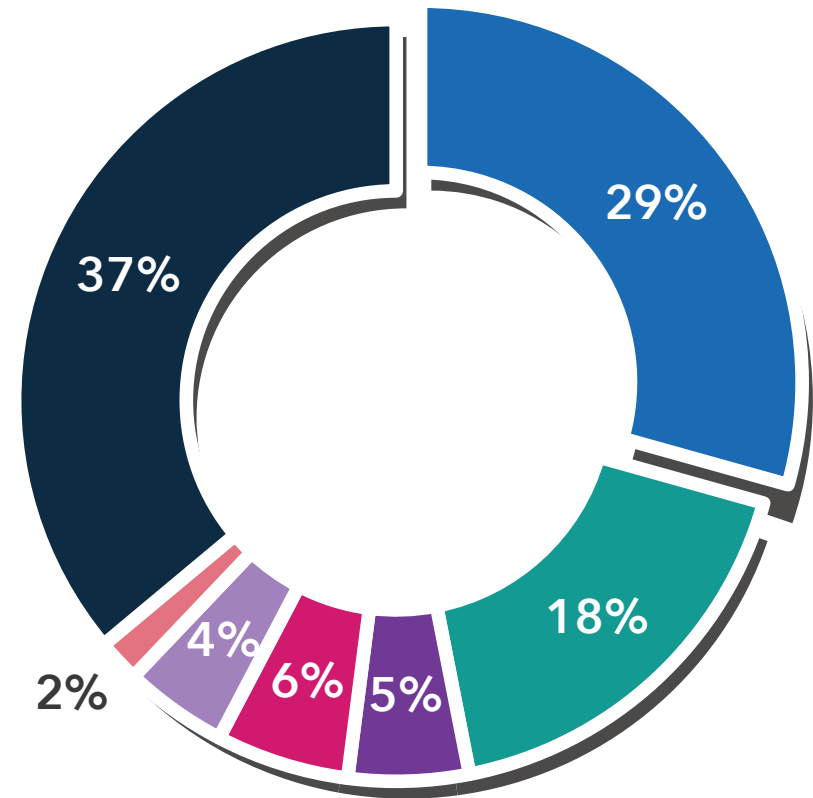

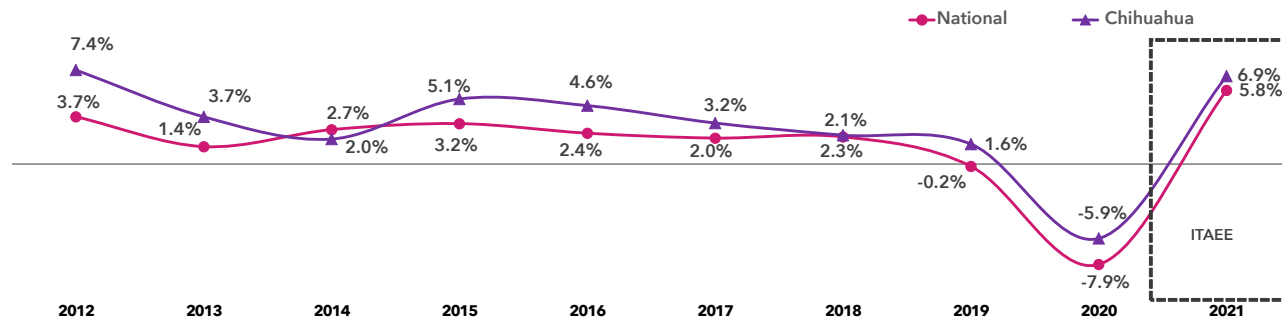

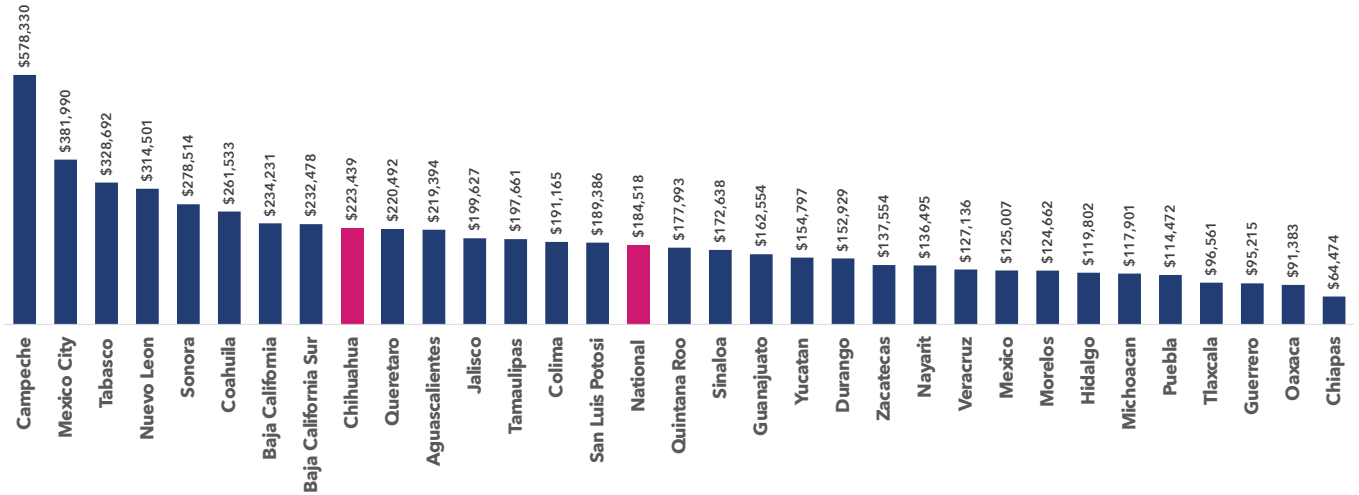

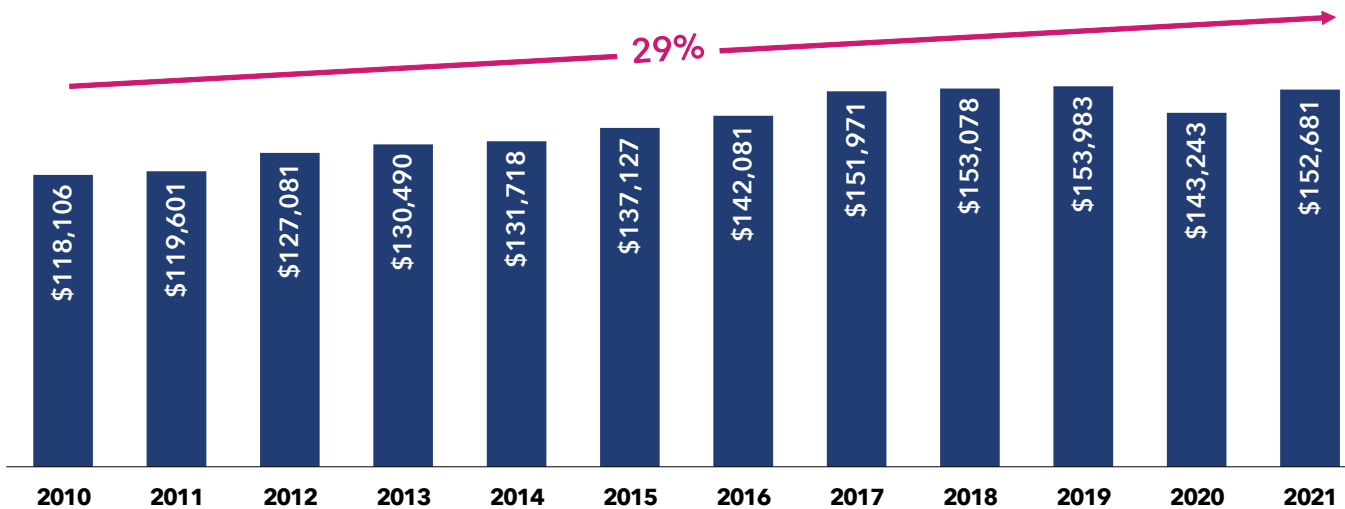

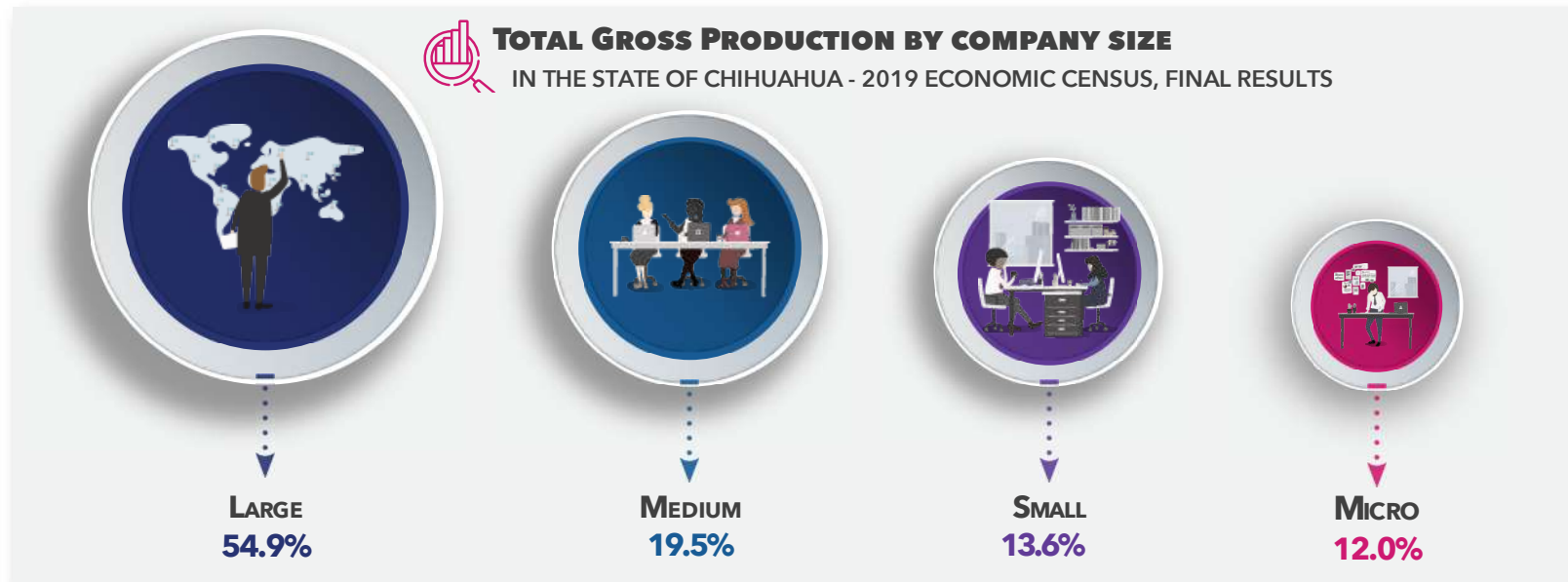

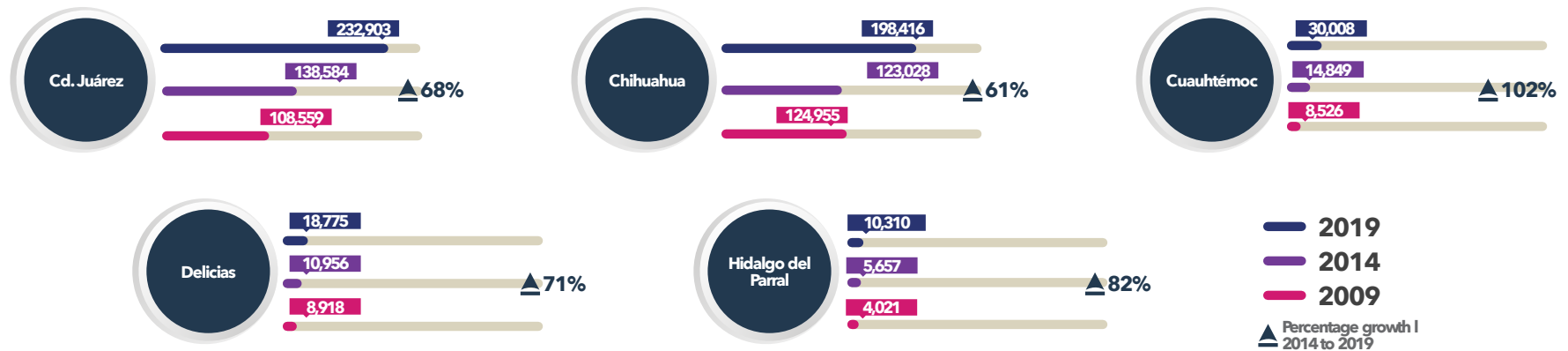

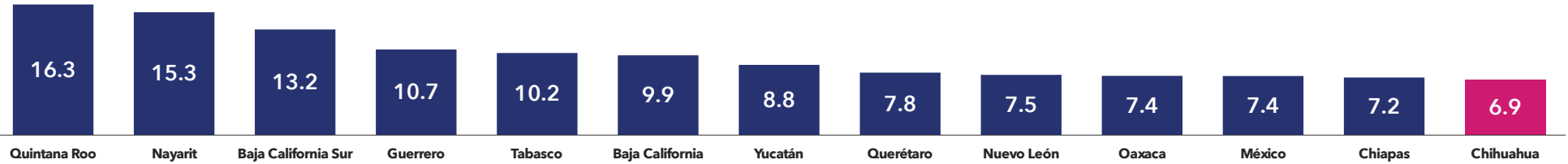

QUARTERLY INDICATOR OF STATE ECONOMIC ACTIVITY



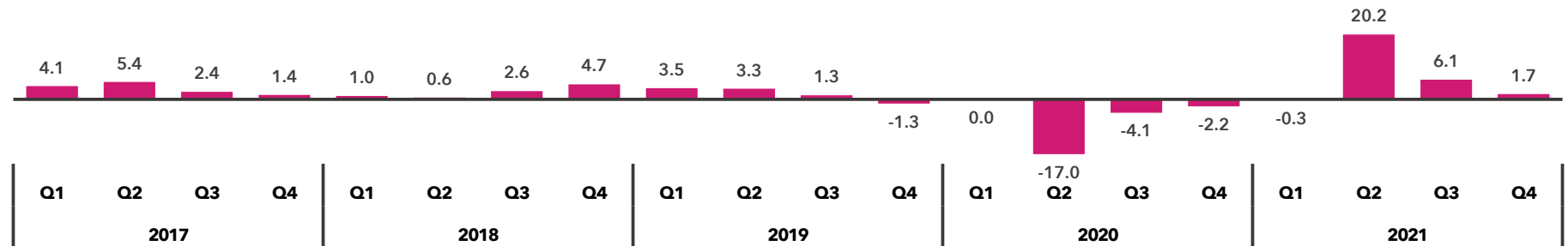
AVERAGE ECONOMIC GROWTH BY STATE

ANNUAL PERCENTAGE CHANGE - AVERAGE AS OF Q4 2021 (SEASONALLY ADJUSTED SERIES)



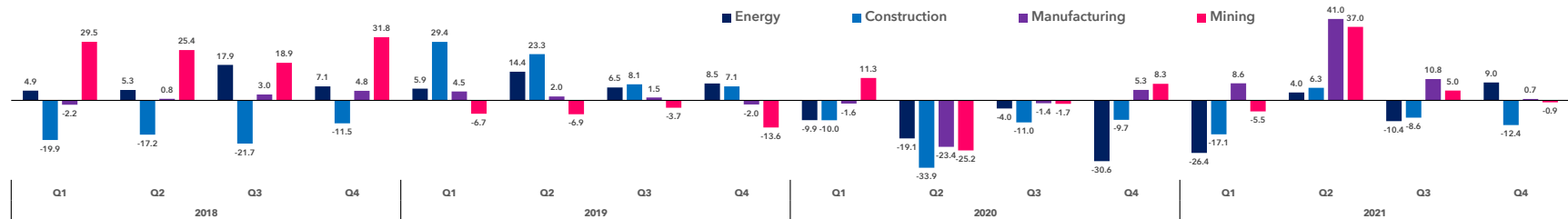
ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN CHIHUAHUA

ANNUAL VARIATION OF THE ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN INDUSTRIAL SECTORS

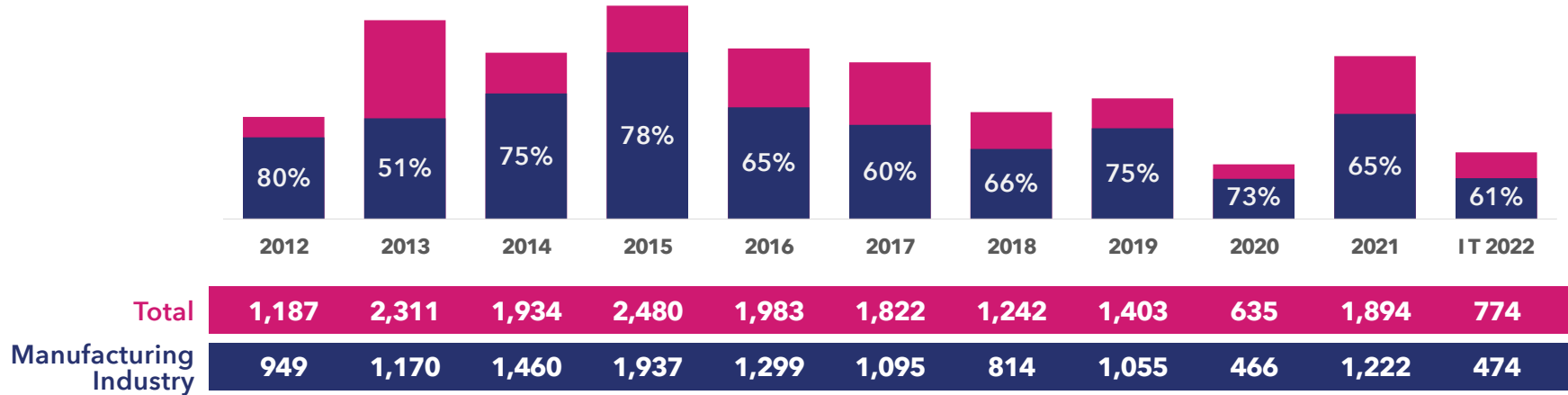

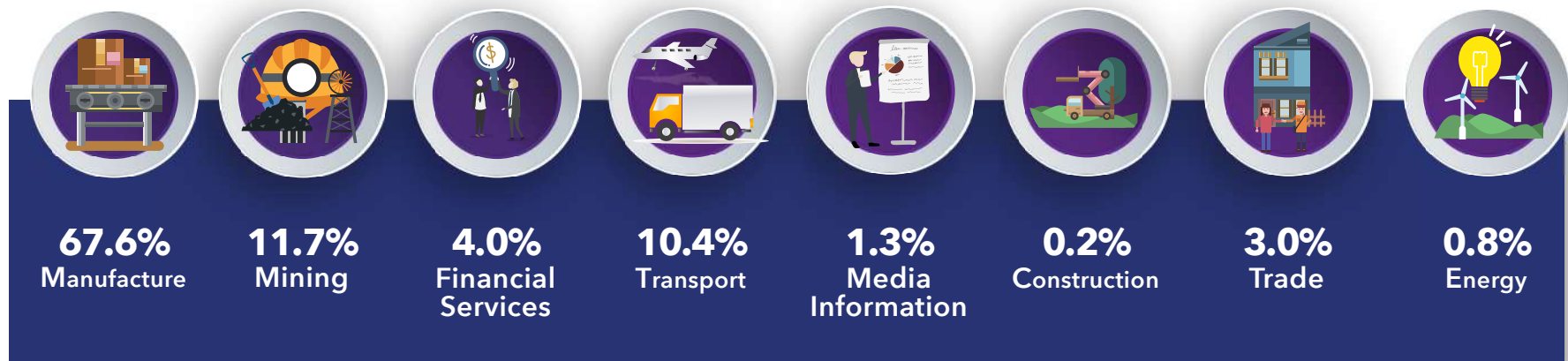

FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT IN THE STATE BY COUNTRY

Q1 2022

Based on the Federal Secretary of Economy data, Mexico registered 19.43 billion dollars in Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) as of the first quarter of 2022.

During the same period, Chihuahua received 774.4 million dollars, contributing 4.0% of the national total, and the state is ranked 7th as the recipient of FDI after Cd. de Mexico, Jalisco, Nuevo Leon, Tamaulipas, Baja California and México State.

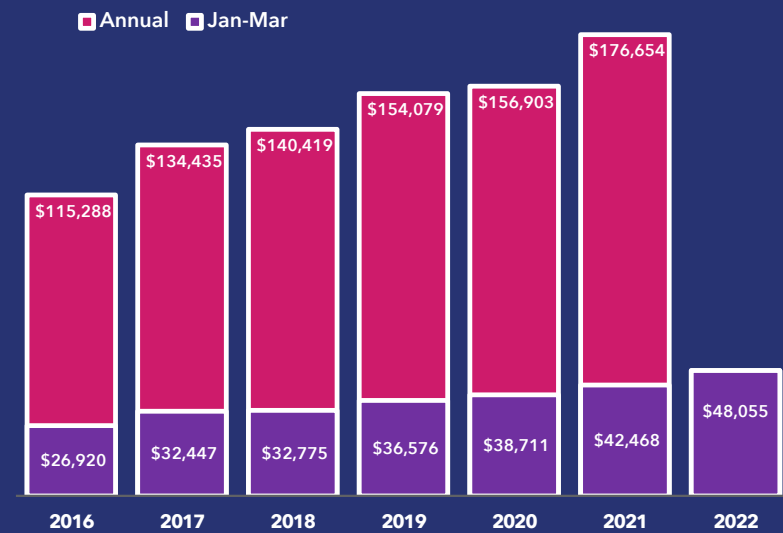

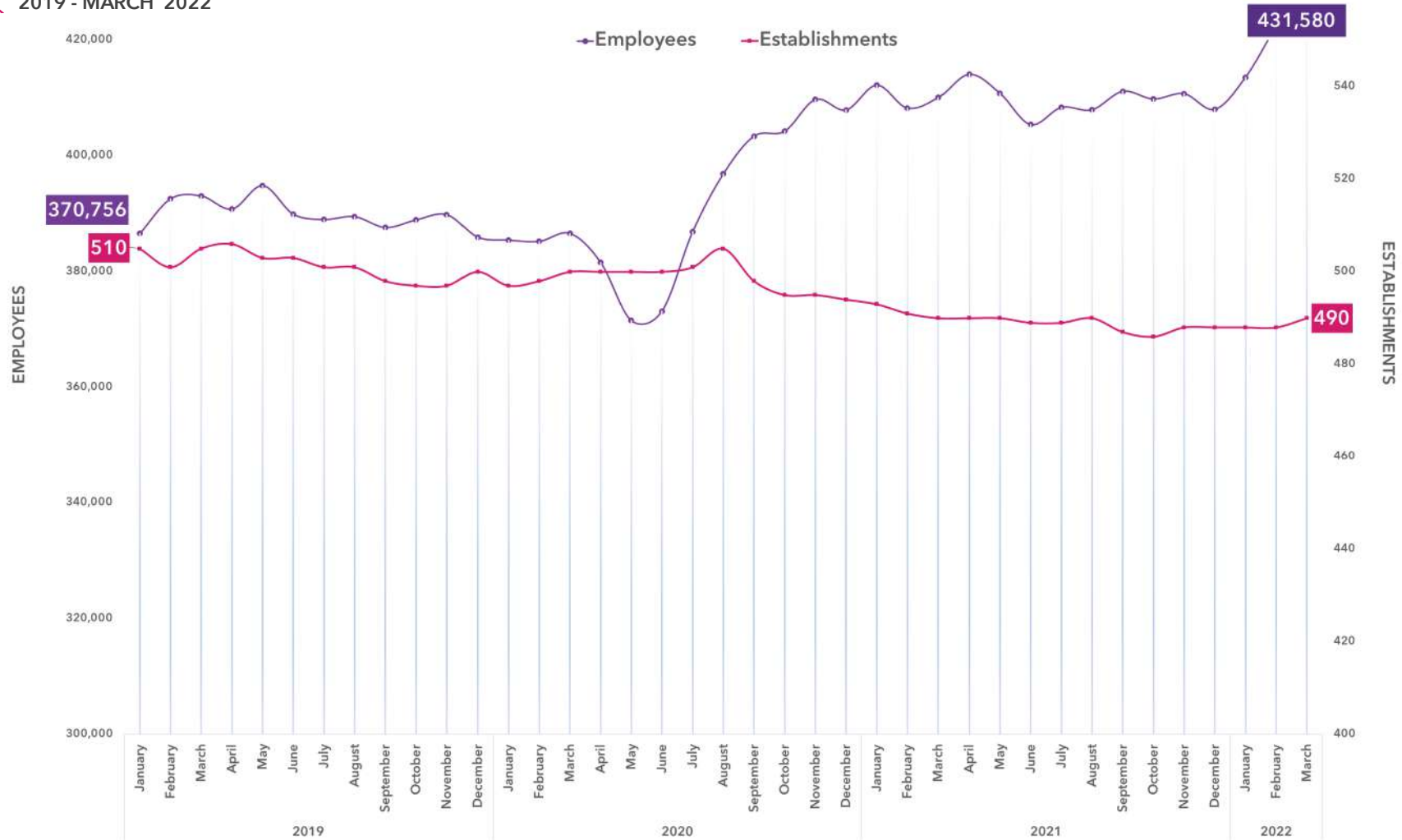

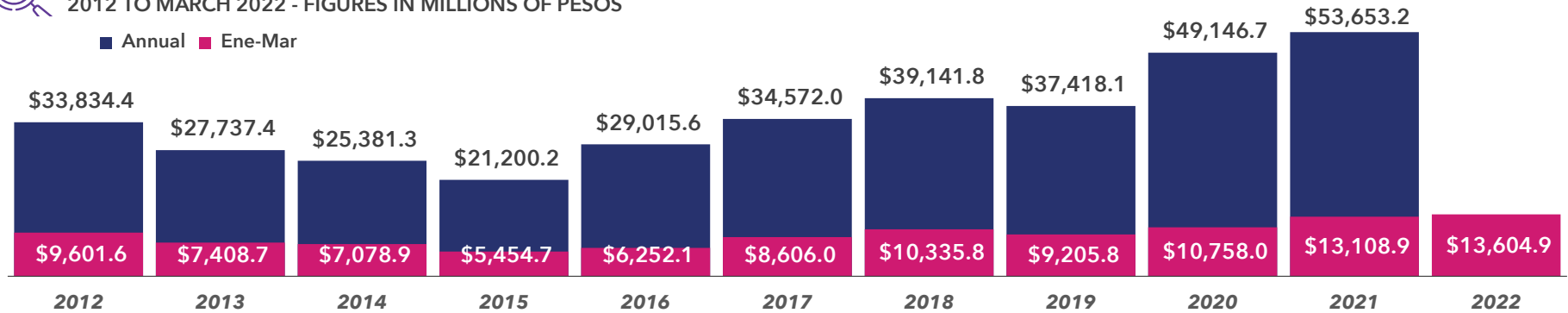

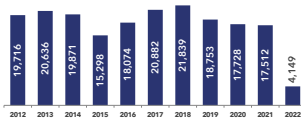

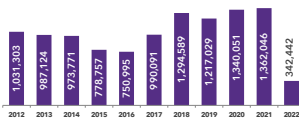

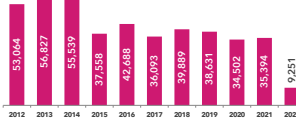

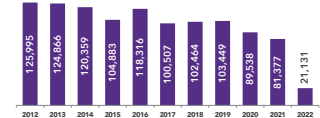

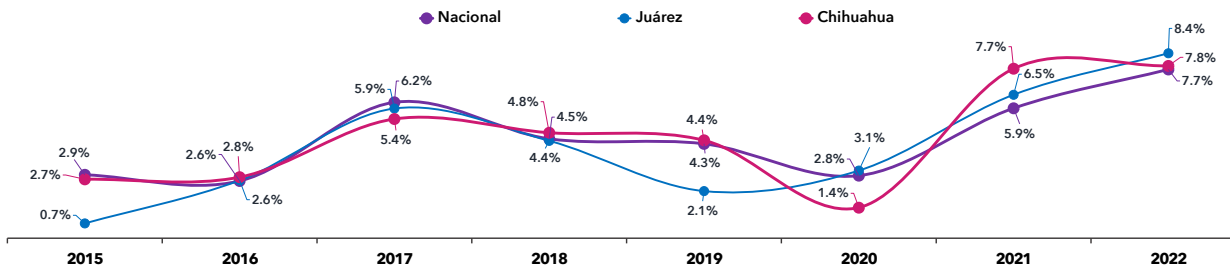

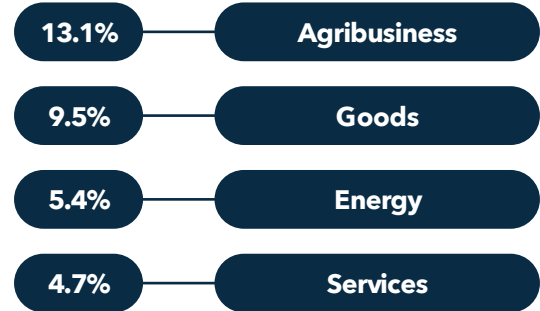

ANNUAL INFLATION 2015 - 2022 UP TO MAY



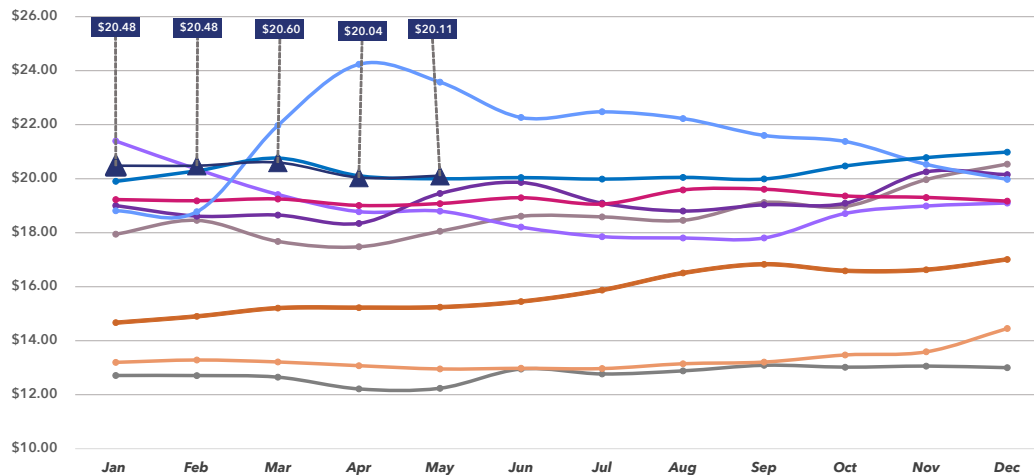

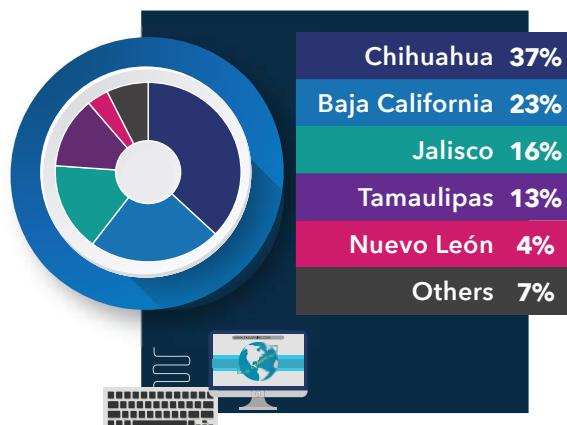
EXPORTS BY MAIN SUBSECTORS

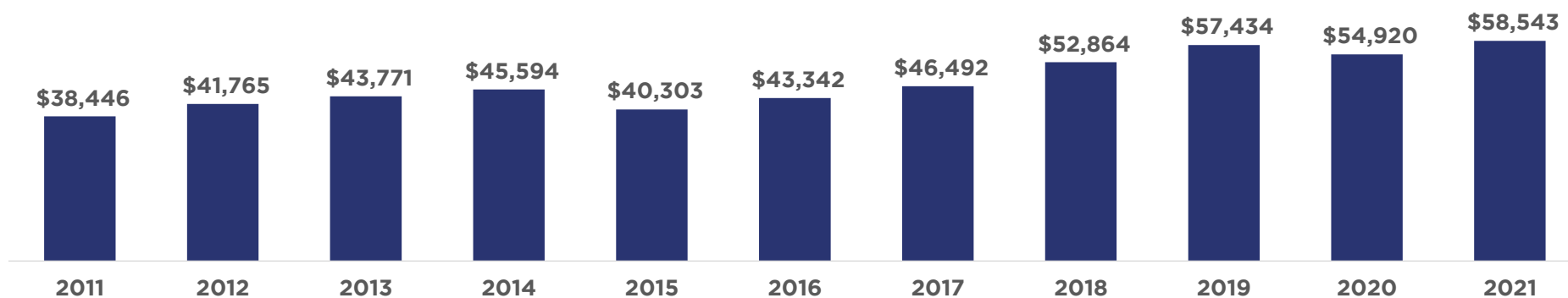

2012 TO FOURTH QUARTER OF 2021 - FIGURES IN MILLIONS OF DOLLARS



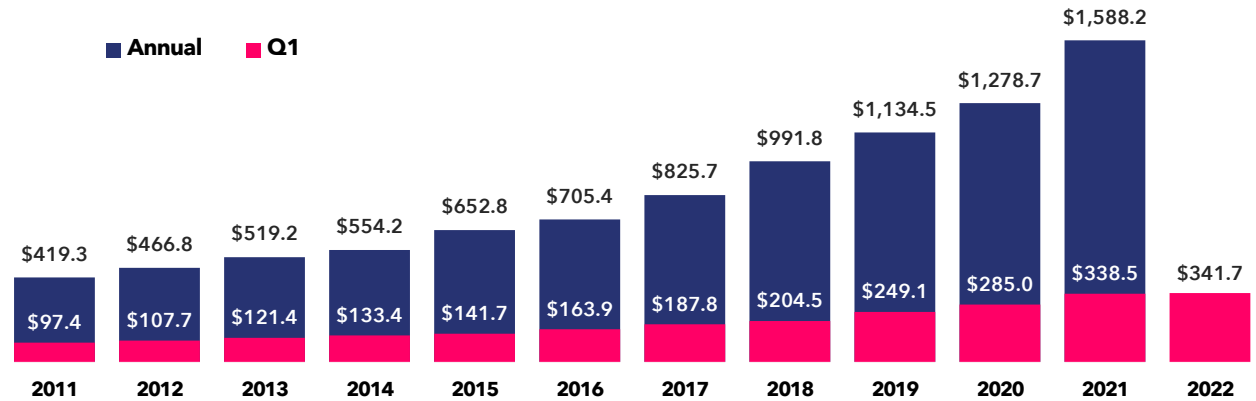

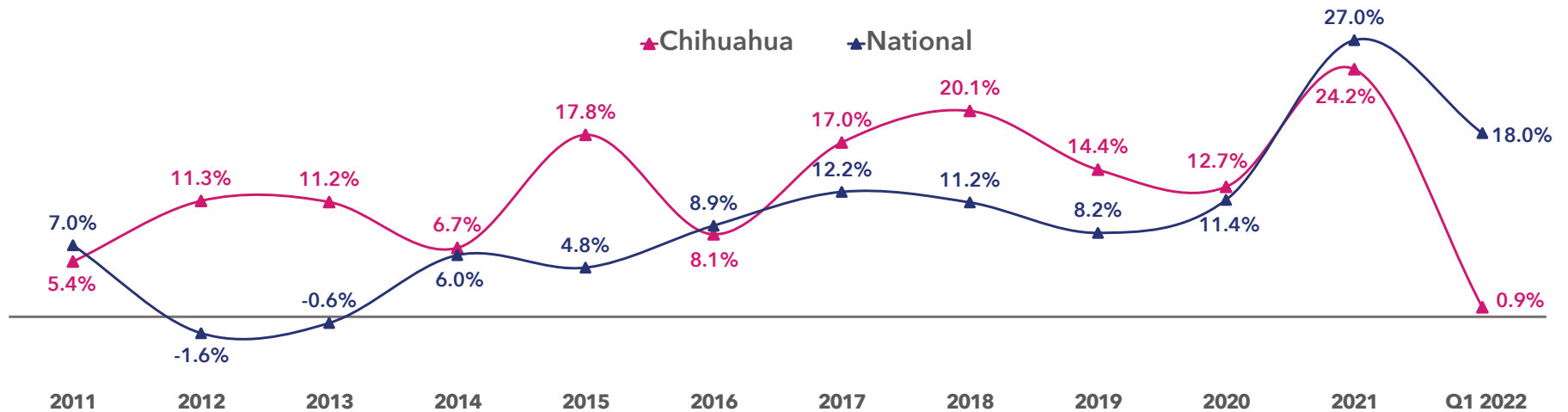

2011 TO FIRST QUARTER OF 2022

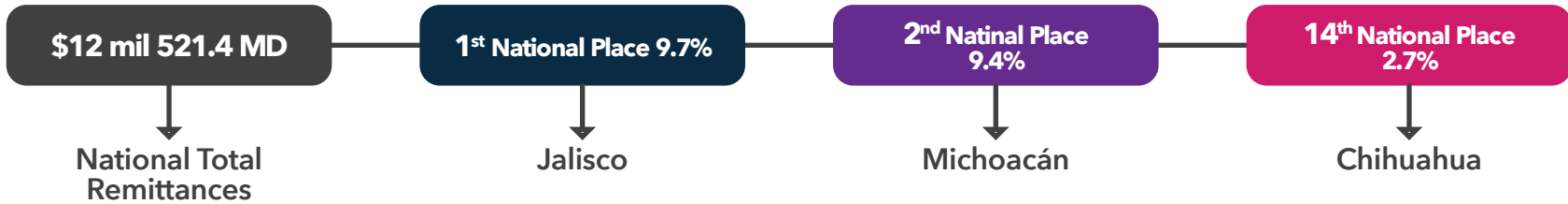

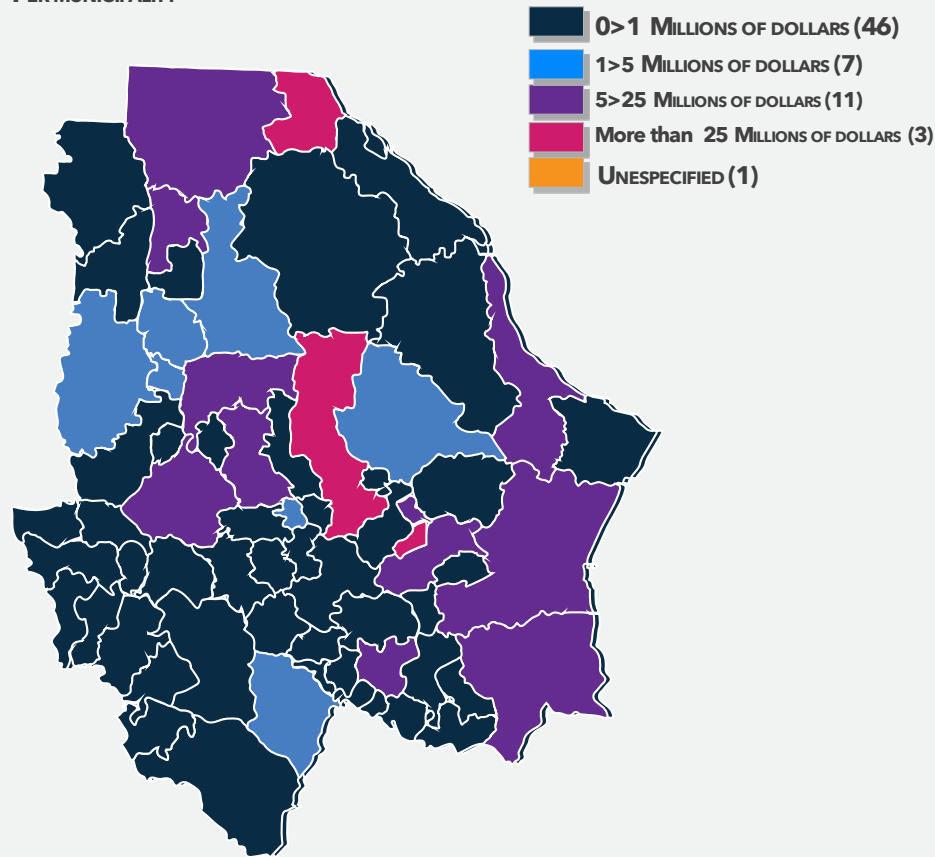


FAMILY REMITTANCE INCOME

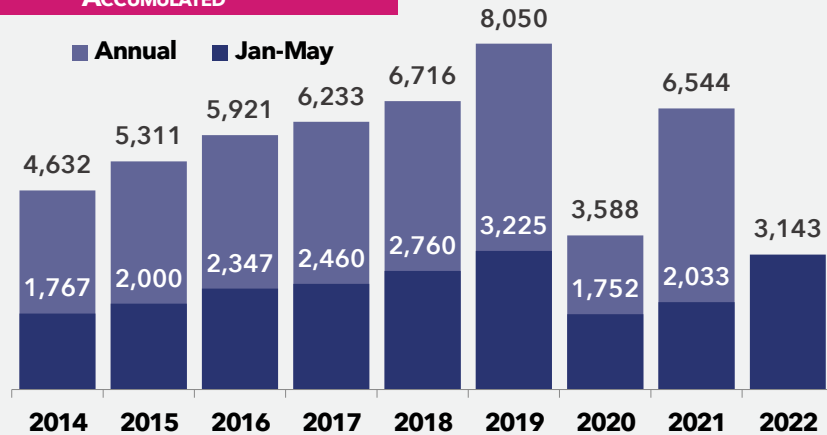

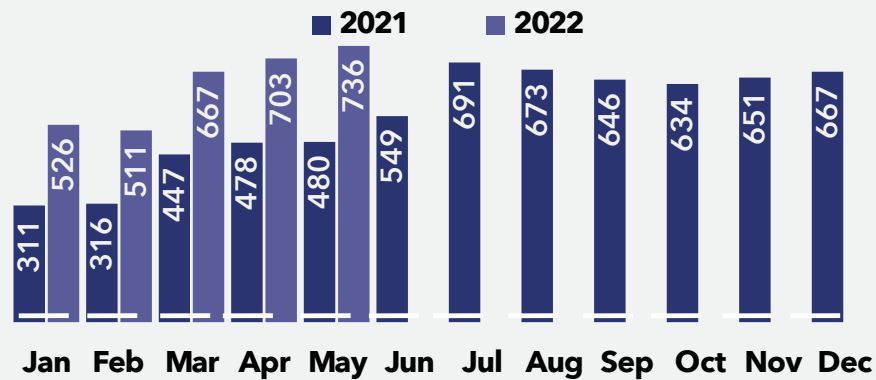
NUMBER OF VISITORS IN THE STATE

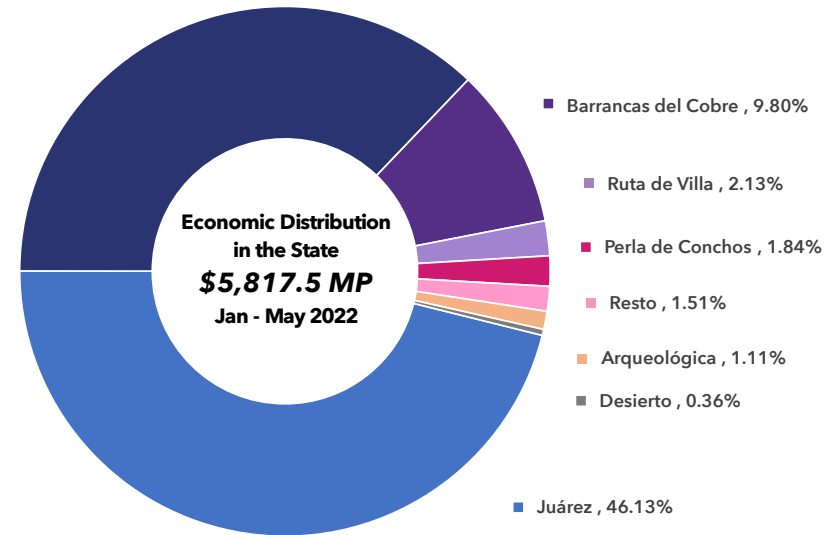

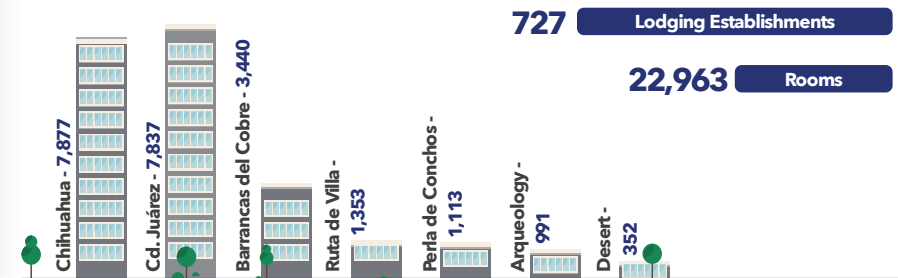
BY TOURISTIC REGION - FIGURES IN MILLIONS OF PESOS

ROOMS BY TOURISTIC REGION

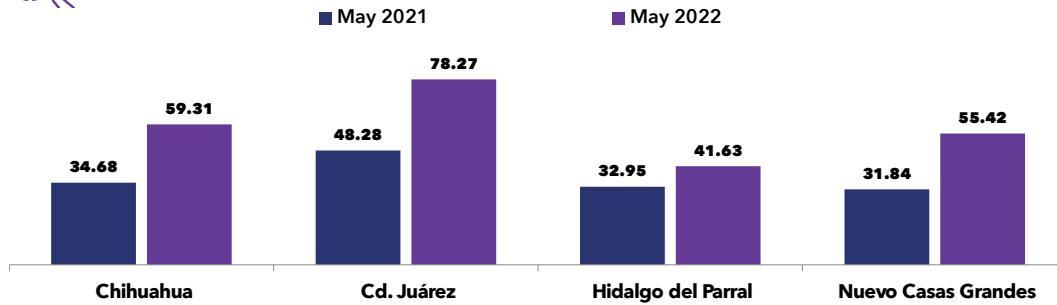

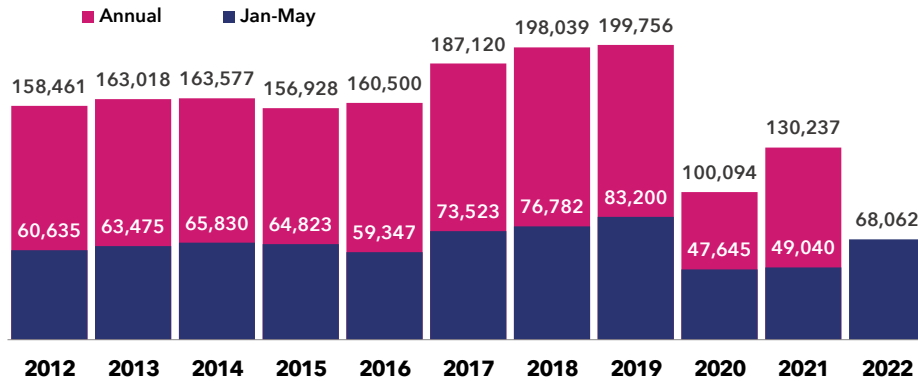

2012 TO MAY 2022

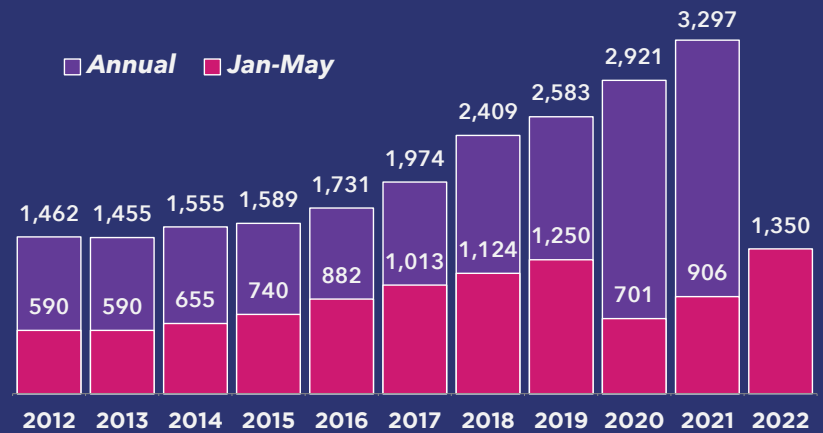

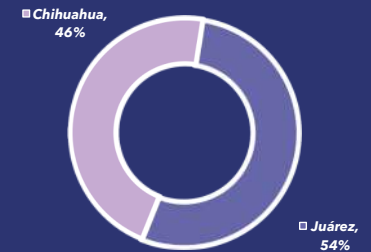


AIRPORT TRAFFIC
