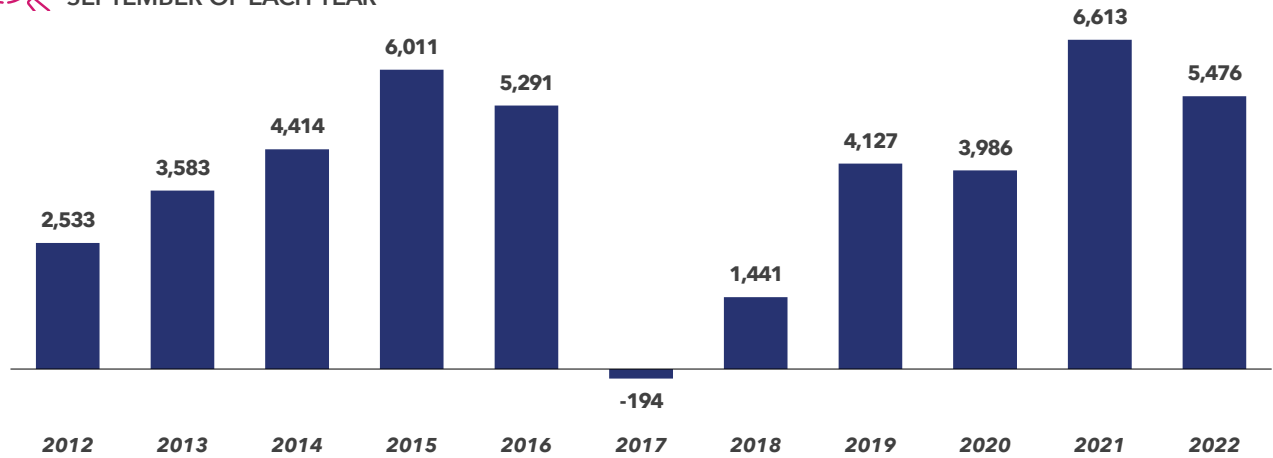

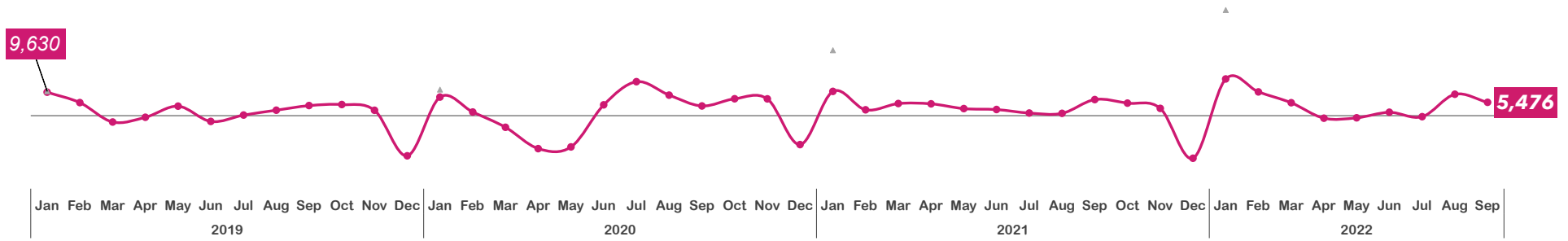

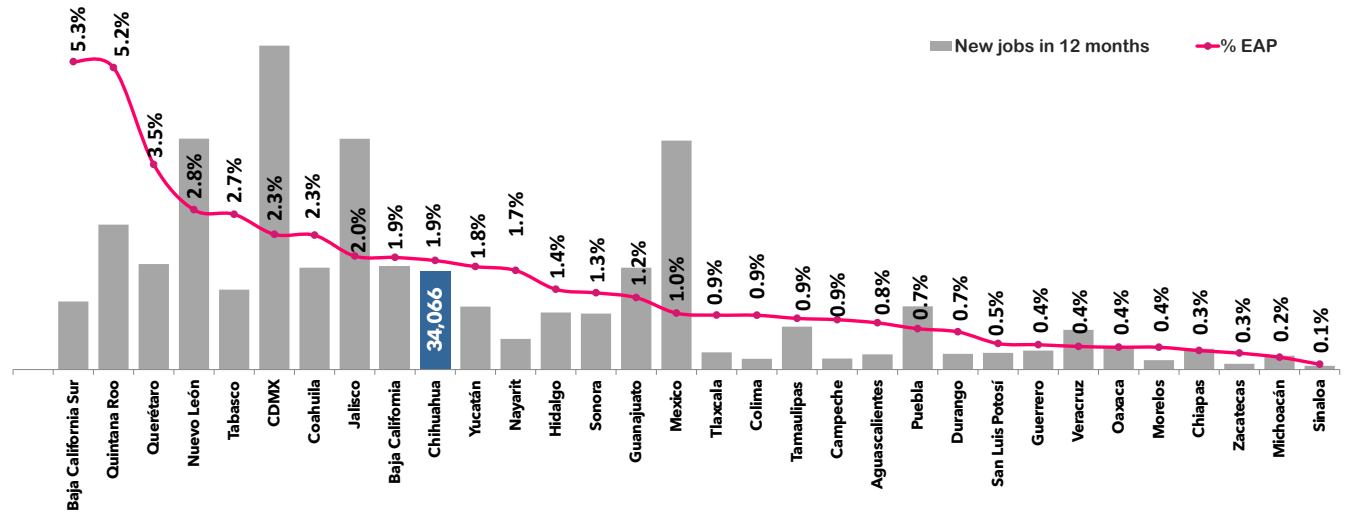

BY STATE PROPORTIONALLY TO THE EAP\*

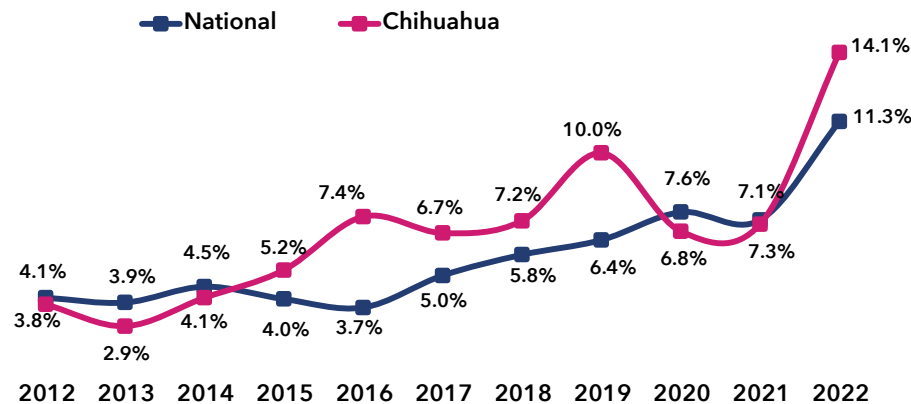
In the period from September 2021 to the same period of 2022, there is a growth of **34,066** jobs, being the state with the ninth place in jobs created as a proportion of the EAP.



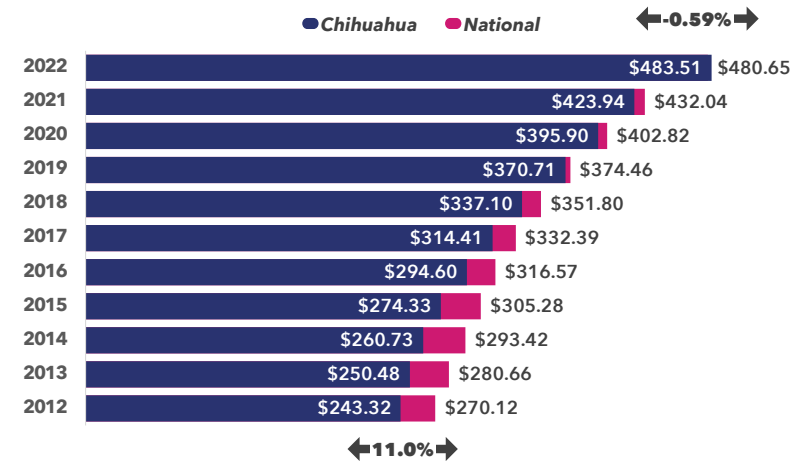
## DAILY SALARY ASSOCIATED

### COMPARISON WITH THE NATIONAL AVERAGE TO SEPTEMBER OF EACH YEAR (PESOS PER DAY)

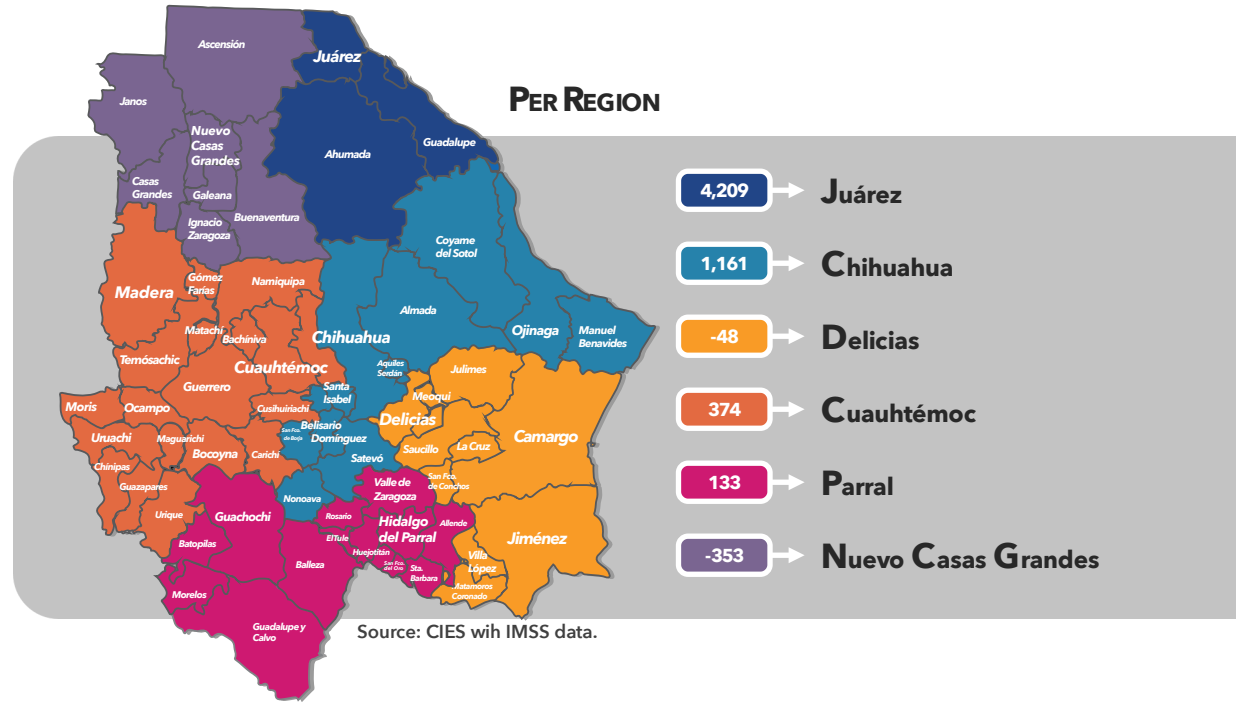
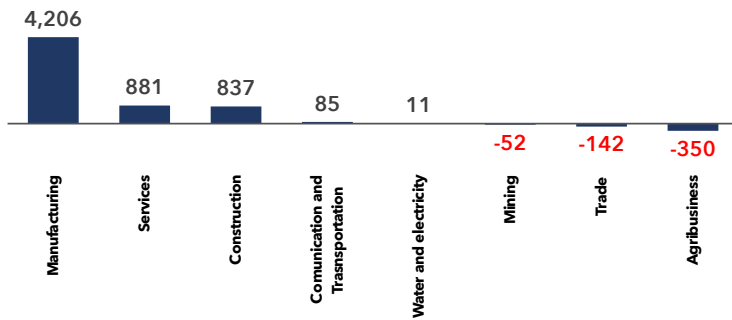

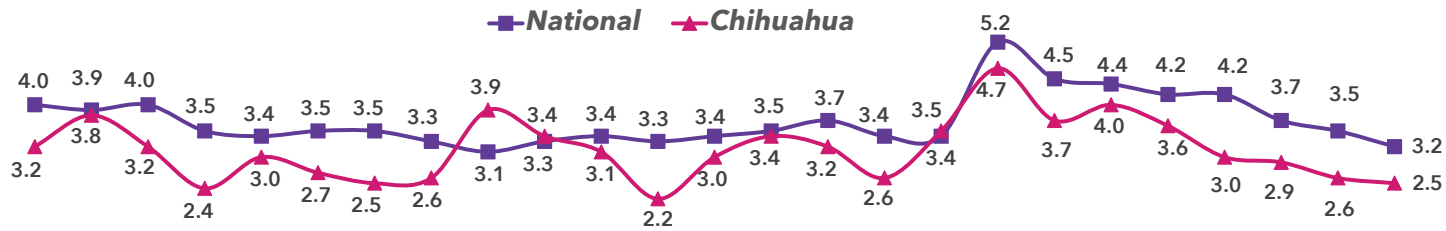

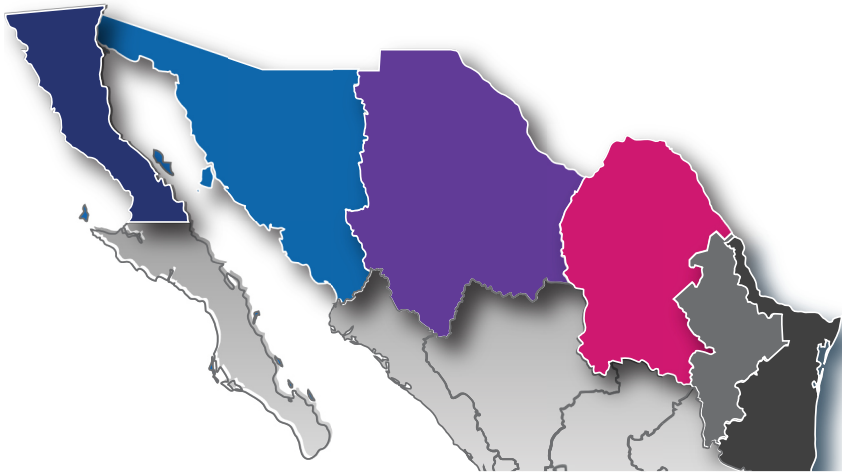

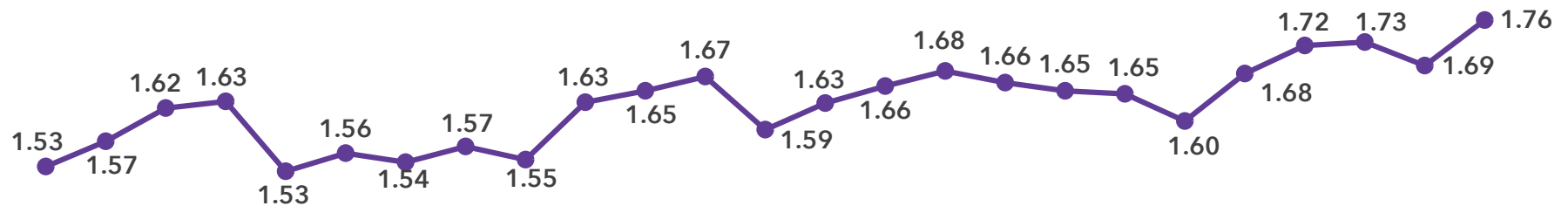

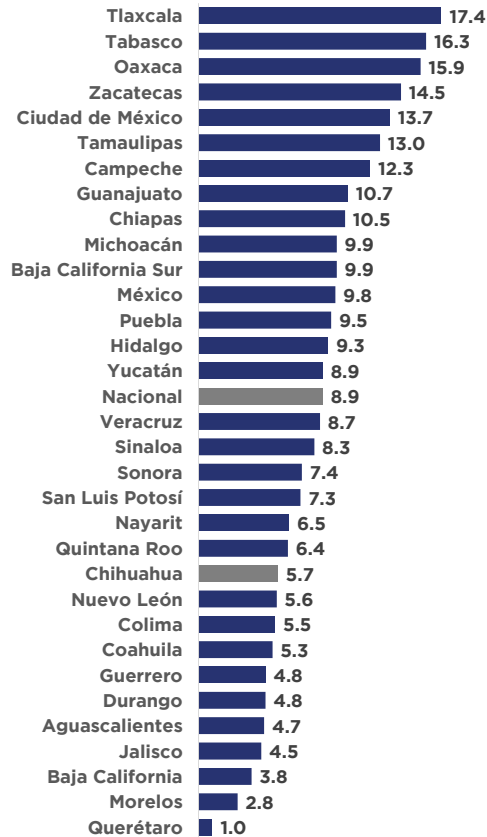

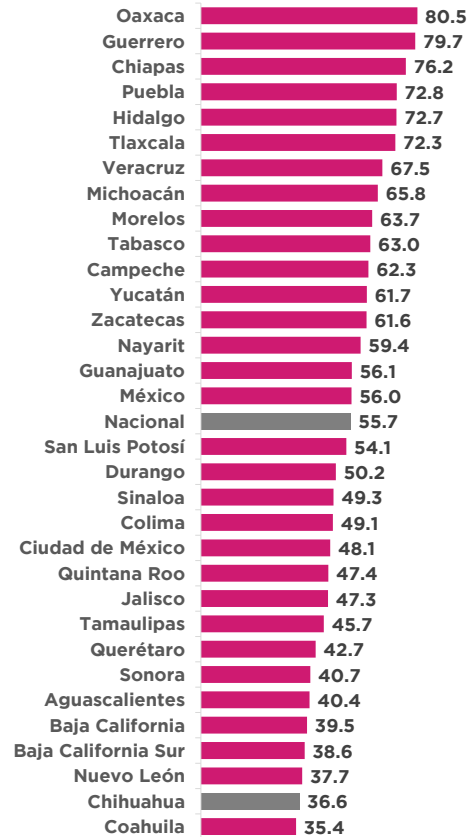

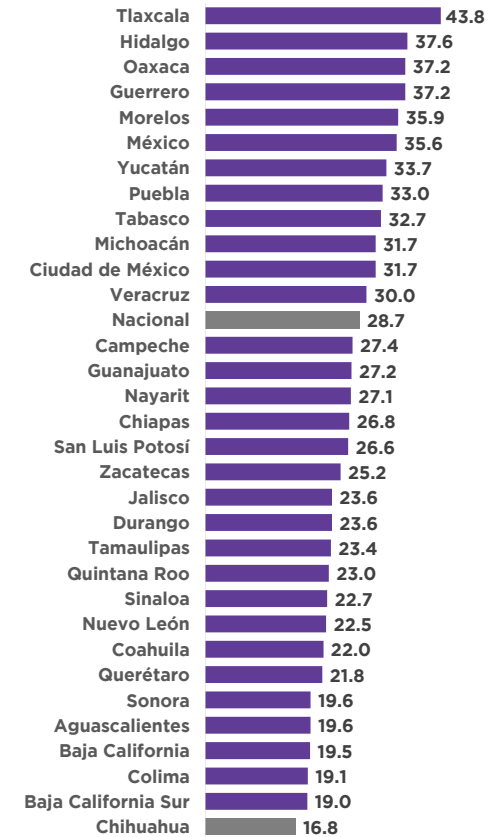
### Informal Labor Rate\*

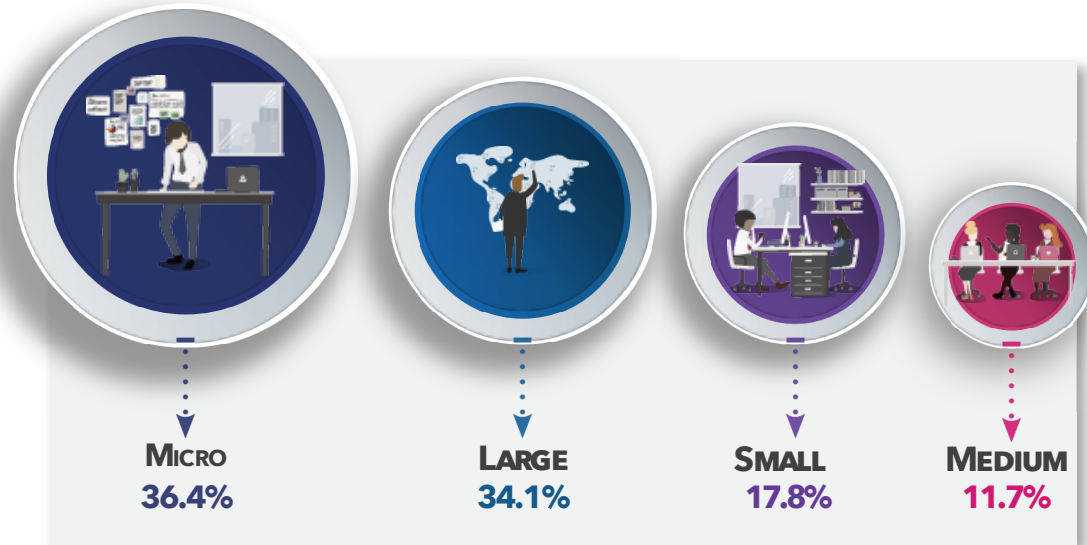

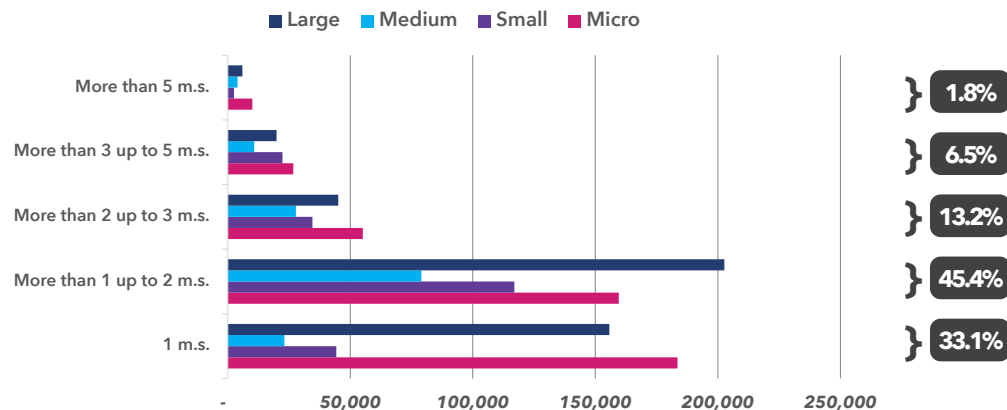

IN THE STATE OF CHIHUAHUA TO Q2 2022



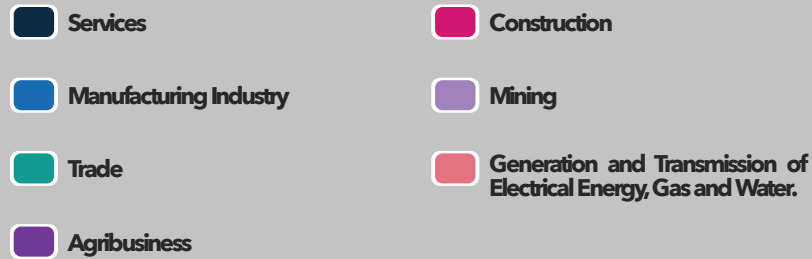

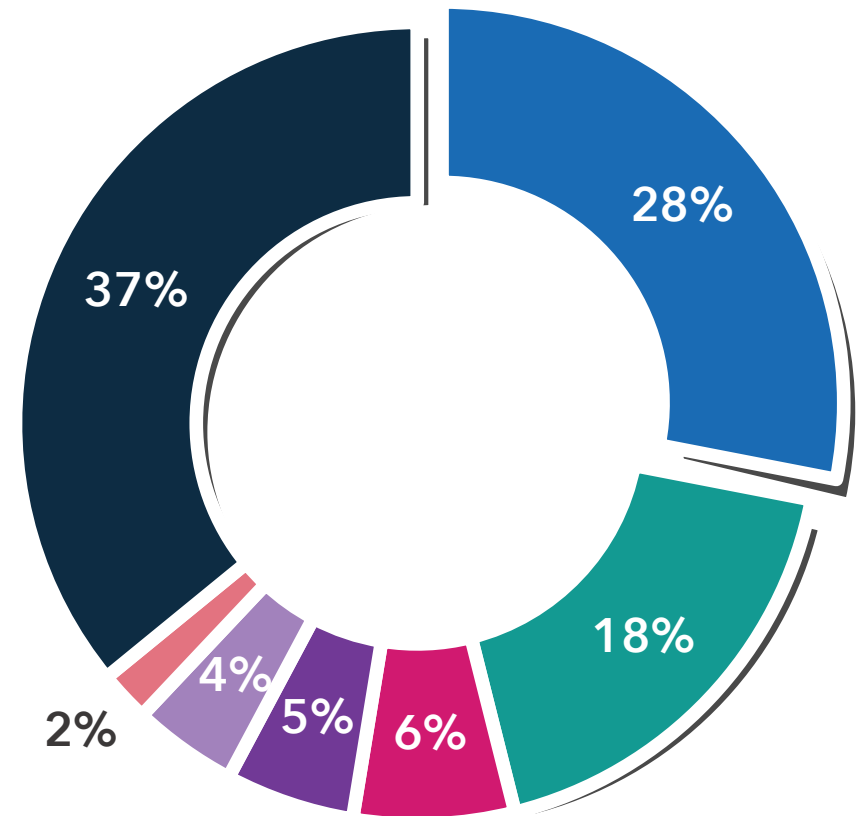

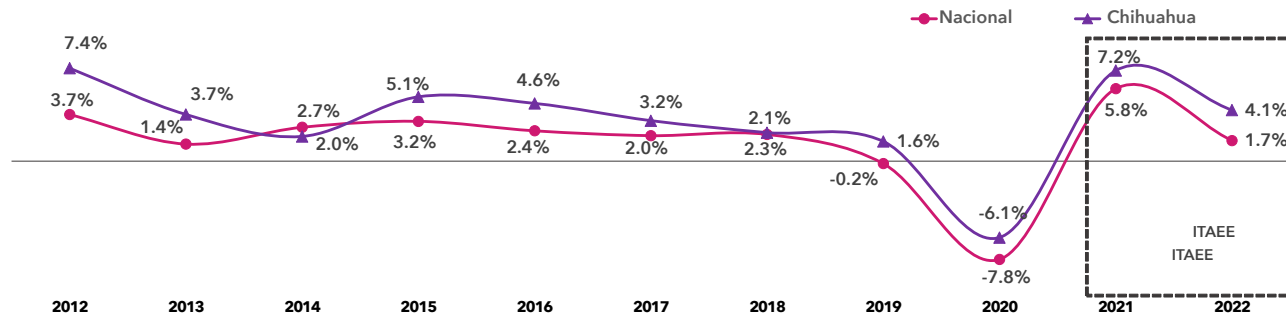

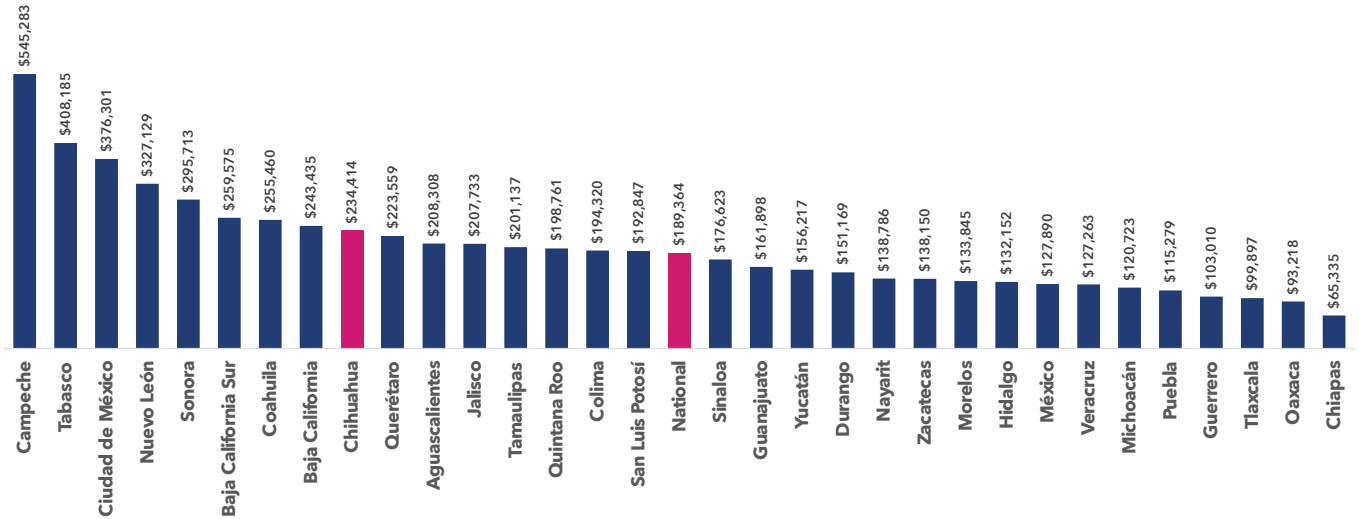

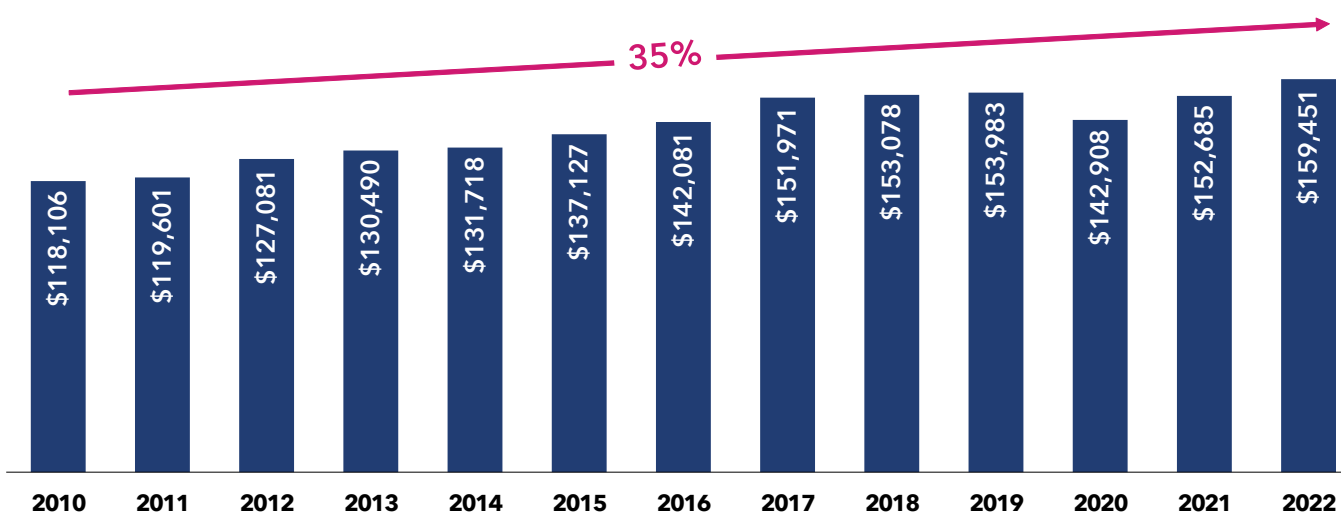

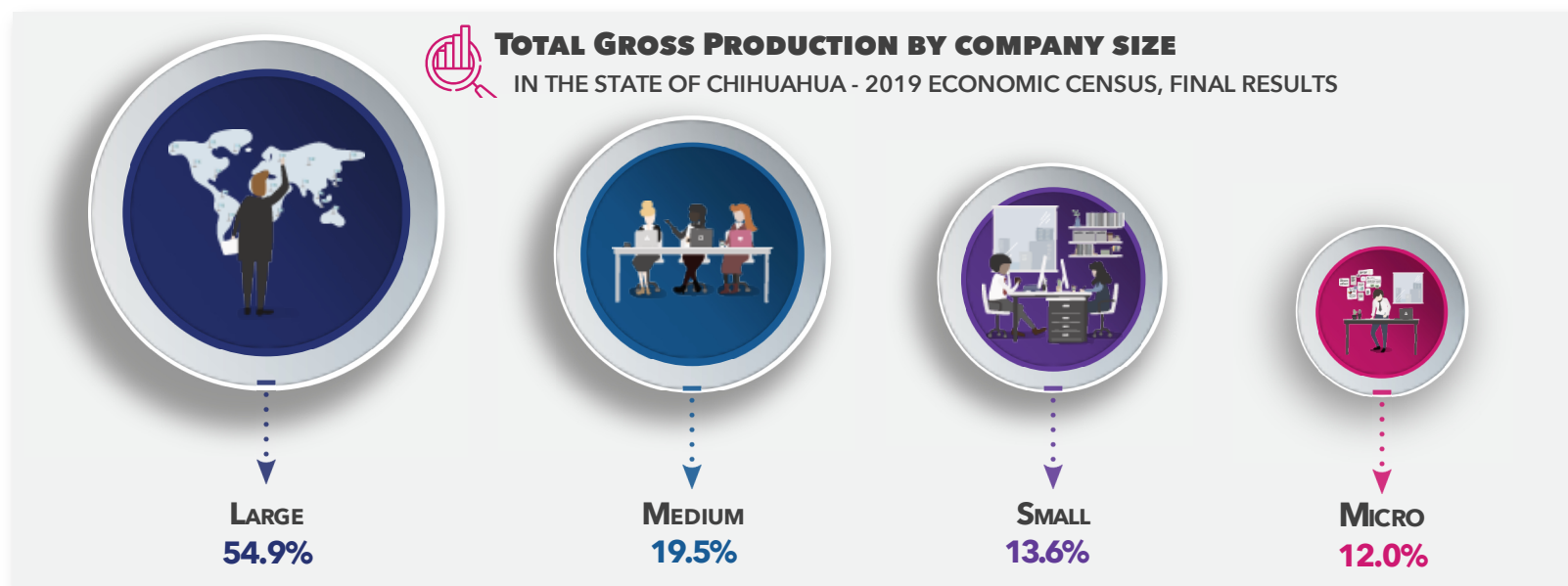

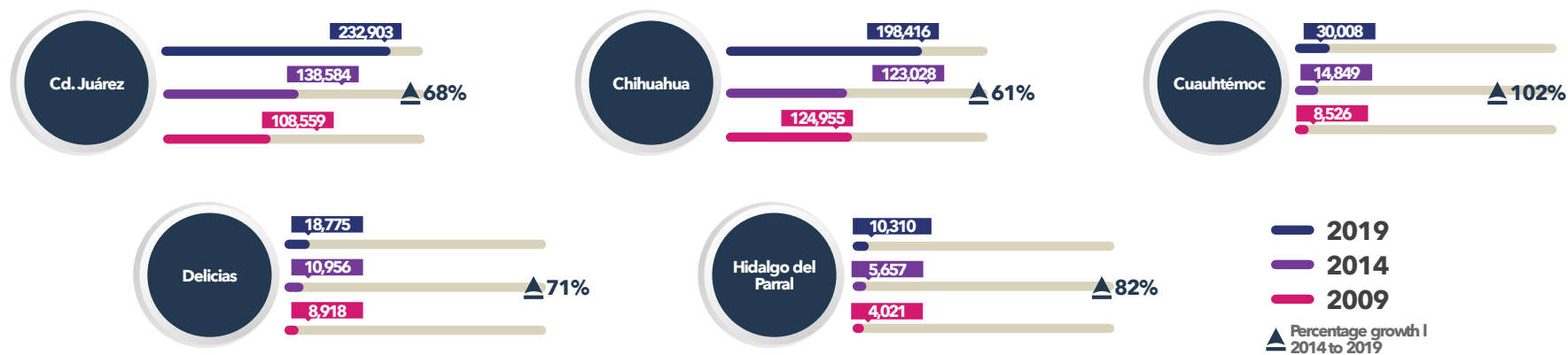

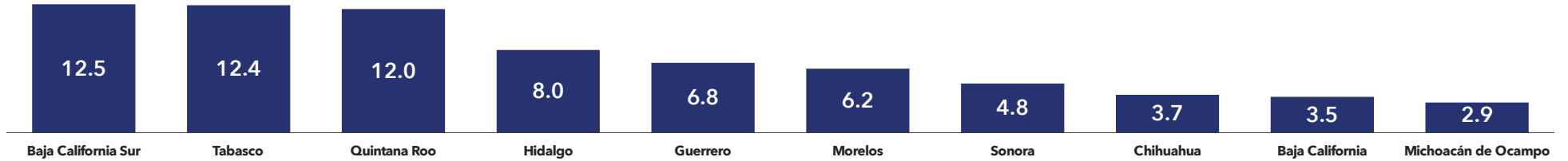

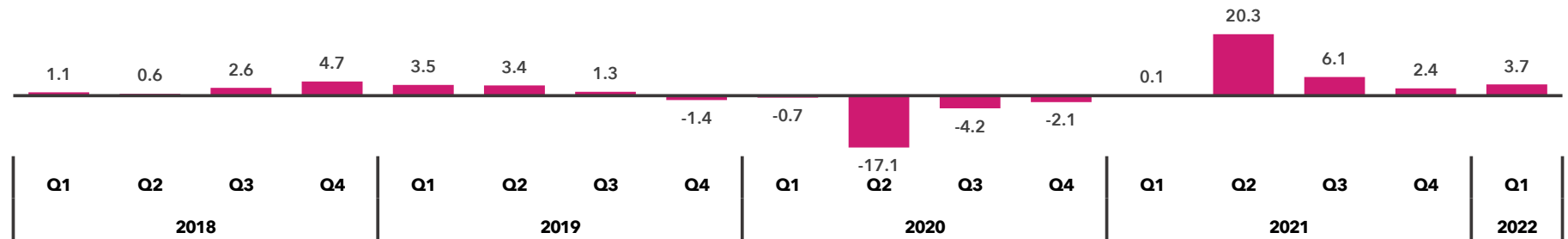
## AVERAGE ECONOMIC GROWTH BY STATE

ANNUAL PERCENTAGE CHANGE - AVERAGE AS OF Q1 2022 (SEASONALLY ADJUSTED SERIES)



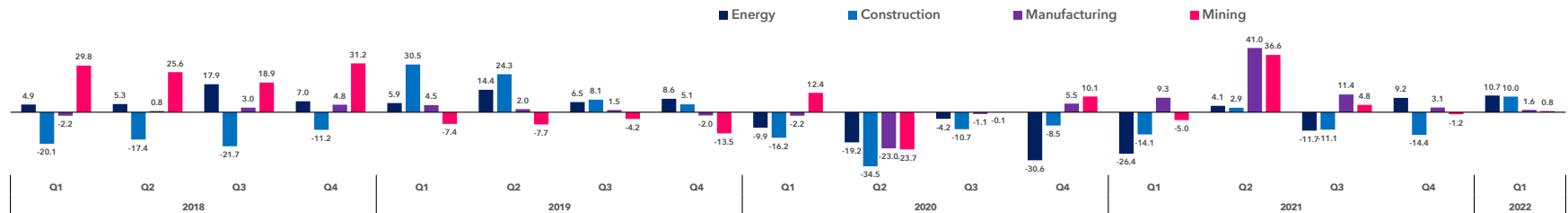
## ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN CHIHUAHUA

## ANNUAL VARIATION OF THE ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN INDUSTRIAL SECTORS

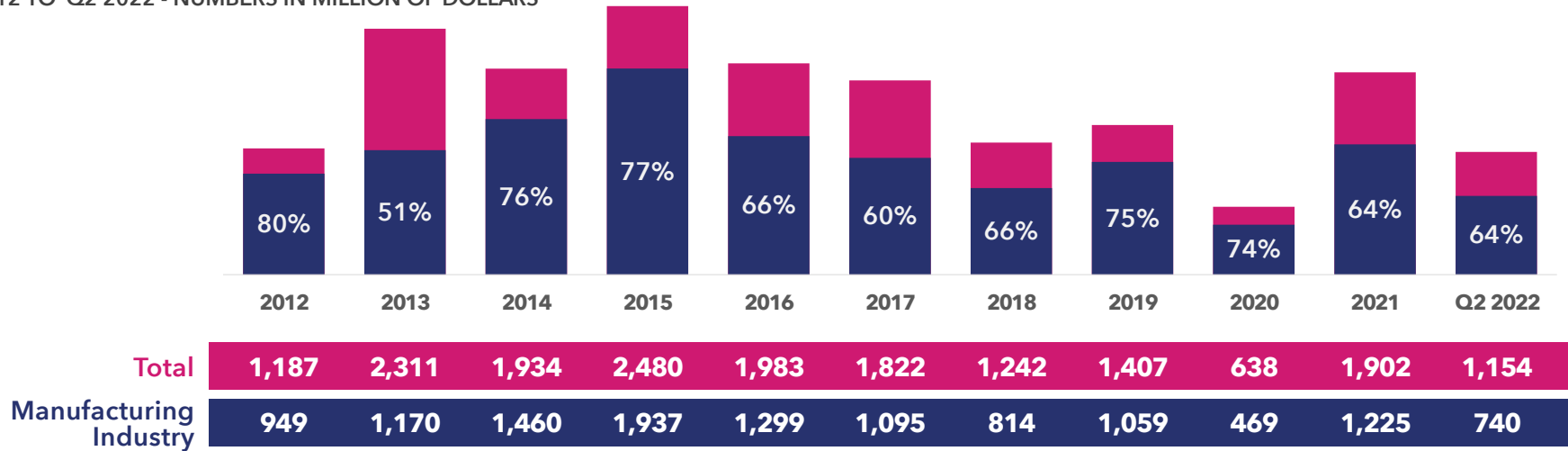

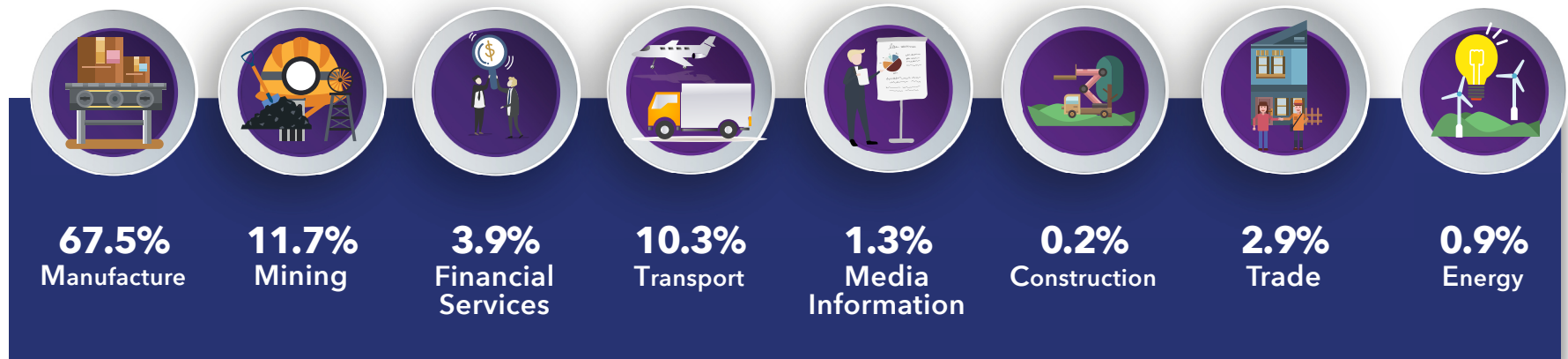

## FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT IN THE STATE BY COUNTRY

Q2 2022

Based on the Federal Secretary of Economy data, Mexico registered 27.5 billion dollars in Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) as of the second quarter of 2022.

During the same period, Chihuahua received 1,153.6 million dollars, contributing 4.2% of the national total, and the state is ranked 5th as the recipient of FDI after Cd. de Mexico, Nuevo Leon, Jalisco and México State.

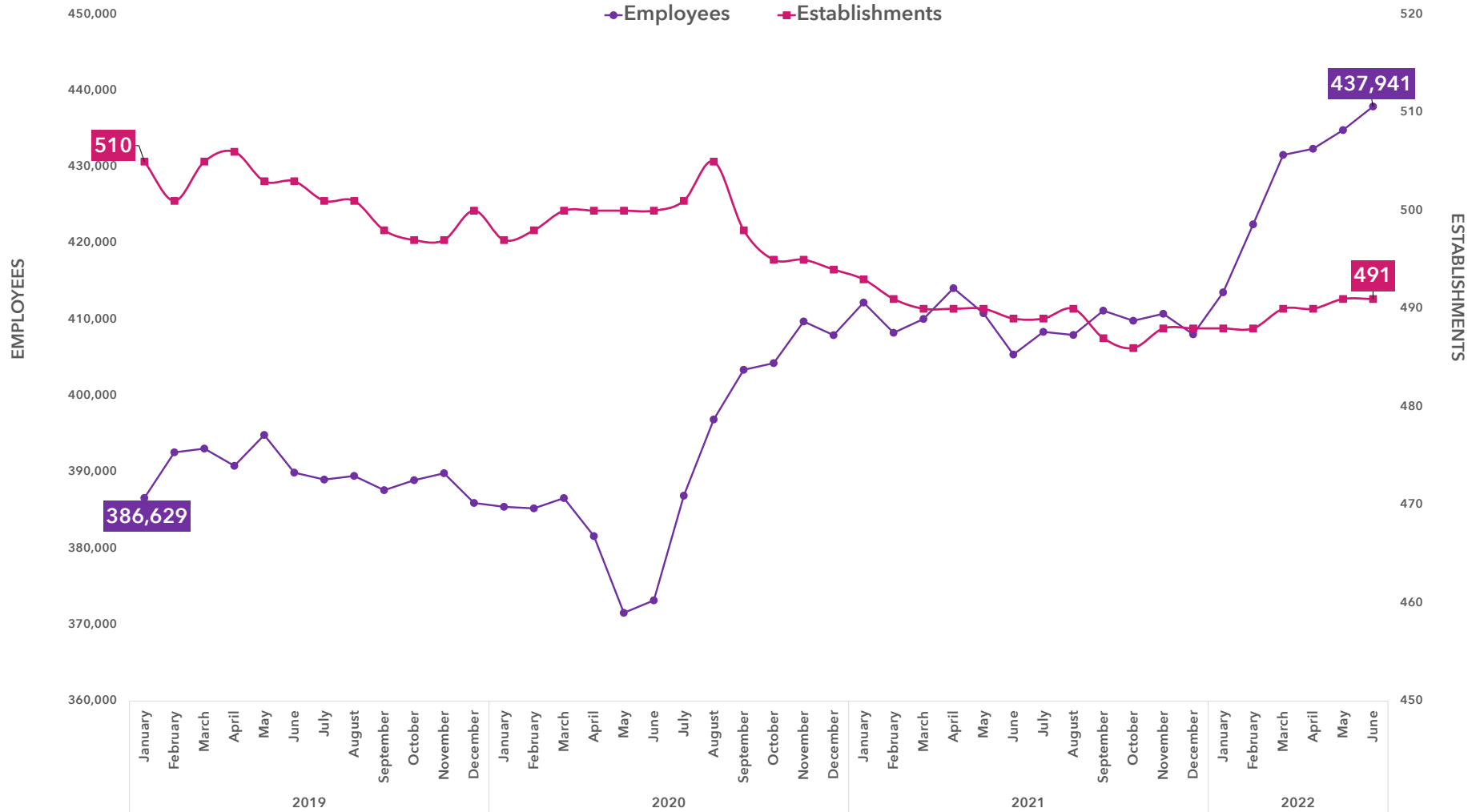

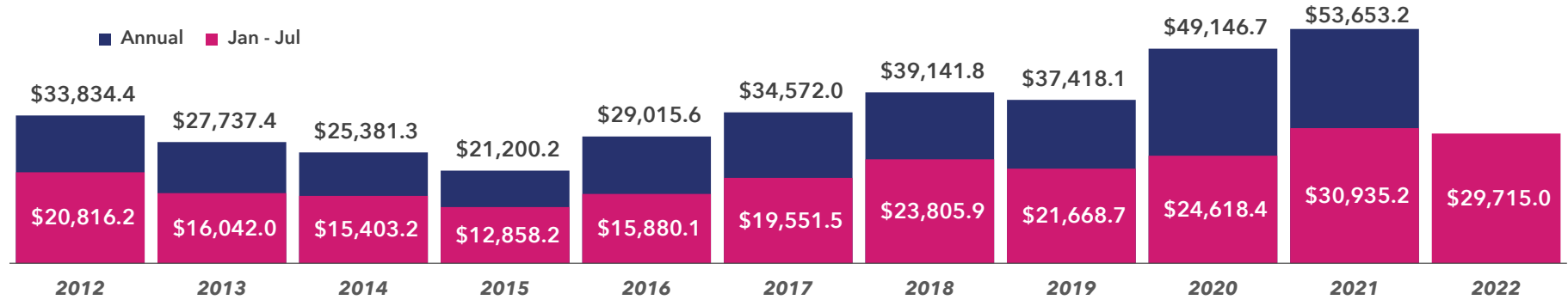

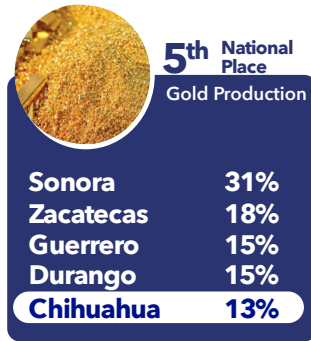
## PRODUCTION VALUE OF THE MAIN METALS

2012 TO JULY 2022 - FIGURES IN MILLIONS OF PESOS

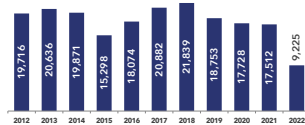

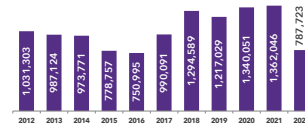

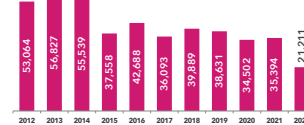

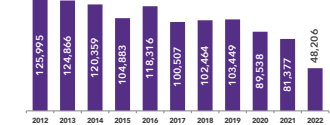

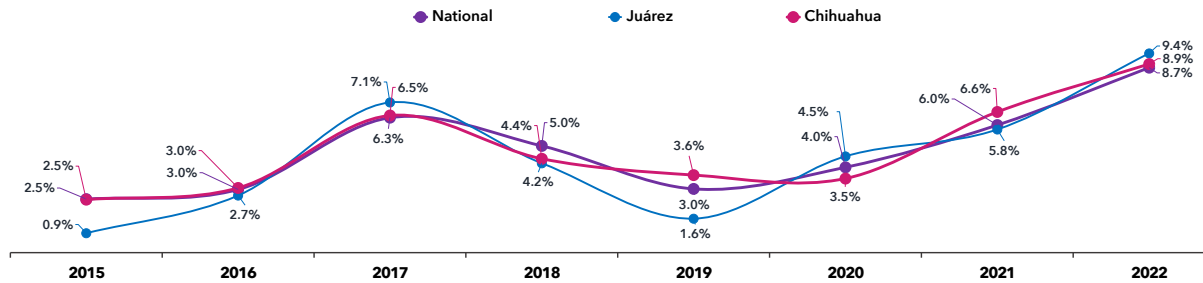

## ANNUAL INFLATION 2015 - 2022 UP TO SEPTEMBER



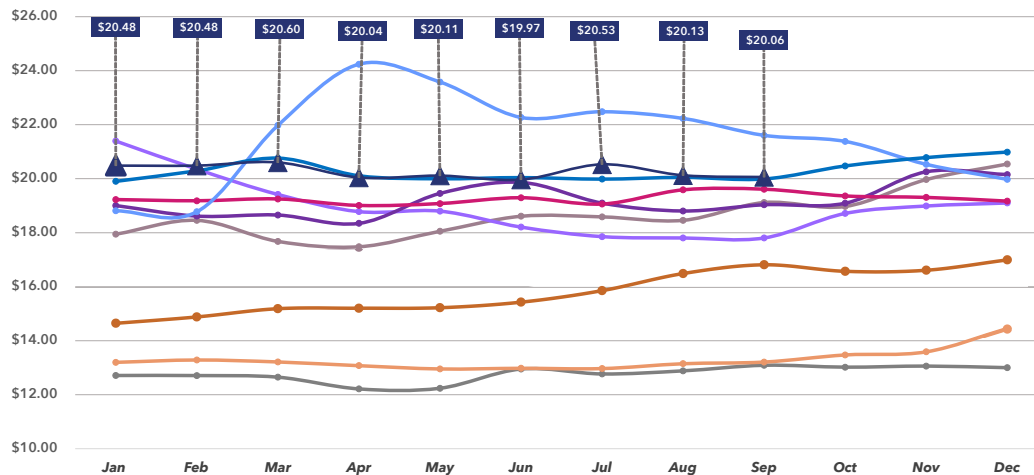

In September 2022, Juárez presented an annual inflation of 19.4% higher than it was during the same period in 2021 by 3.6%. The value for Chihuahua is 8.9% higher than in September 2021, which was 6.6%; while the national inflation is 8.7%.

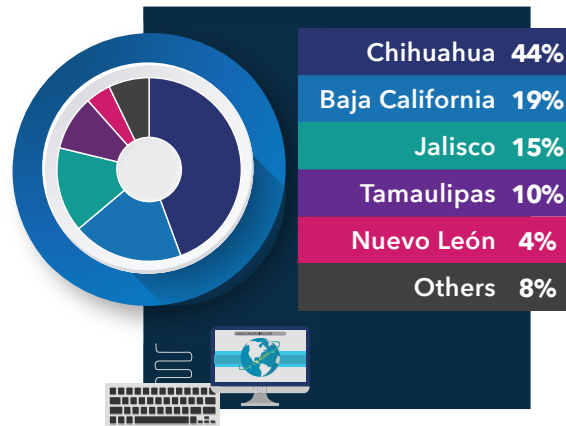

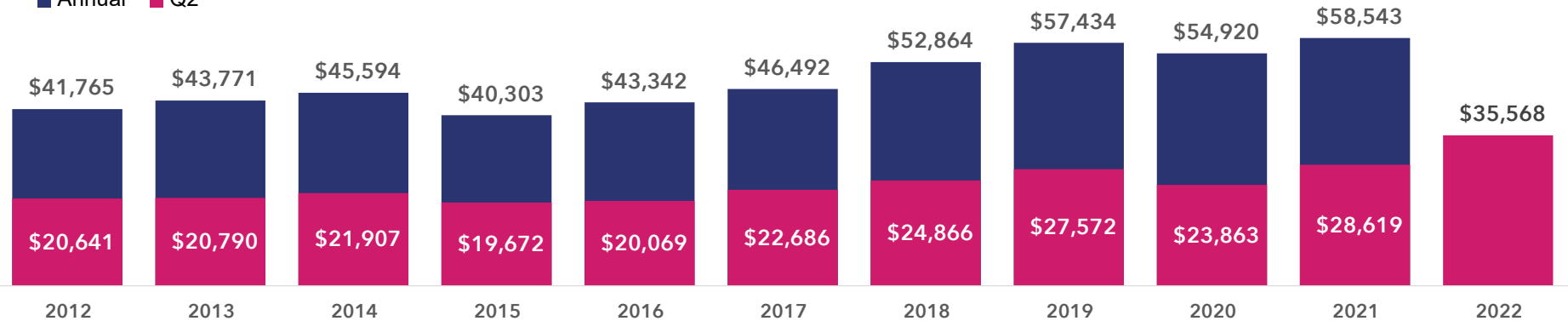

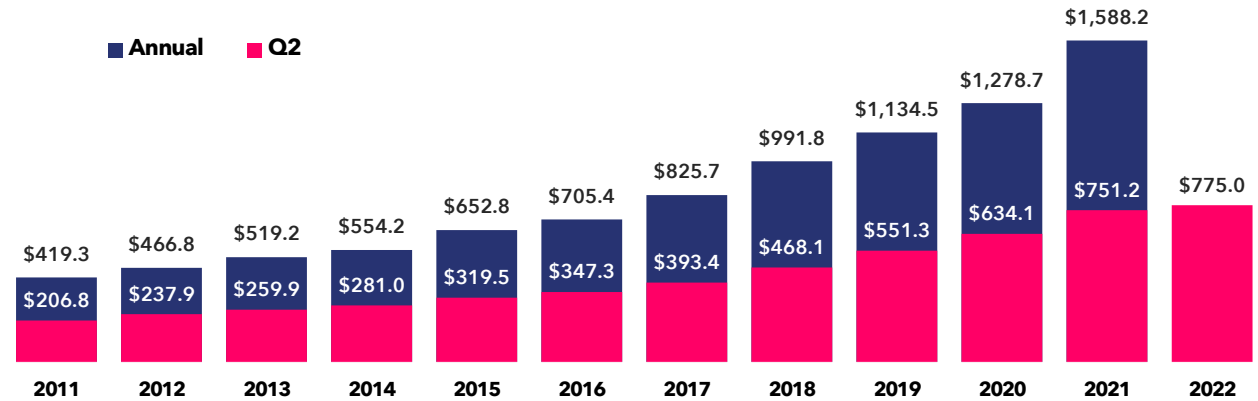

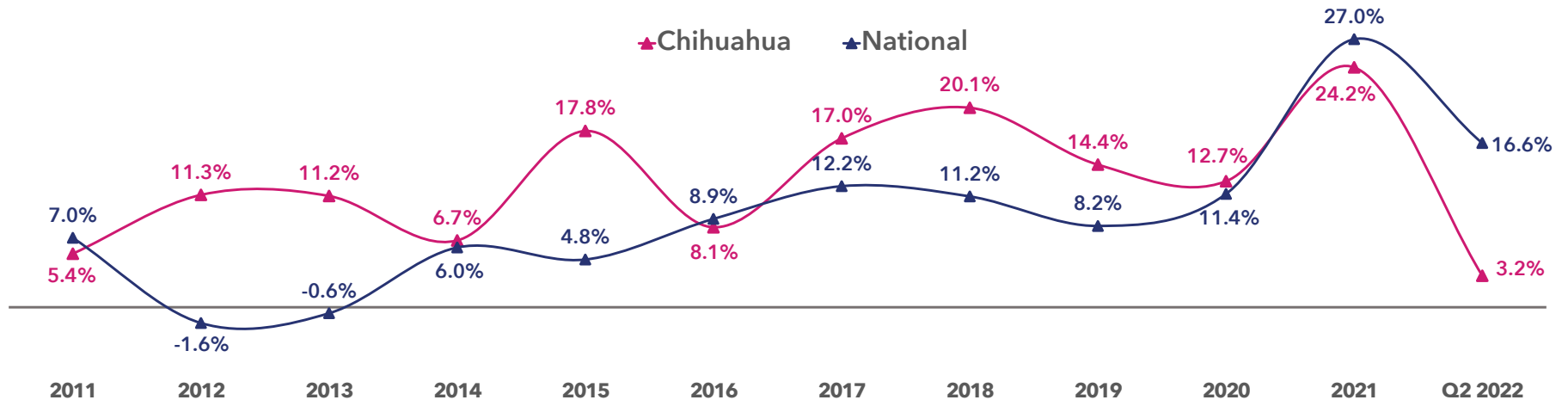
2011 TO SECOND QUARTER OF 2022 - FIGURES IN MILLIONS OF DOLLARS

2011 TO SECOND QUARTER OF 2022



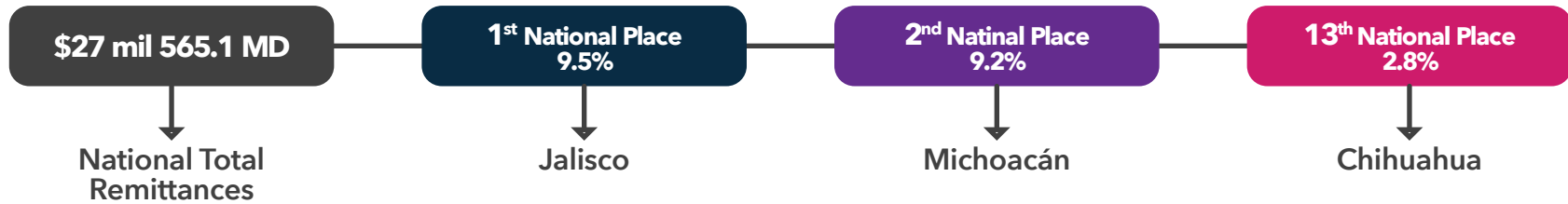

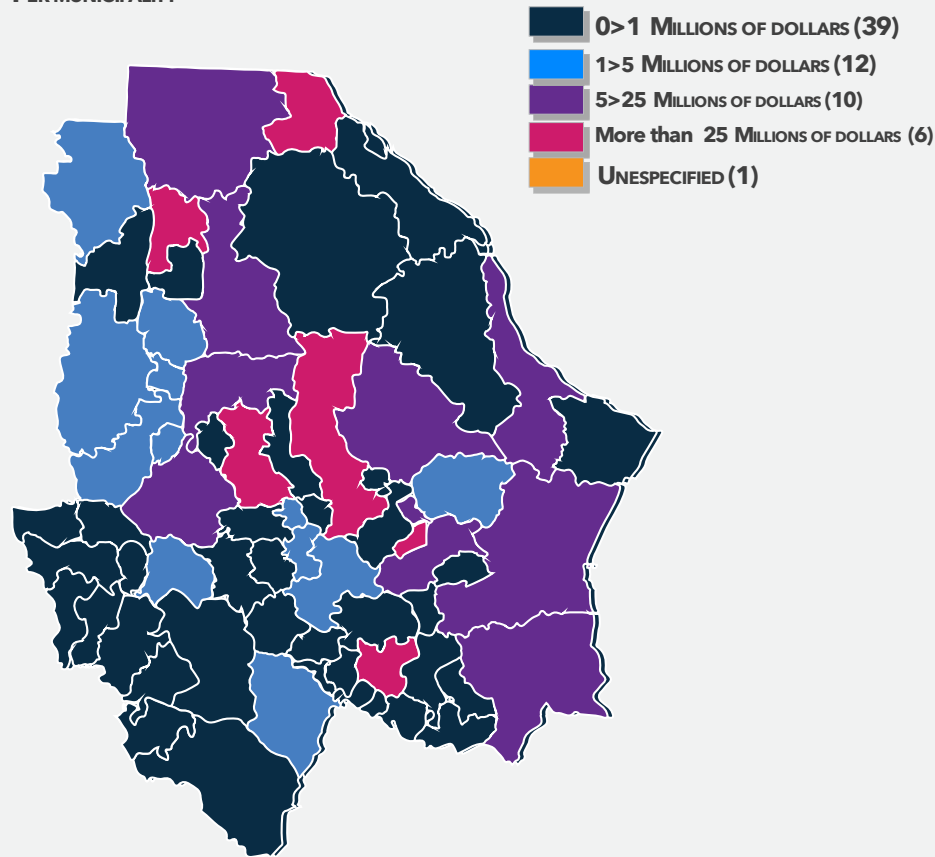

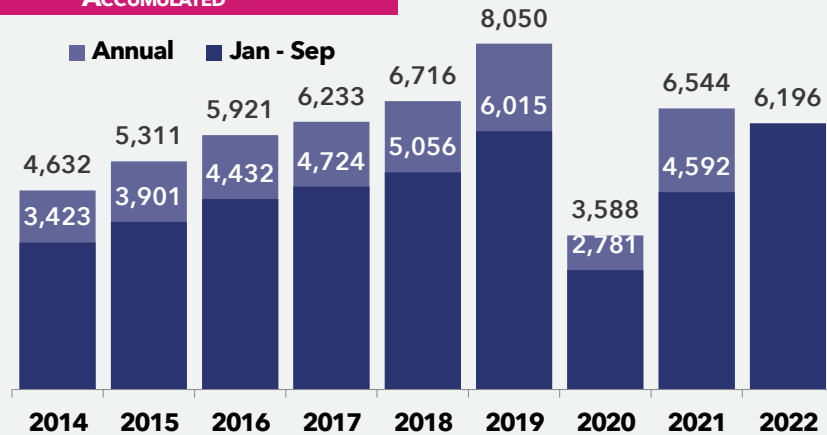

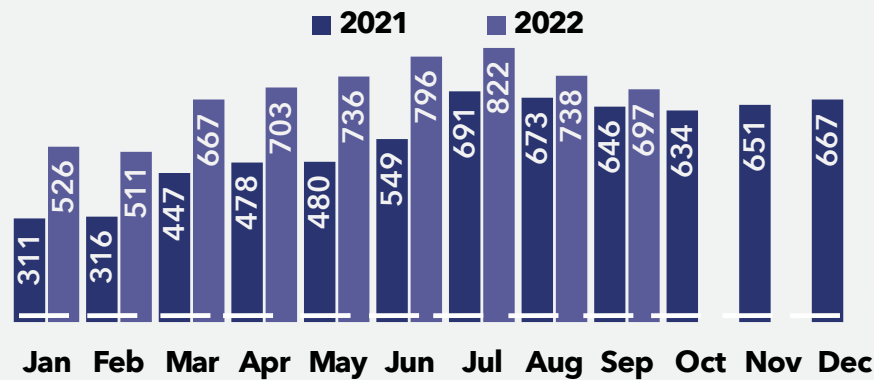
## NUMBER OF VISITORS IN THE STATE

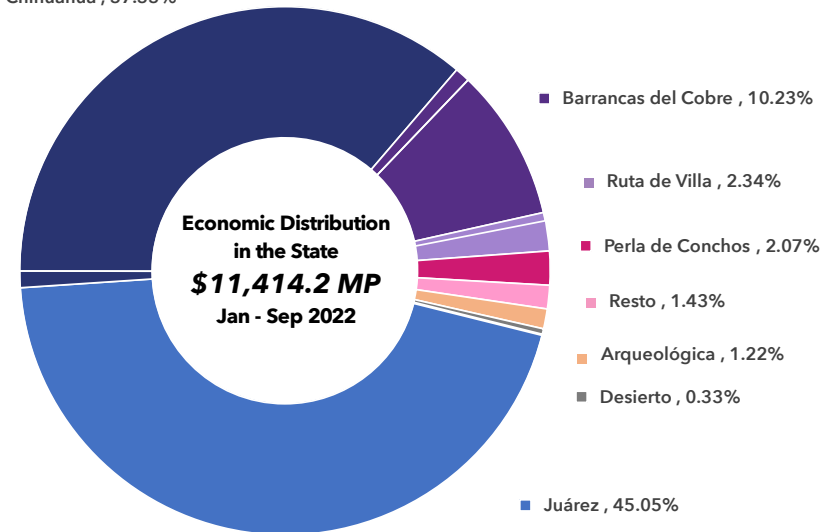

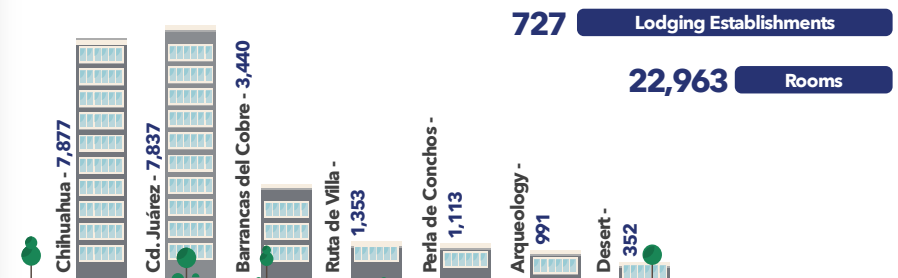
BY TOURISTIC REGION - FIGURES IN MILLIONS OF PESOS

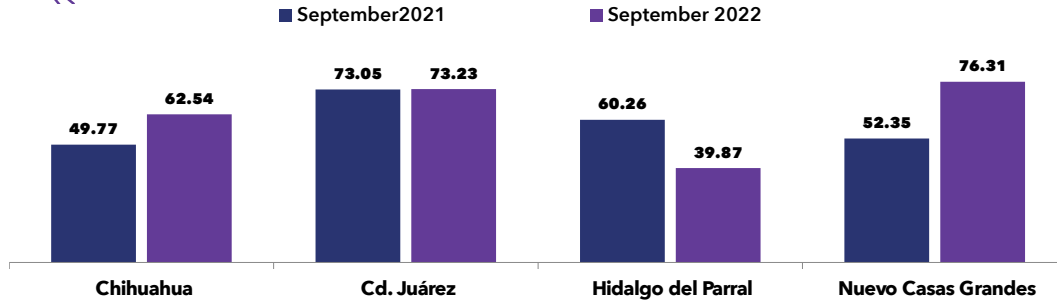

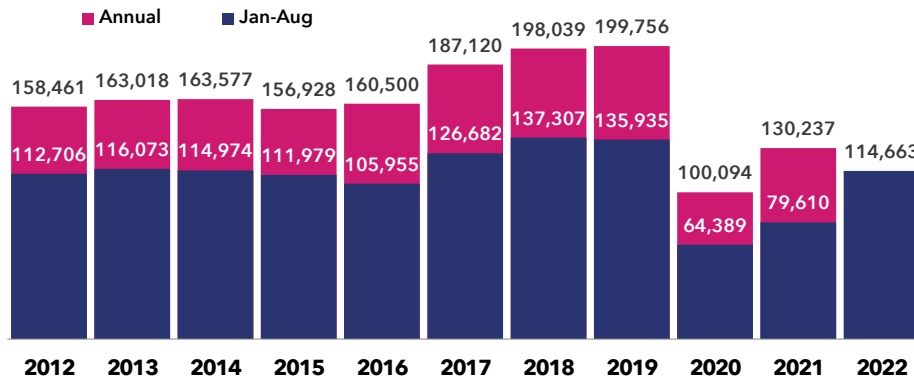

2012 TO AUGUST 2022

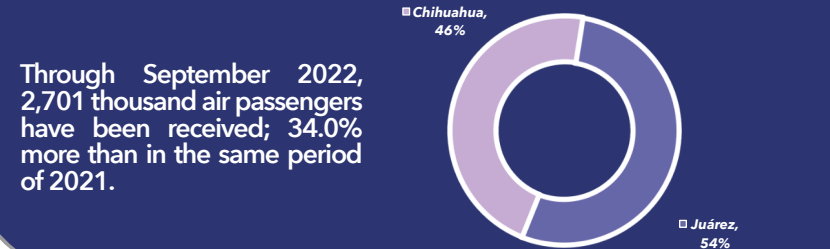
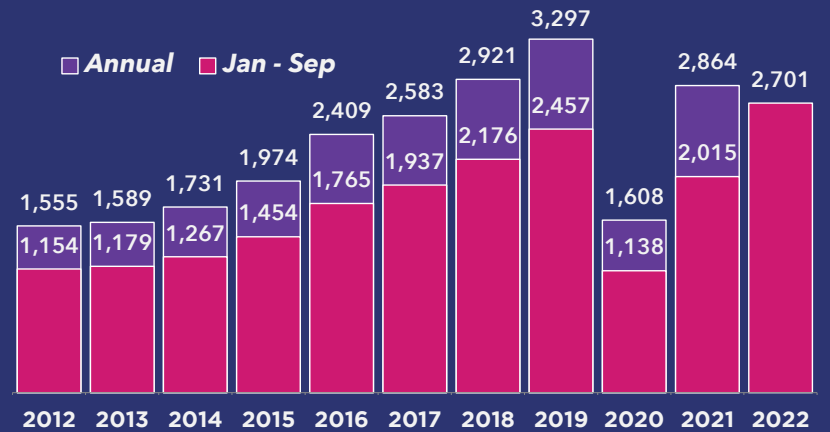
