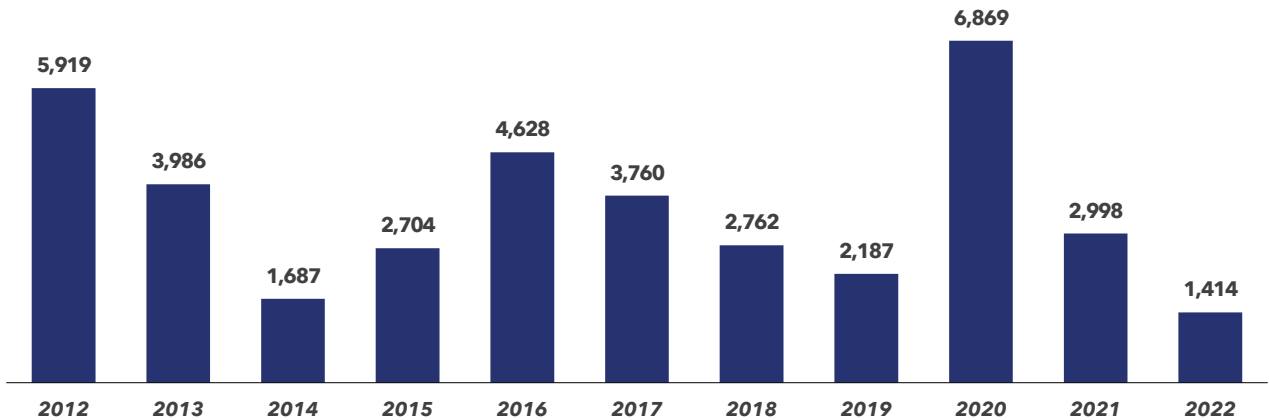

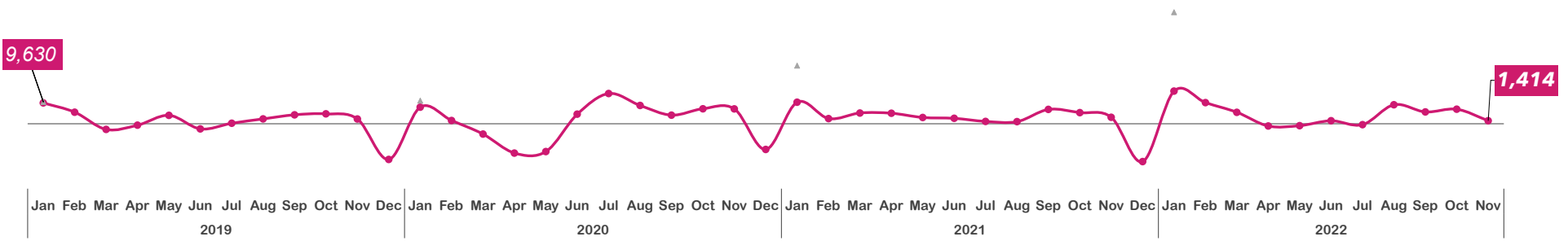

## EMPLOYMENT GENERATED PER MONTH JANUARY 2019 - NOVEMBER 2022

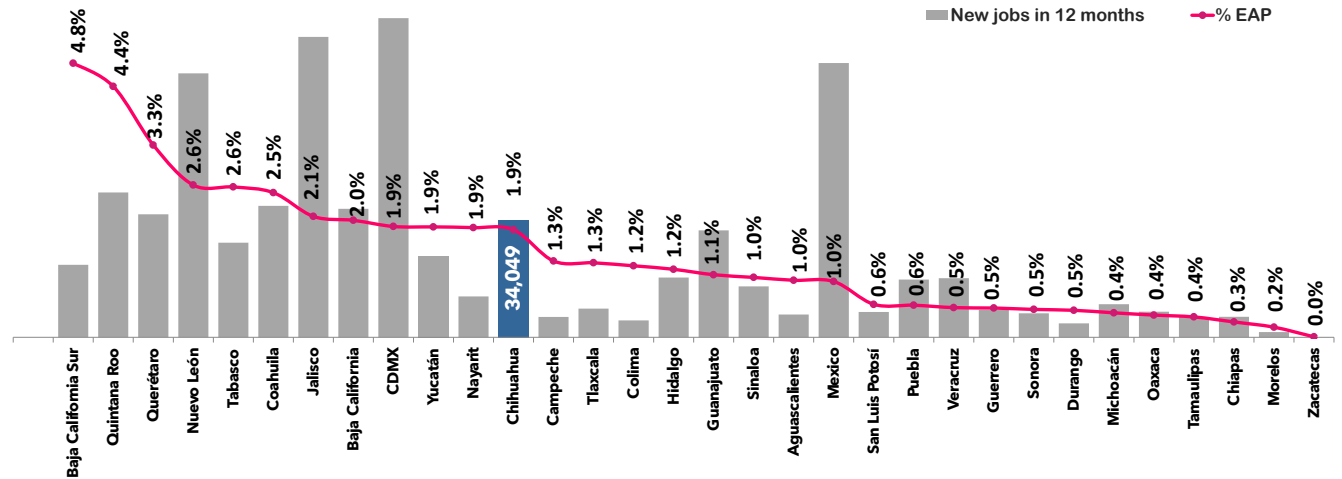

BY STATE PROPORTIONALLY TO THE EAP\*

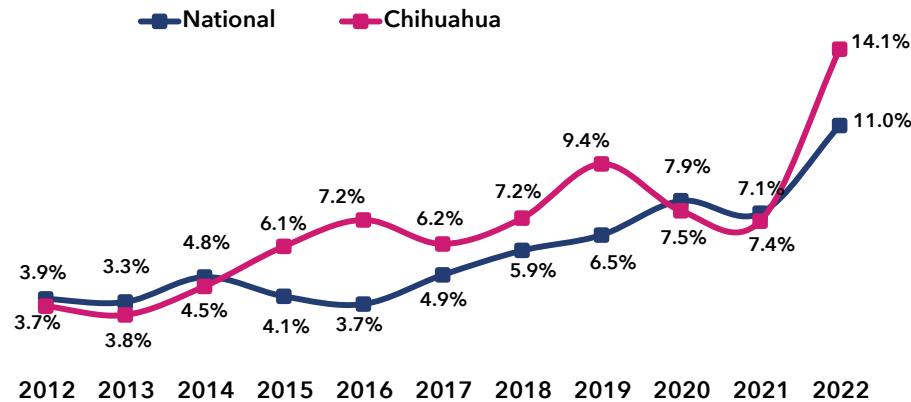

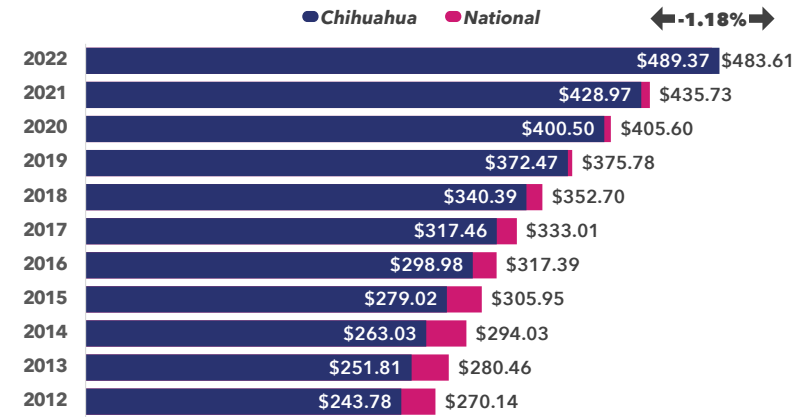
## DAILY SALARY ASSOCIATED

### COMPARISON WITH THE NATIONAL AVERAGE TO NOVEMBER OF EACH YEAR (PESOS PER DAY)



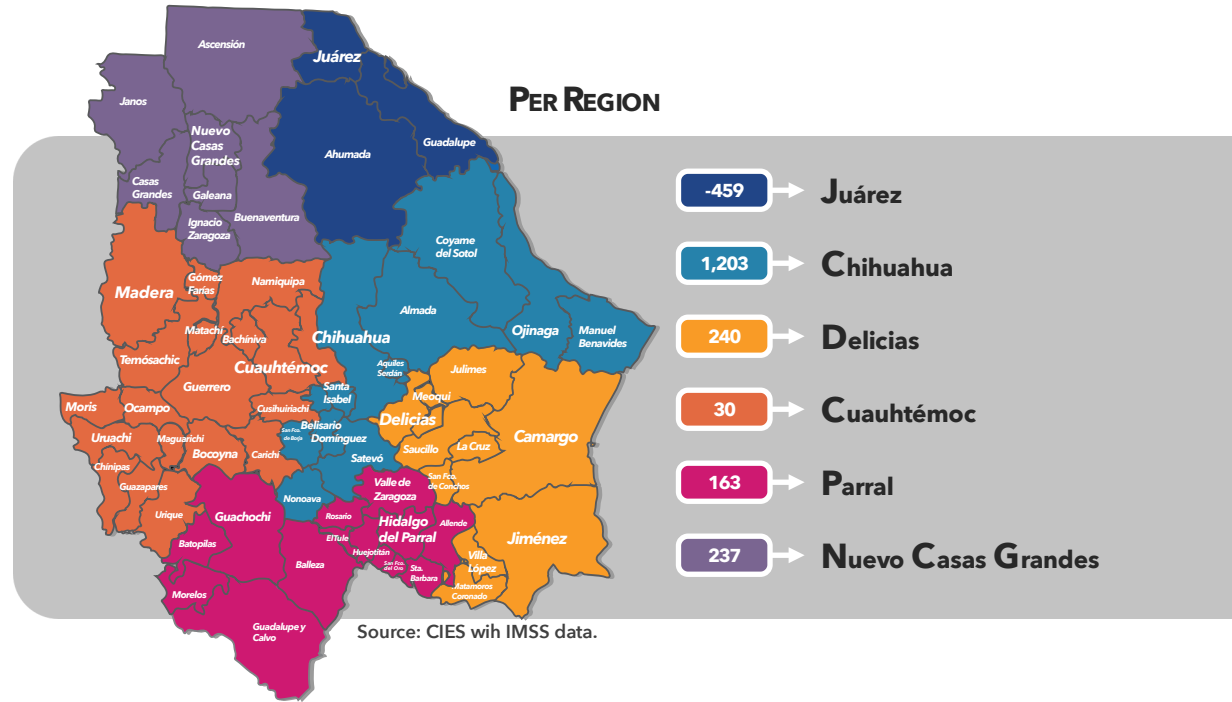
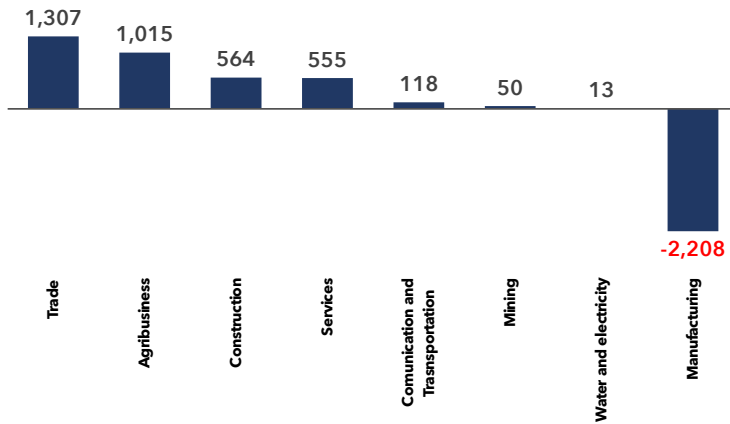

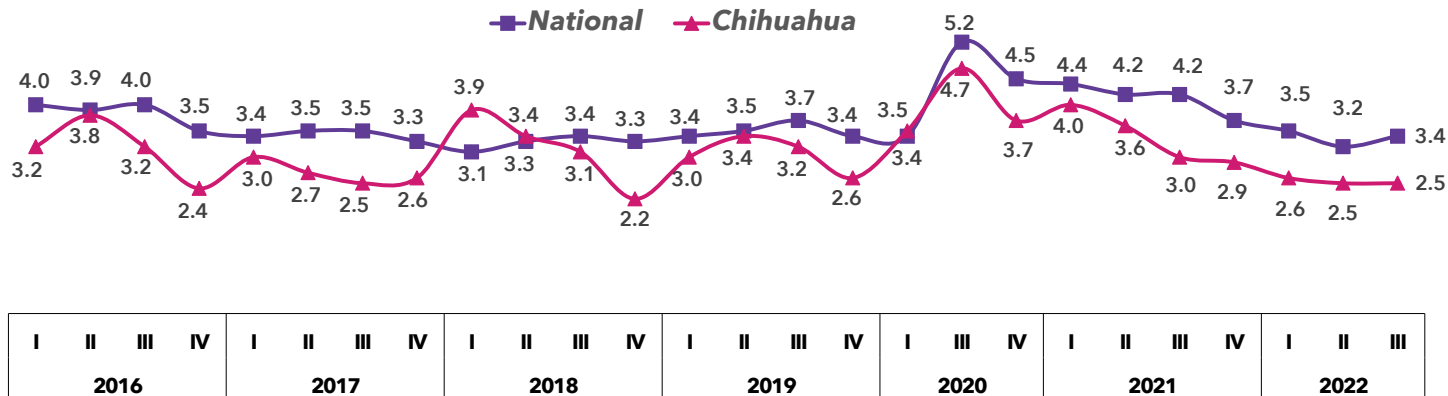

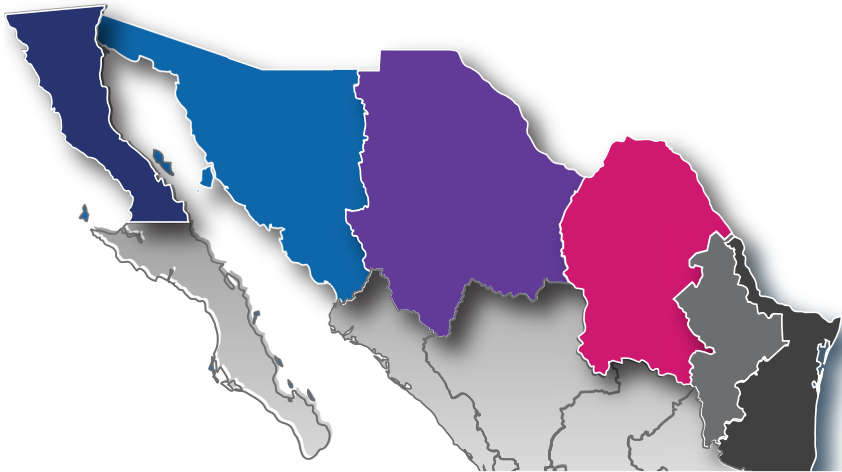

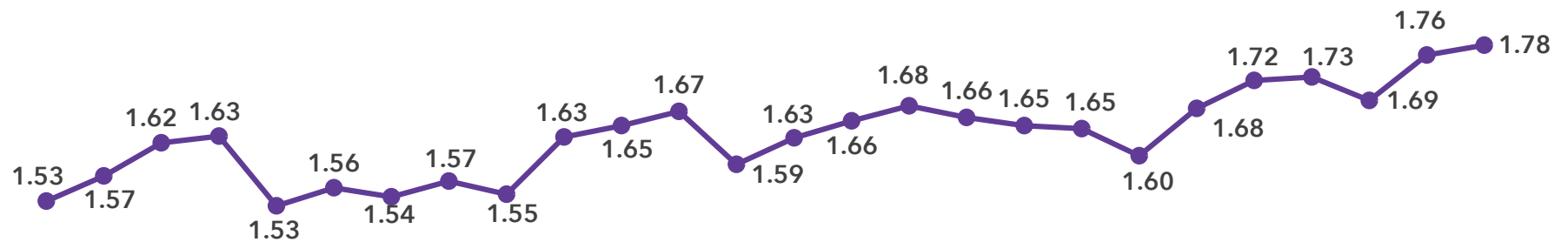

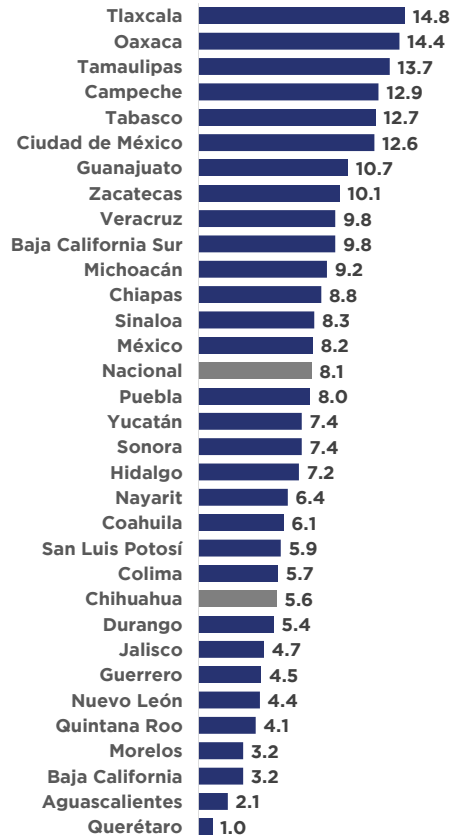

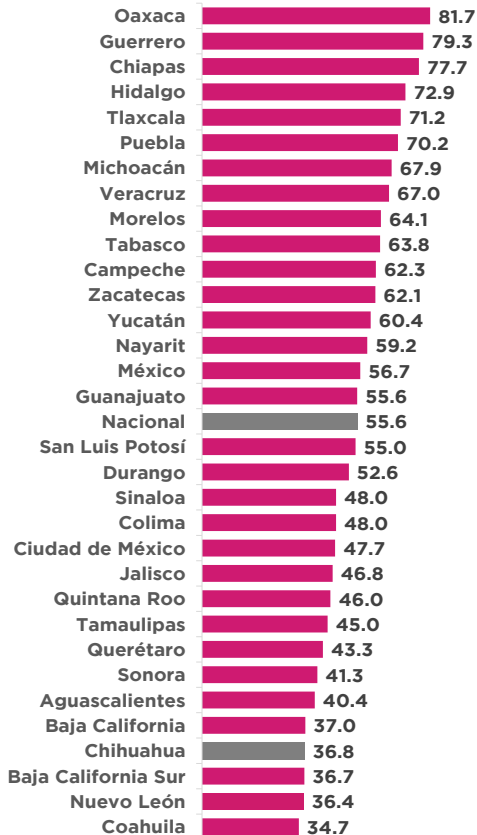

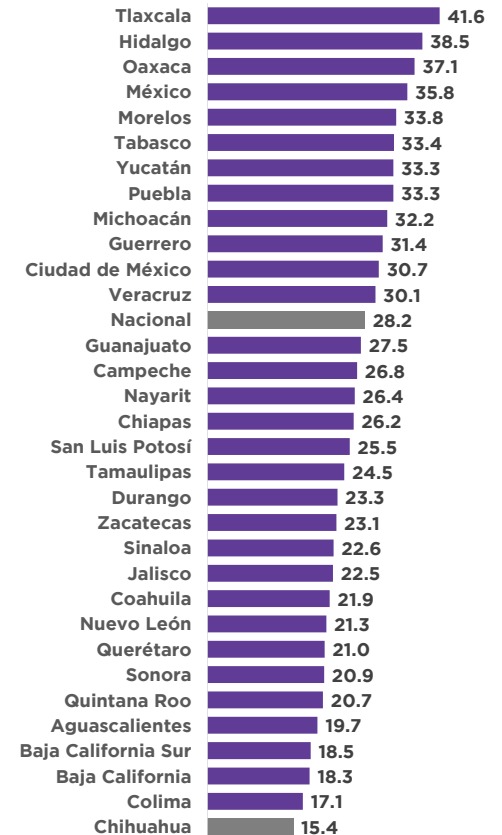
### Informal Labor Rate\*

### Employment Rate in the Informal Sector\*



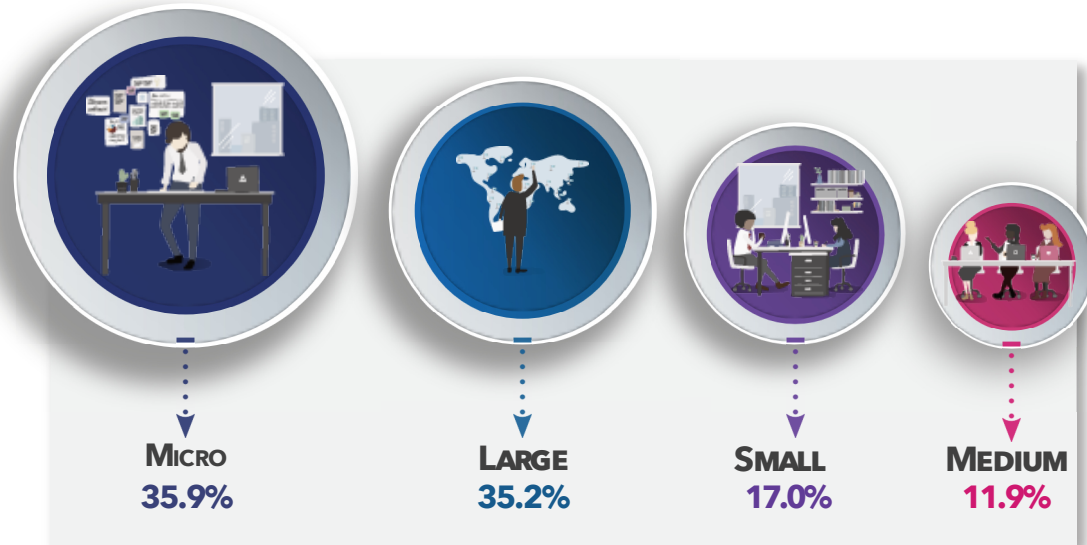

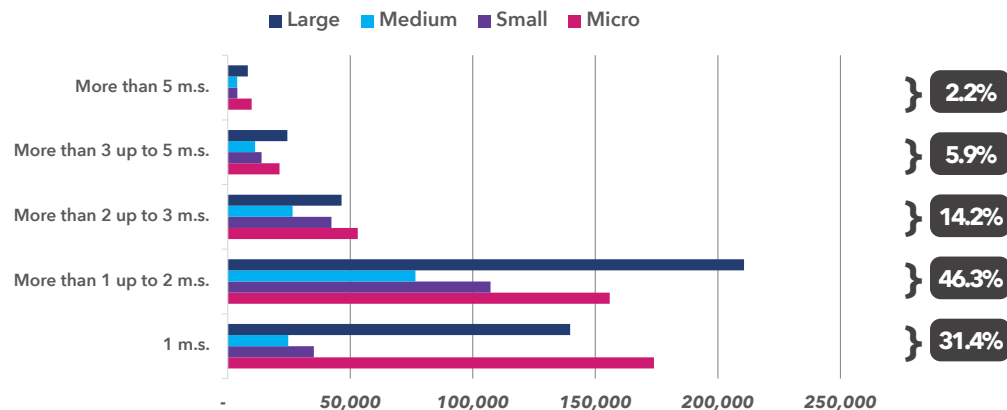

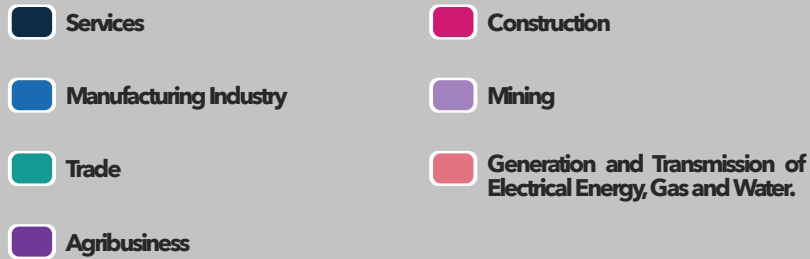

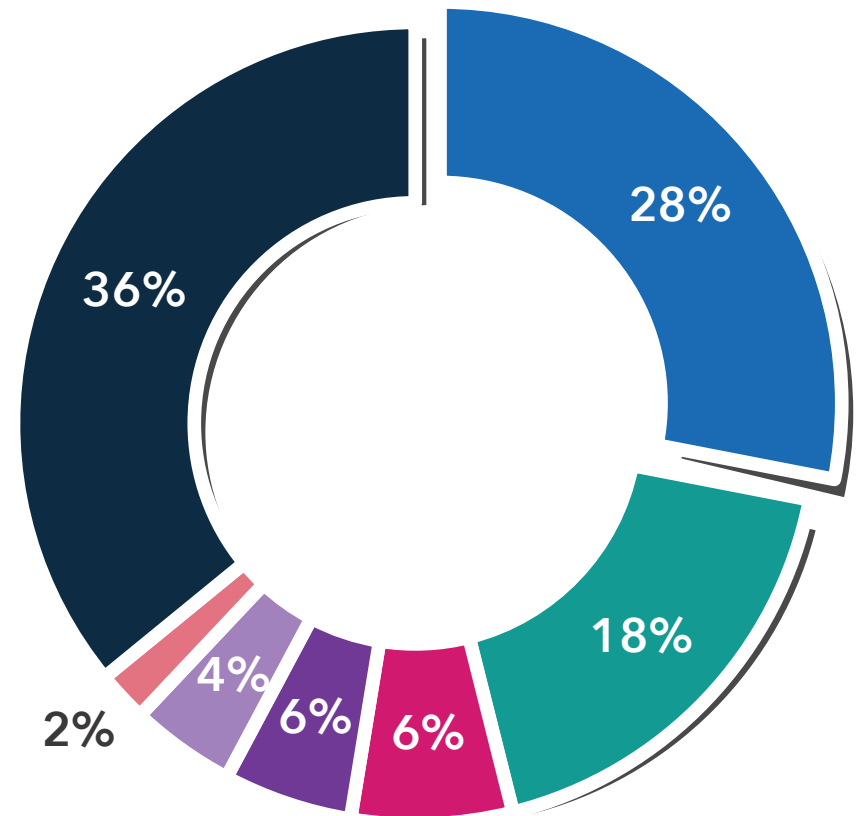

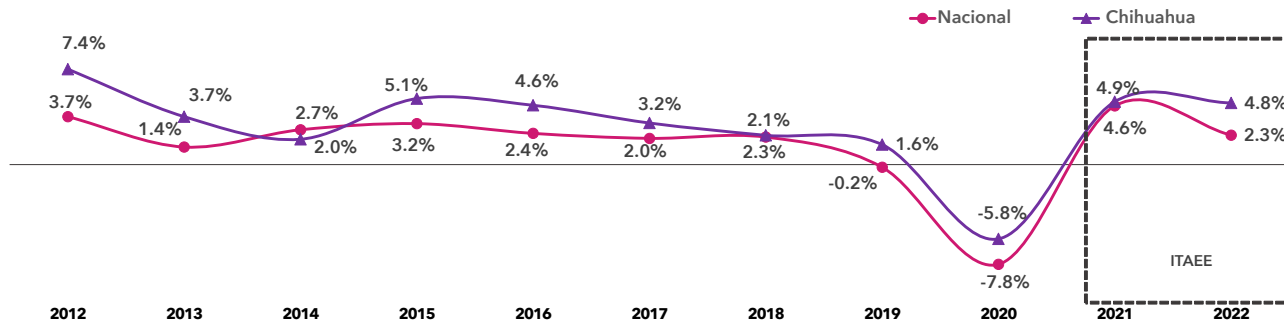

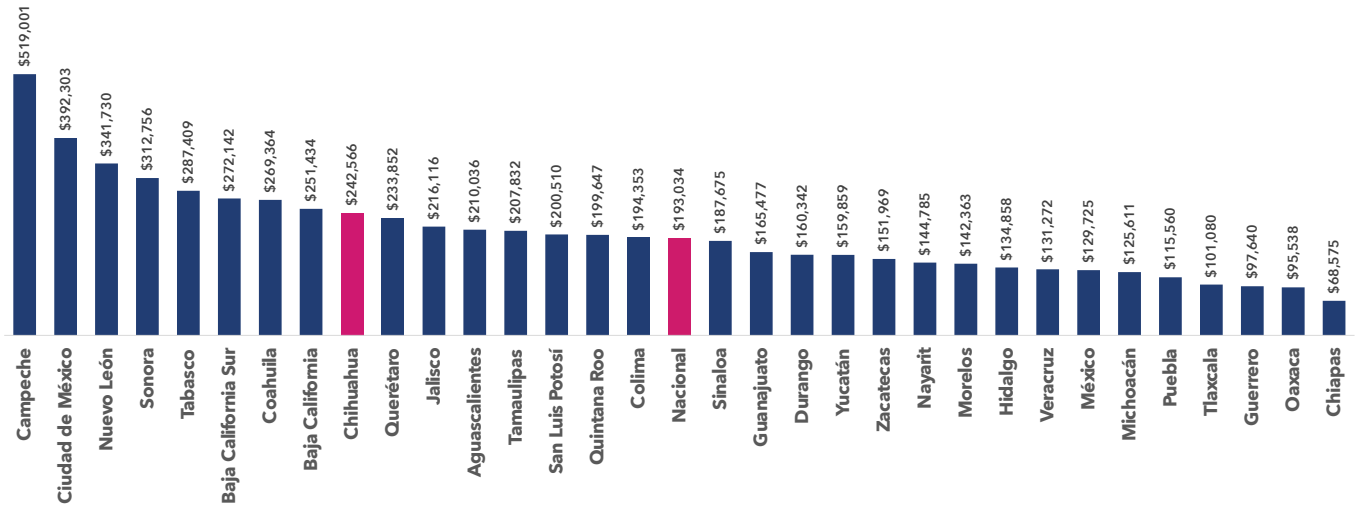

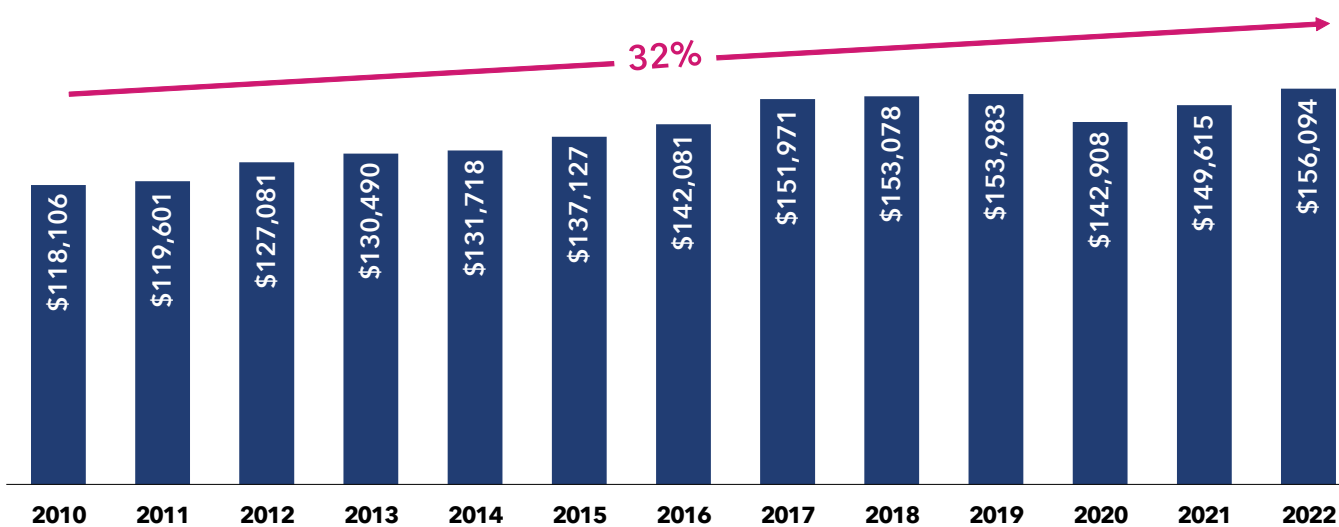

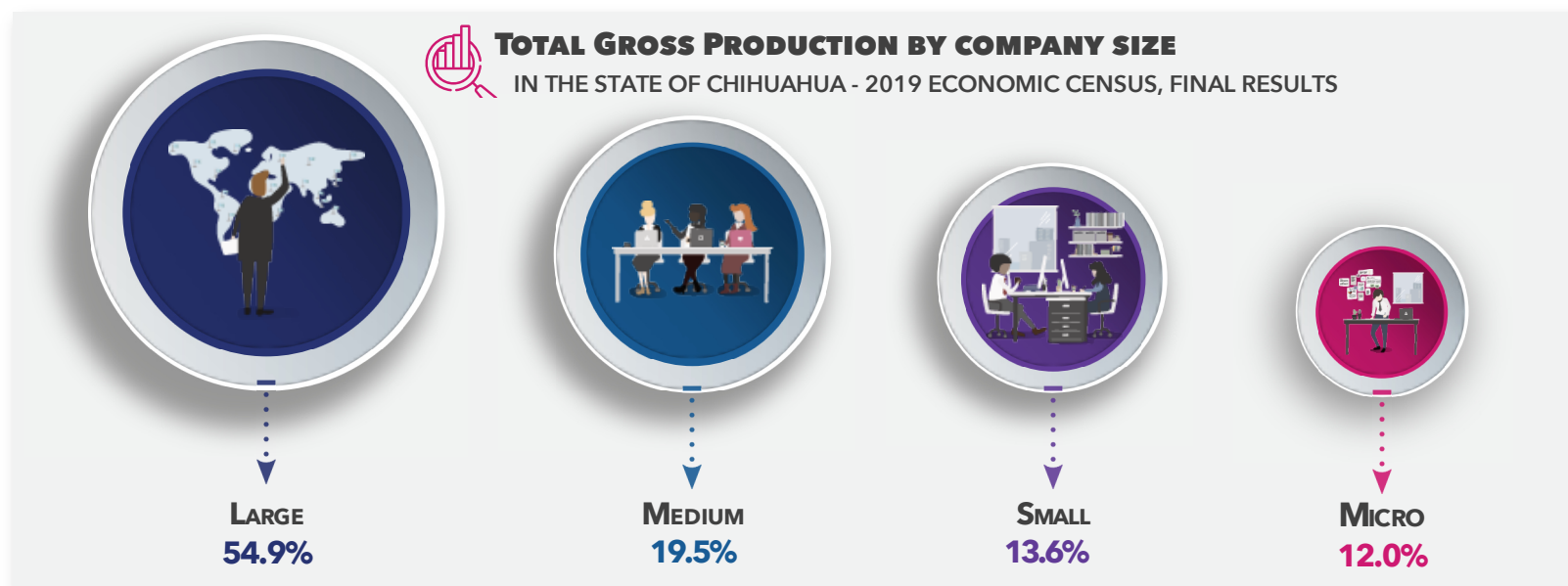

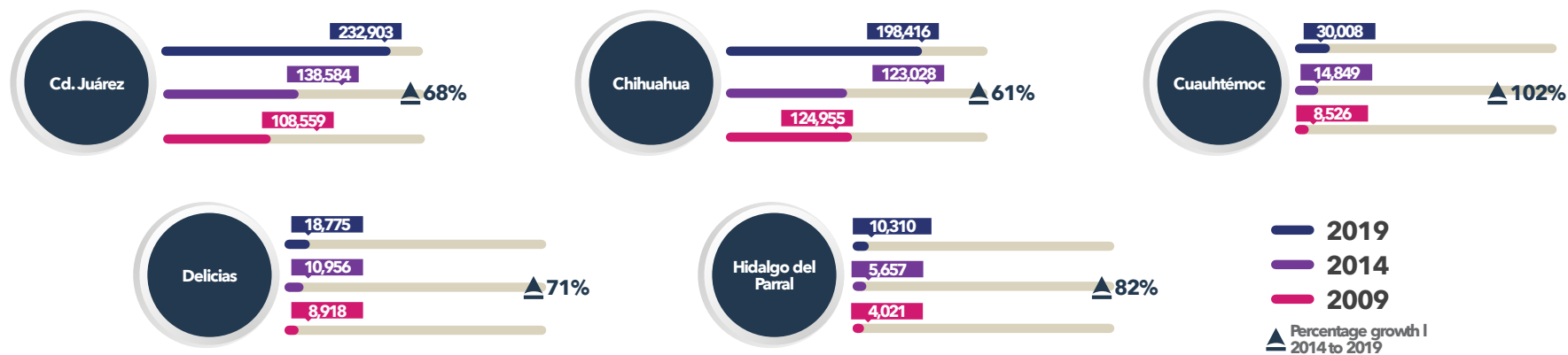

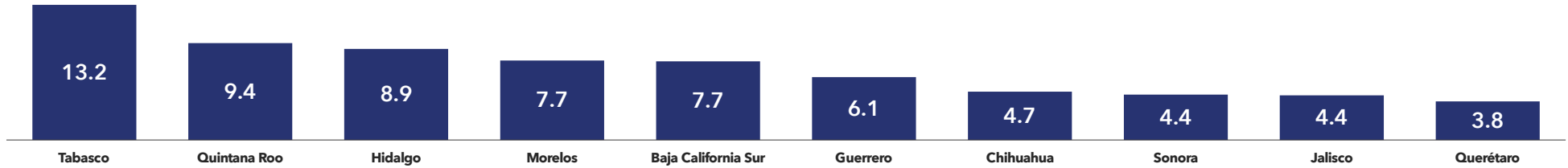

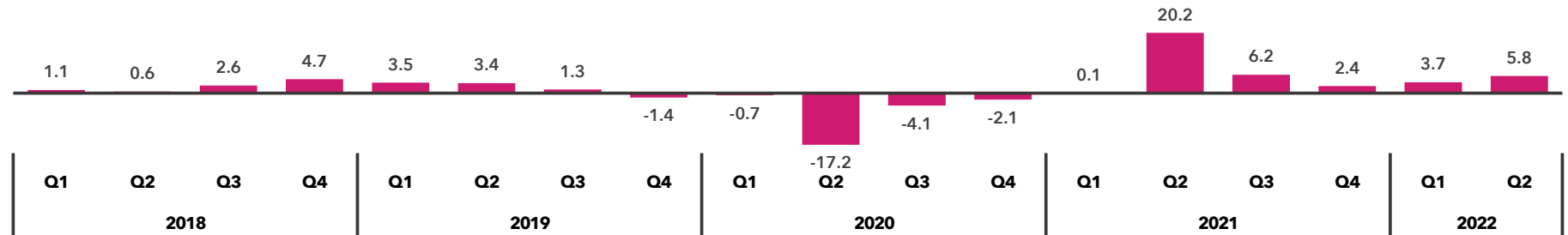
## AVERAGE ECONOMIC GROWTH BY STATE

ANNUAL PERCENTAGE CHANGE - AVERAGE AS OF Q2 2022 (SEASONALLY ADJUSTED SERIES)



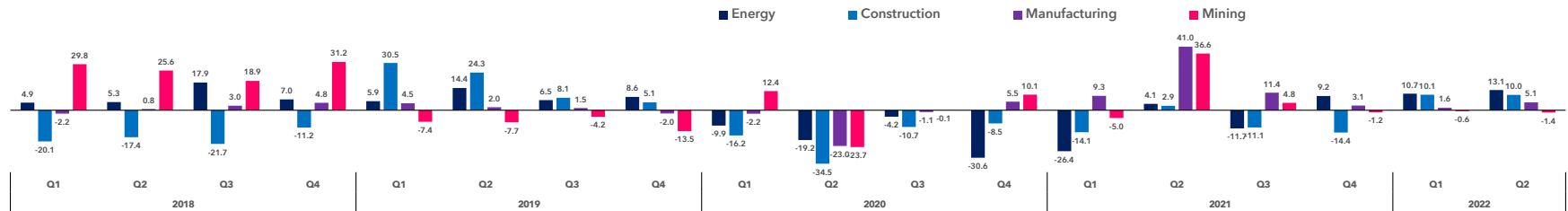
## ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN CHIHUAHUA

## ANNUAL VARIATION OF THE ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN INDUSTRIAL SECTORS

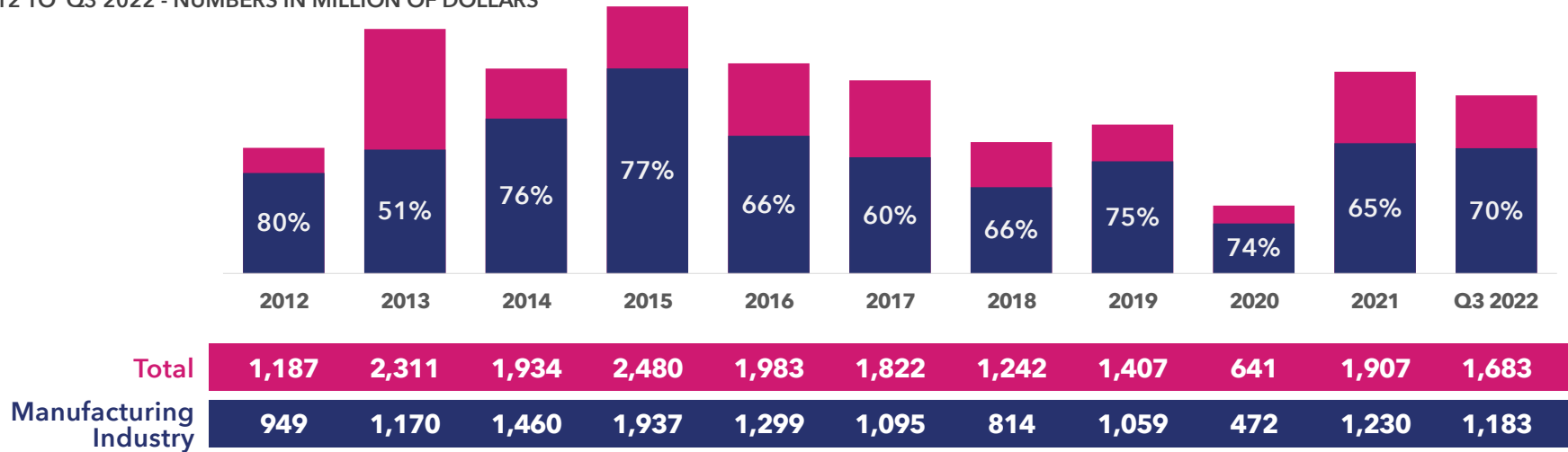

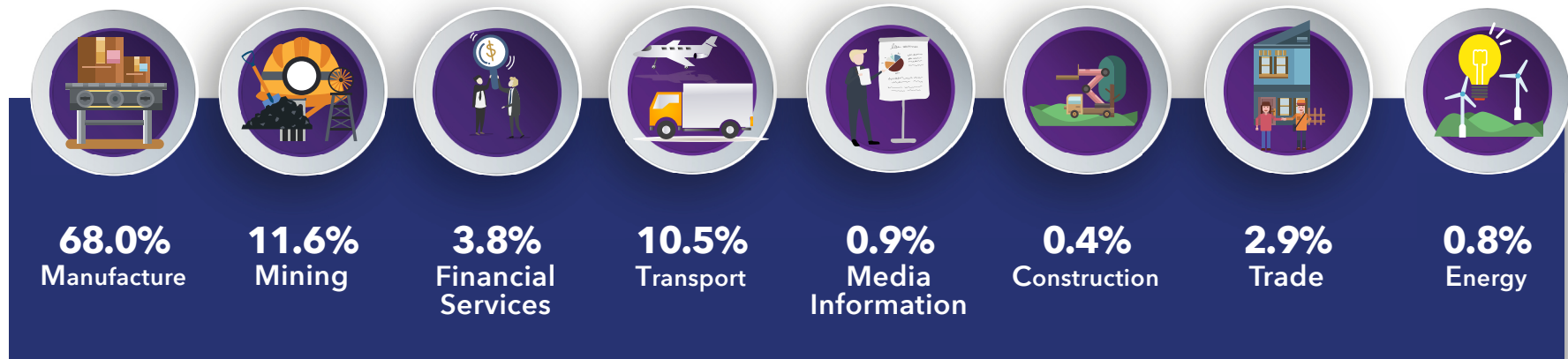

## FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT IN THE STATE BY COUNTRY

Q3 2022

Based on the Federal Secretary of Economy data, Mexico registered 32.1 billion dollars in Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) as of the third quarter of 2022.

During the same period, Chihuahua received 1,683.0 million dollars, contributing 5.2% of the national total, and the state is ranked 5th as the recipient of FDI after Cd. de Mexico, Nuevo Leon and Jalisco.

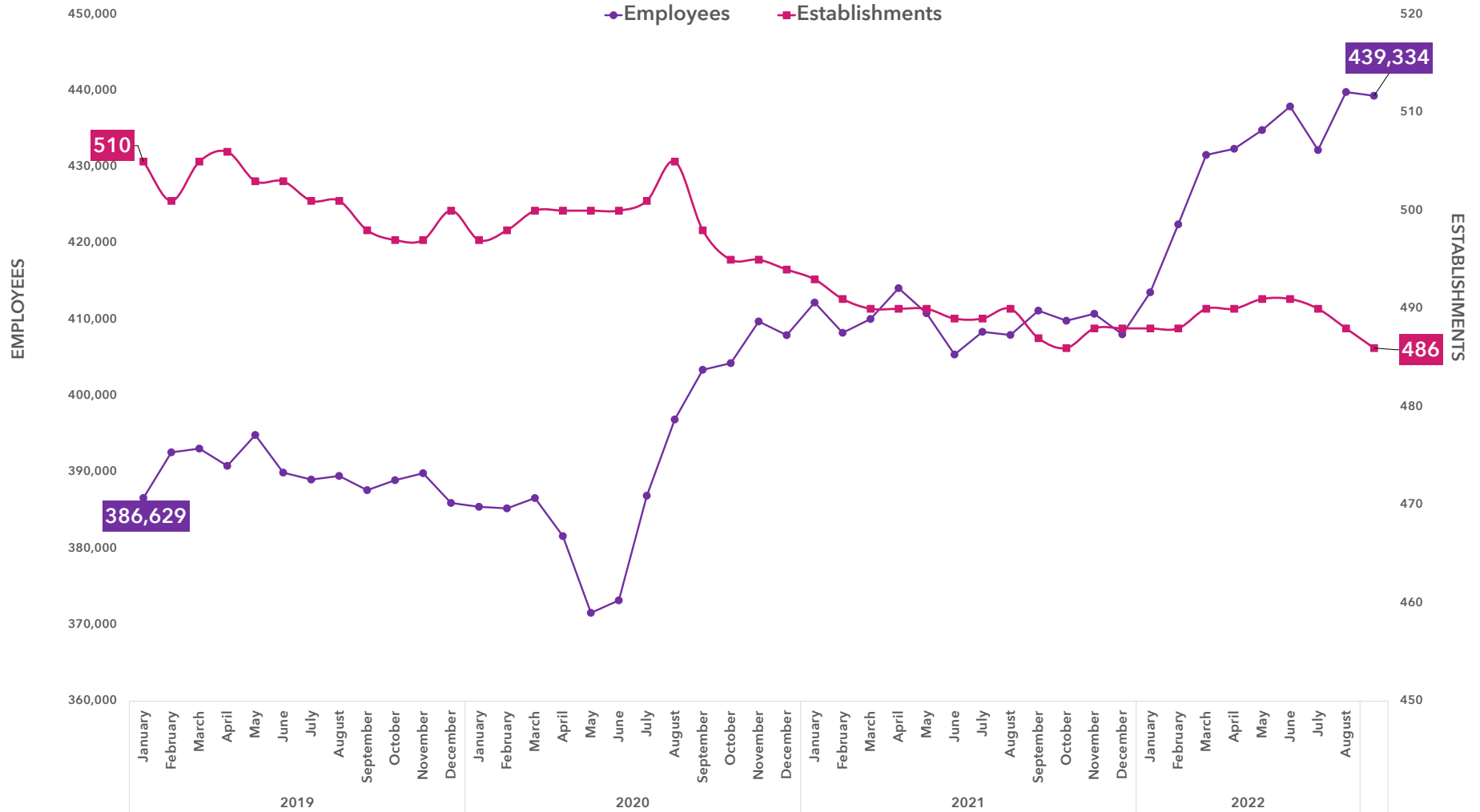

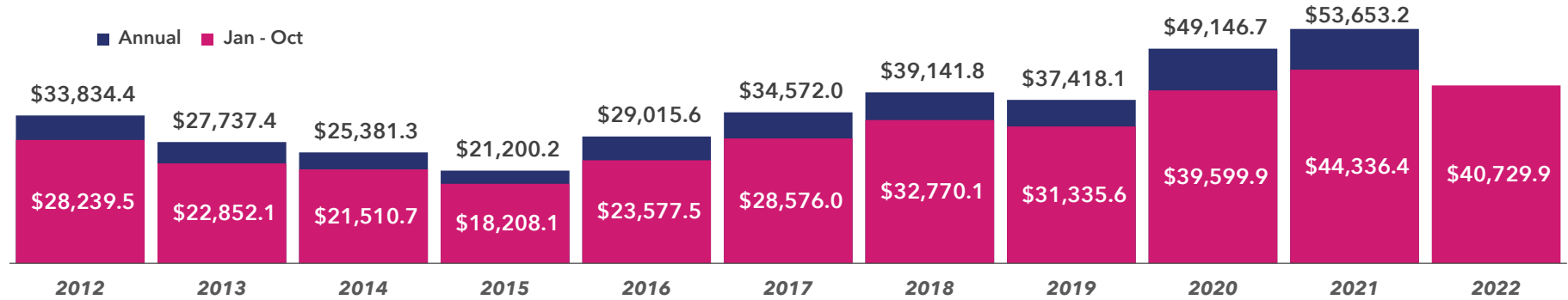

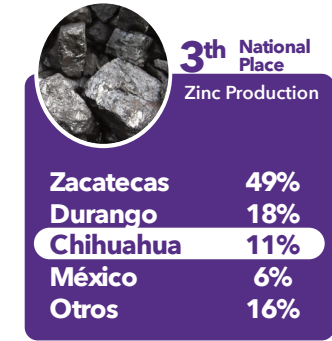
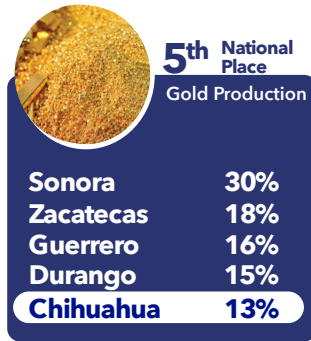
## PRODUCTION VALUE OF THE MAIN METALS

2012 TO OCTOBER 2022 - FIGURES IN MILLIONS OF PESOS

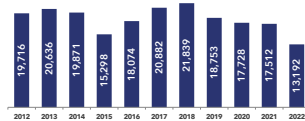

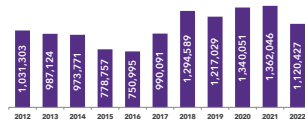

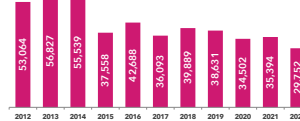

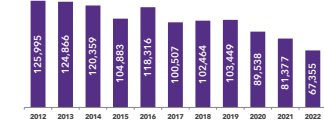

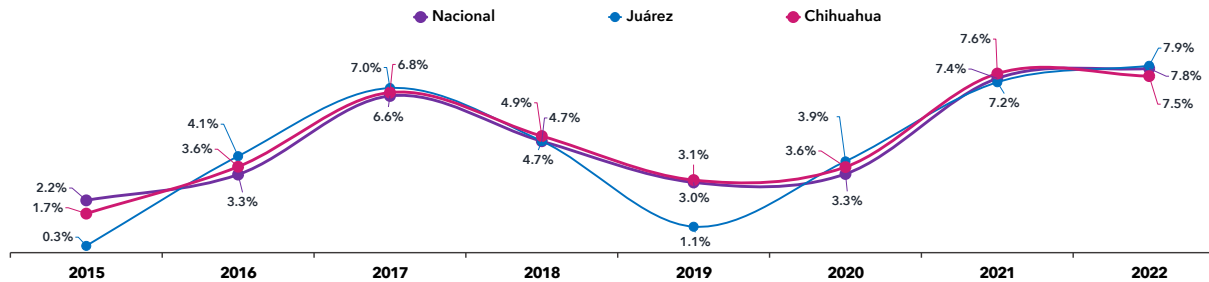

## ANNUAL INFLATION 2015 - 2022 UP TO NOVEMBER



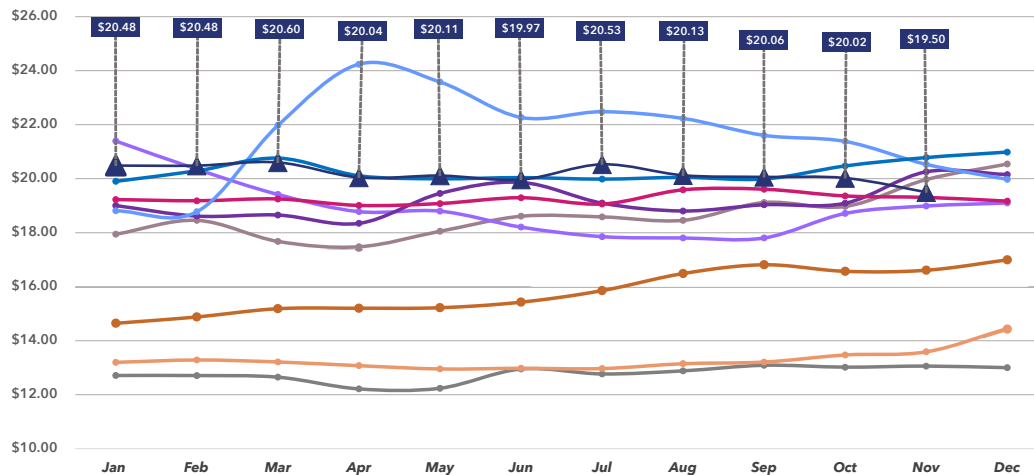

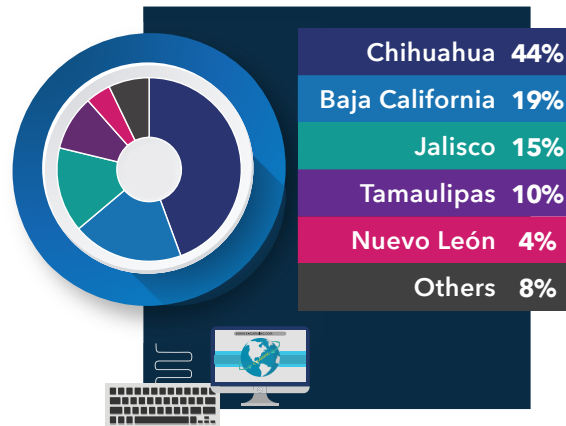

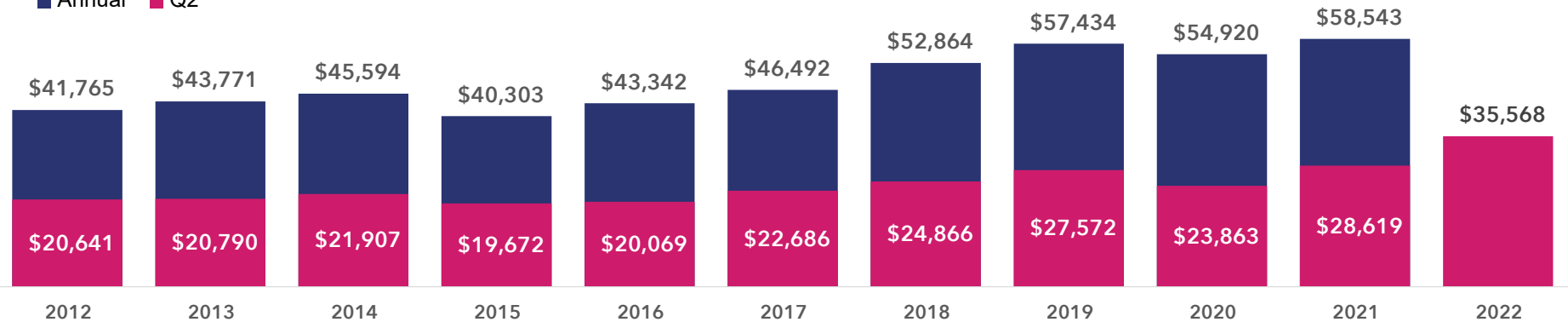

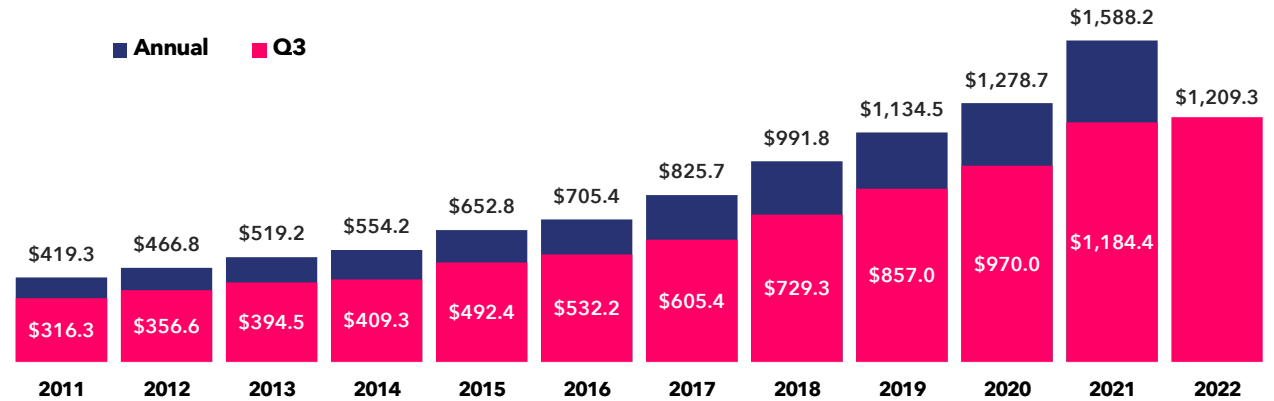

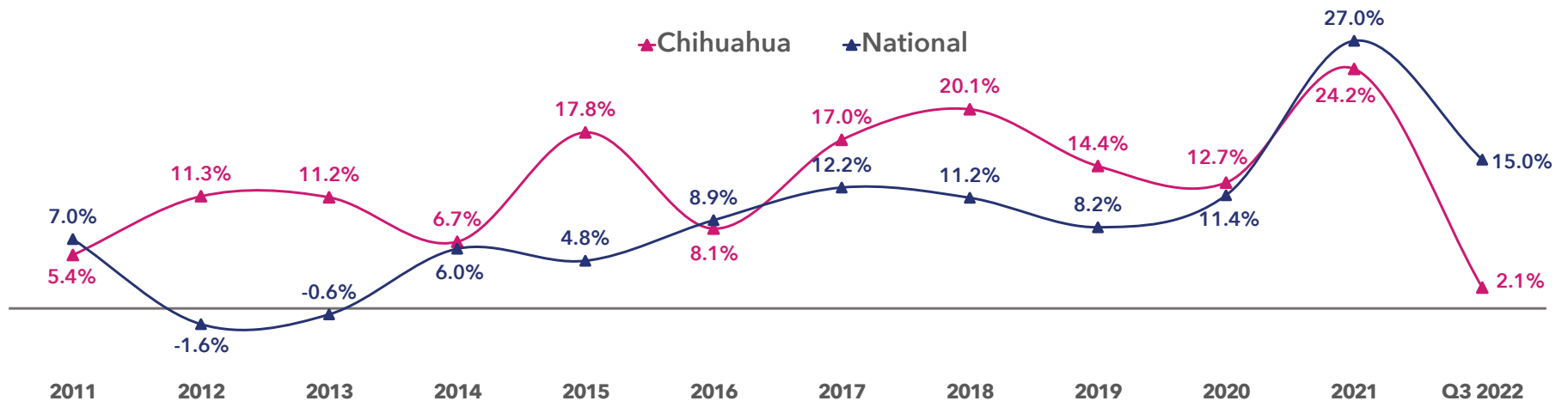

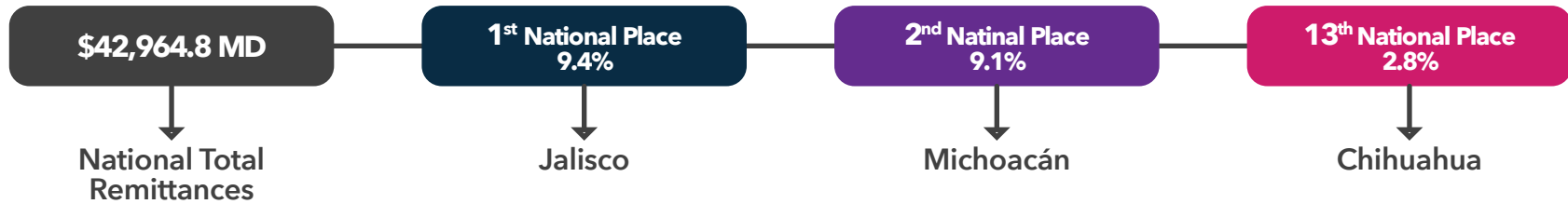

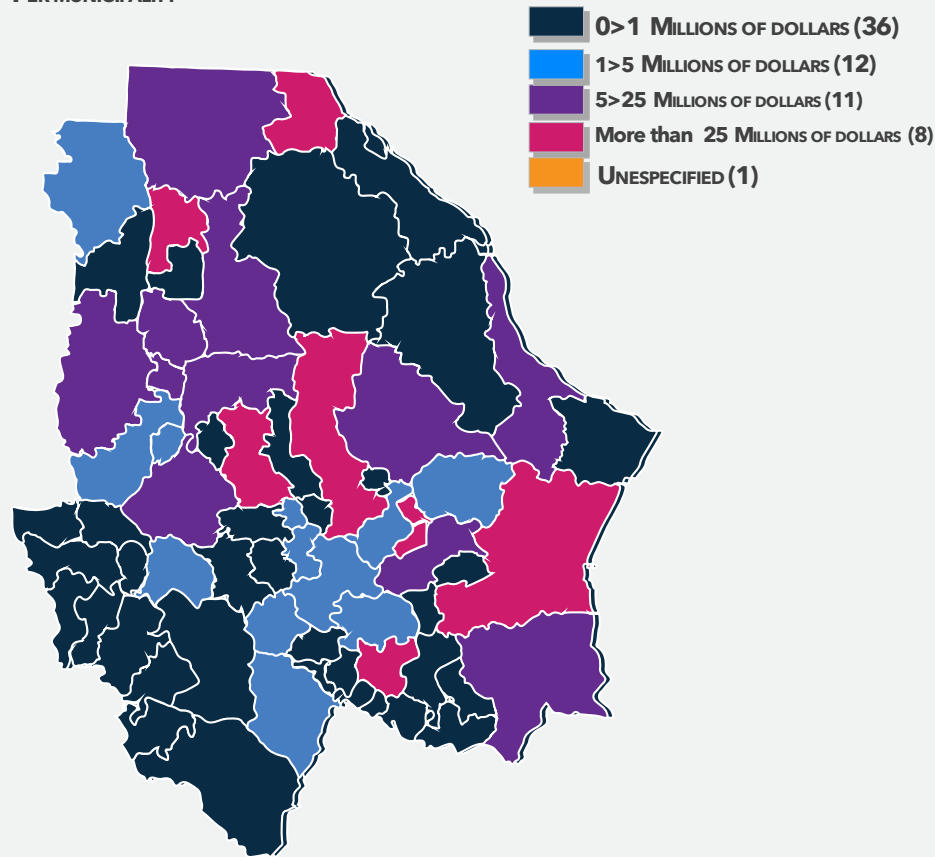


## FAMILY REMITTANCE INCOME

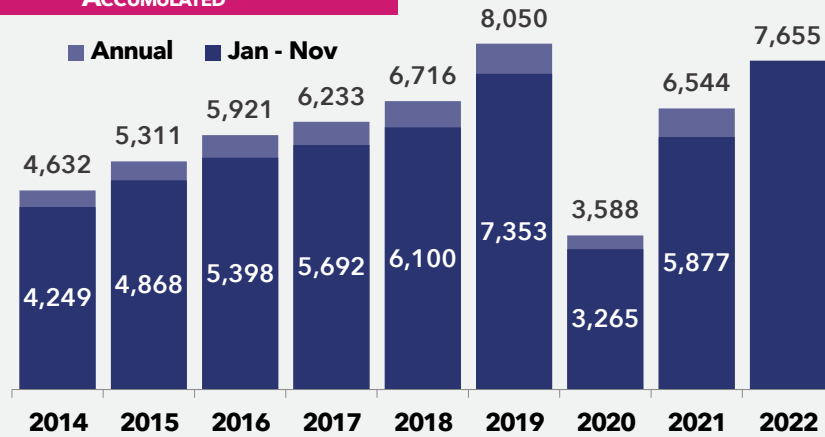

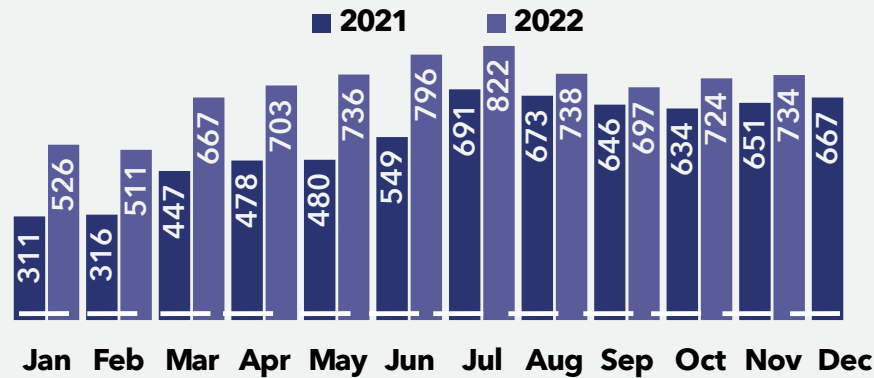
## NUMBER OF VISITORS IN THE STATE

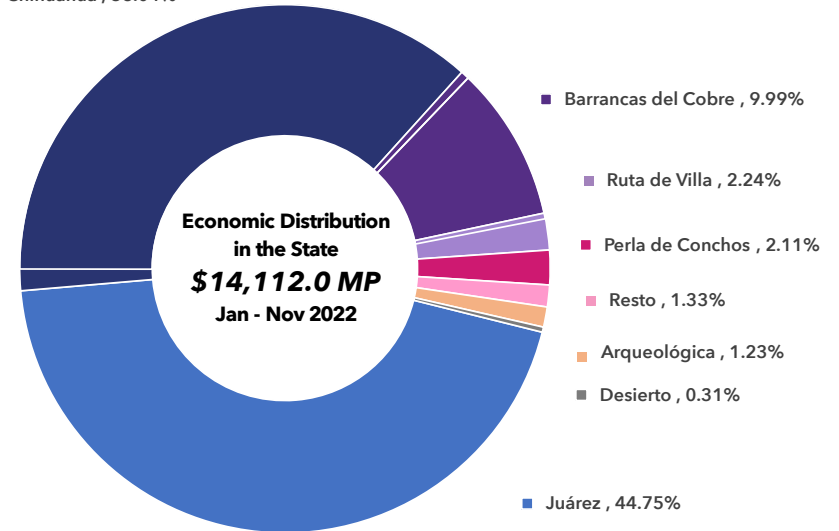

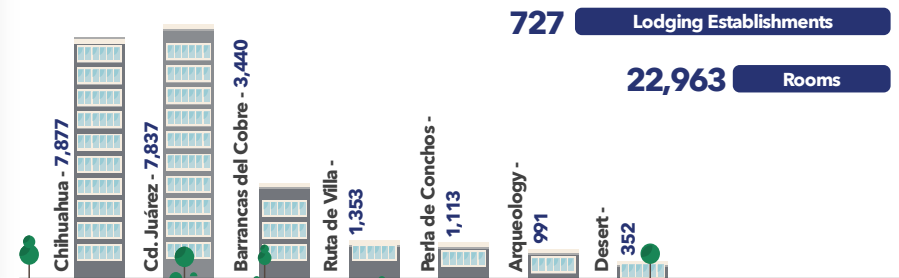
BY TOURISTIC REGION - FIGURES IN MILLIONS OF PESOS

## ROOMS BY TOURISTIC REGION

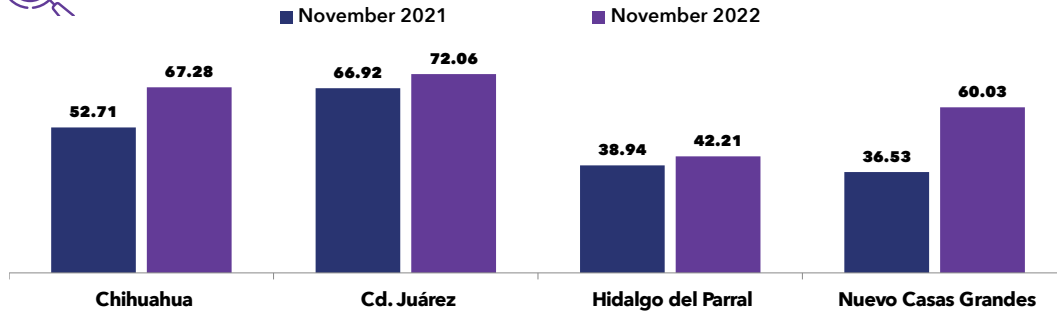

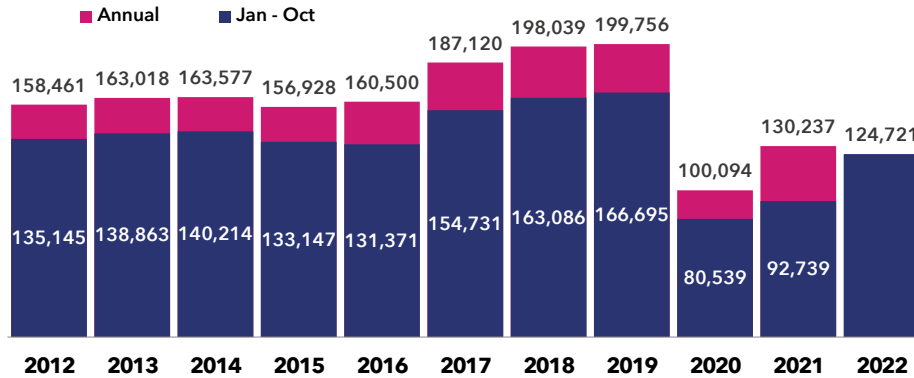

2012 TO OCTOBER 2022

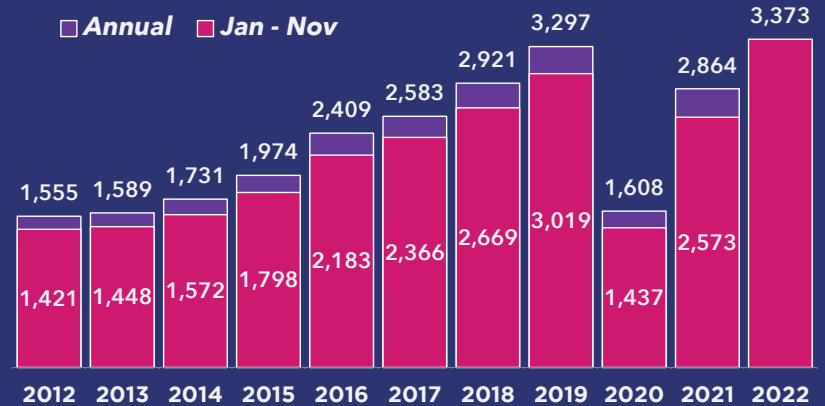

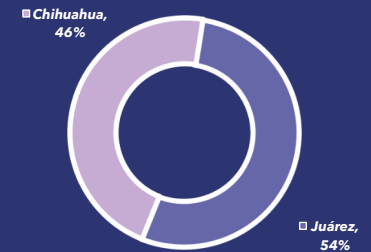


## AIRPORT TRAFFIC
