



Q4 2022










#### **EMPLOYMENT AND OCCUPATION ON THE MEXICO NORTHERN BORDER STATES** Q4 2022





### POPULATION EMPLOYED BY COMPANY SIZE




# **EMPLOYED POPULATION**

### **CHIHUAHUA STATE EMPLOYMENT**



During the fourth quarter of 2022, the **Economically Active Population** (EAP) stood at **1.86 million people**, which represented 63% of the population aged 15 years and over. In the same period, a total of **1.82 million people** were **employed in the formal and informal sectors**.







#### GDP PER CAPITA PER STATE NUMBERS IN CURRENT PESOS





**GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT VARIATION** 



NUMBERS IN CONSTANT PESOS AT 2013 PRICES - 2012 TO Q4 2022








GROSS PRODUCTION BY COMPANY SIZE



ANNUAL PERCENTAGE CHANGE - AVERAGE AS OF Q4 2022 SEASONALLY ADJUSTED SERIES




### **ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN CHIHUAHUA**




### **FDI BY SECTOR**




### MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY AND EXPORT SERVICES

To March 2023, the number of IMMEX employees grew 2.46%, **10,618** more jobs than in the same month of 2022.





#### **STATE MINING PRODUCTION VALUE**


MARCH 2023 - MAIN METALS FIGURES IN MILLIONS PESOS



2016 TO APRIL 2023. - FIGURES IN PESOS



In April 2023, Juarez presented an annual inflation of 5.7% lower than it was during the same period in 2022 by 2.4%. The value for Chihuahua is 5.7% lower than in April 2022, which was 7.8%; while the national inflation is 6.3%.




### **TOTAL EXPORTS IN THE STATE OF CHIHUAHUA**

TO Q4 2022 - PERCENTAGE PARTICIPATION







Remittances consist of all current transfers, in cash or in kind, from non-resident households to resident households, generated mainly by the migration of people to foreign economies or vice versa.


#### **REMITTANCE INCOME IN THE STATE**



### NUMBER OF VISITORS IN THE STATE


2014 A 2022- FIGURES IN THOUSANDS OF VISITORS

This update made possible to determine the category, which consists of 1 to 5 stars. As a result, a change was made to the current methodology, which consists in separating visitors who stay in 3-5 starlodging that will be considered as tourists, and those who stay in 1-2 star lodging will be considered as visitors. This change was made in order to have a more accurate number of visitors and the economic distribution they generate in each region.






