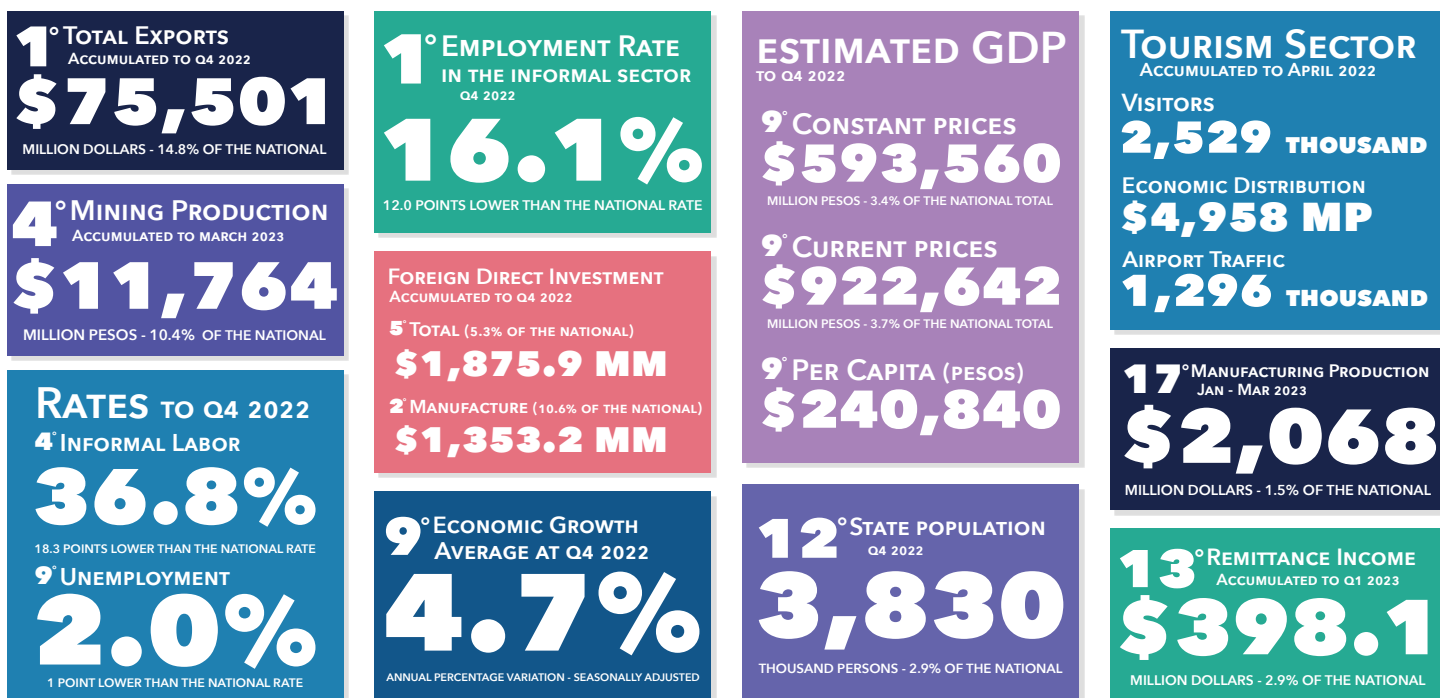

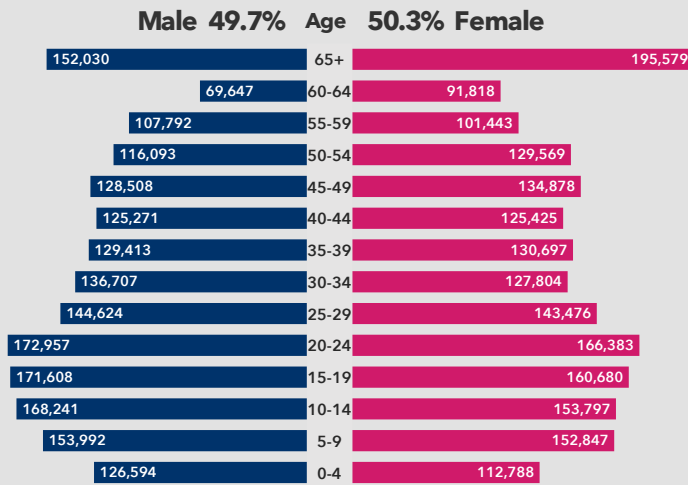

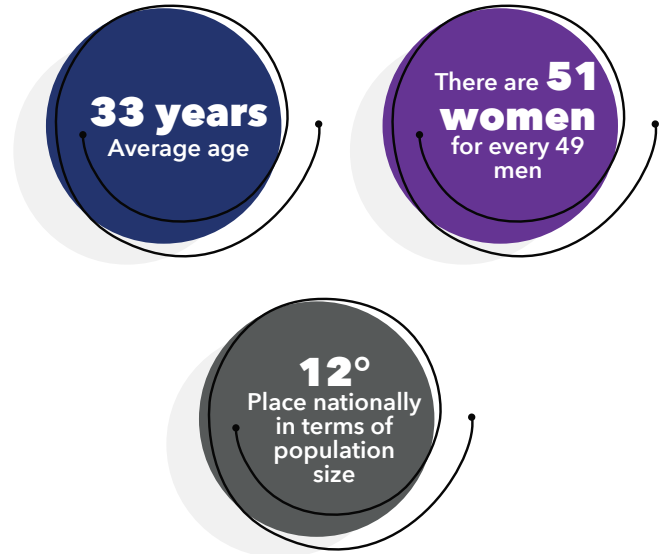
STATE POPULATION PYRAMID Q4 2022

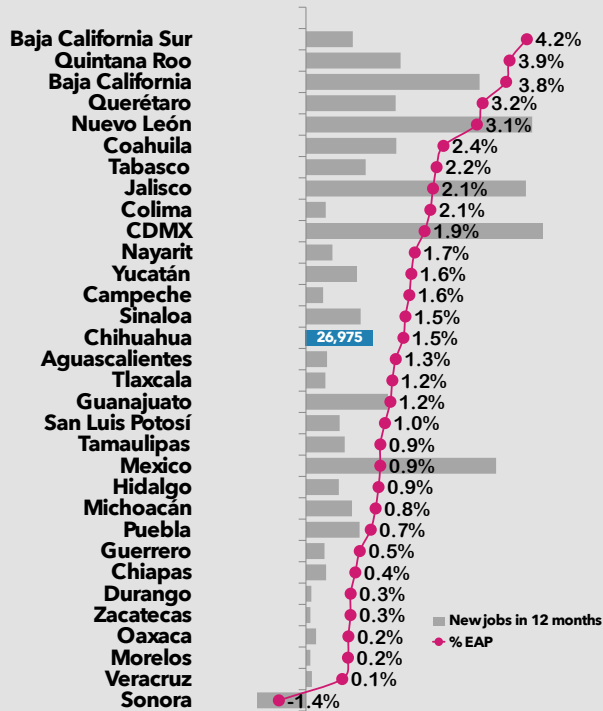

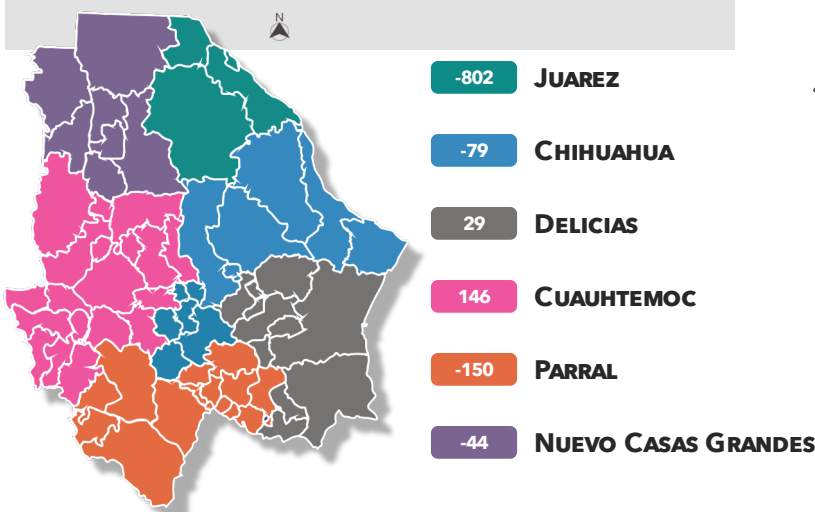

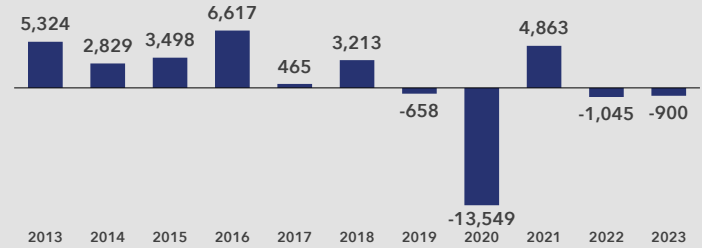

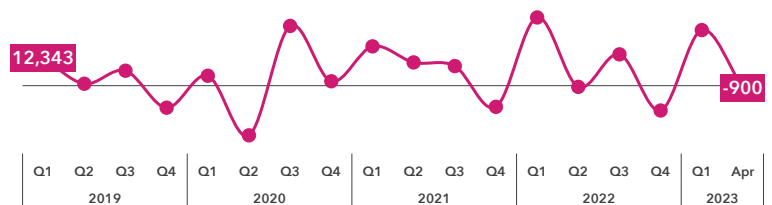

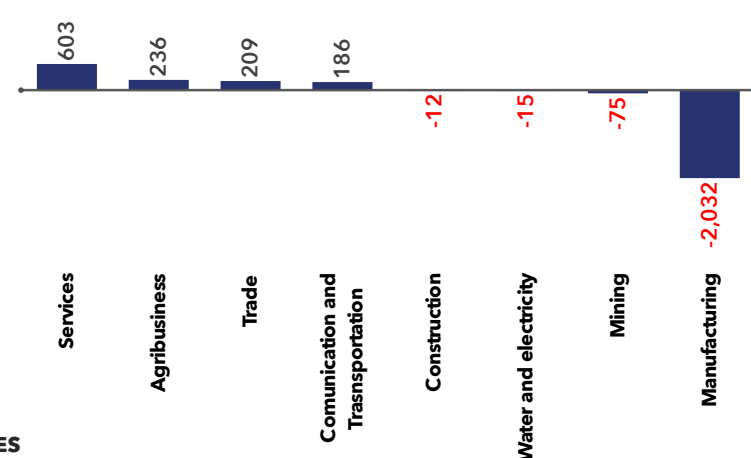

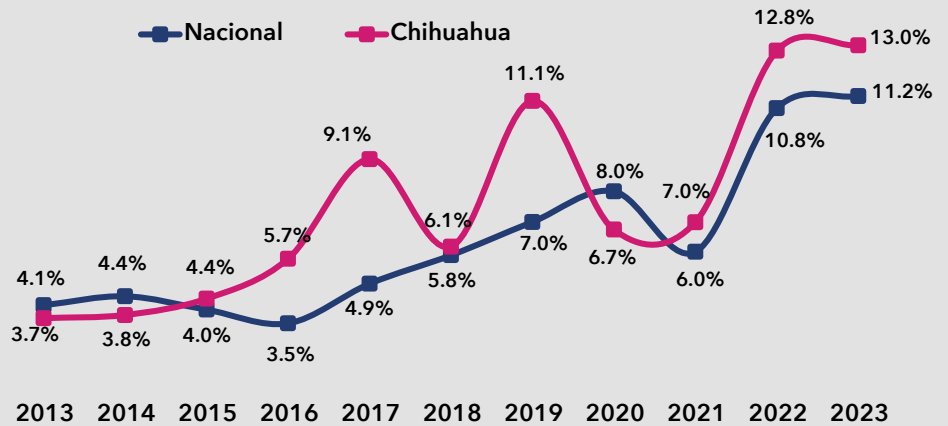

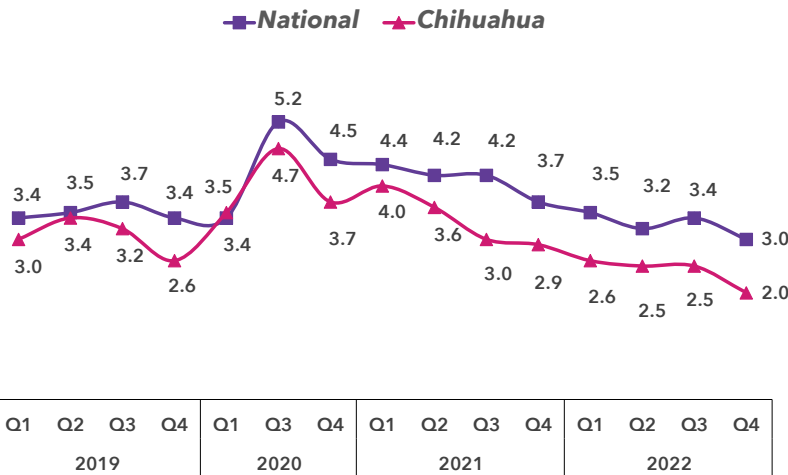

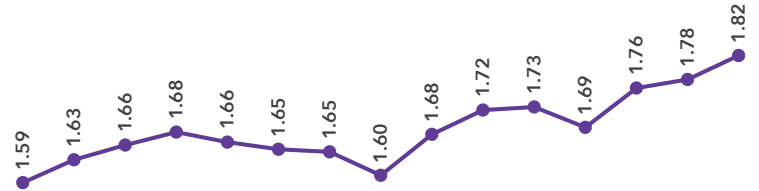

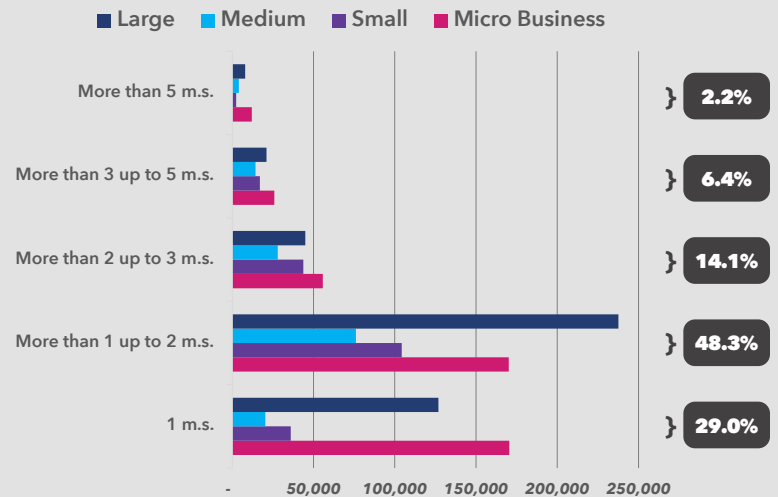

SALARY OF POPULATION EMPLOYED BY COMPANY SIZE

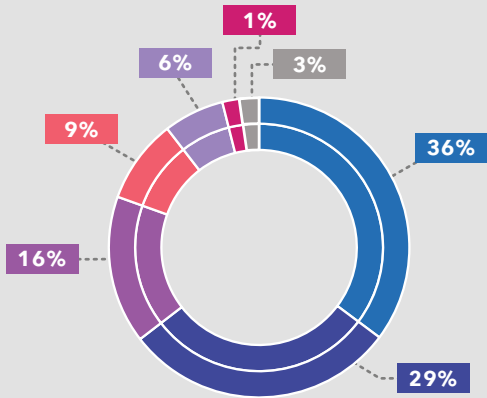

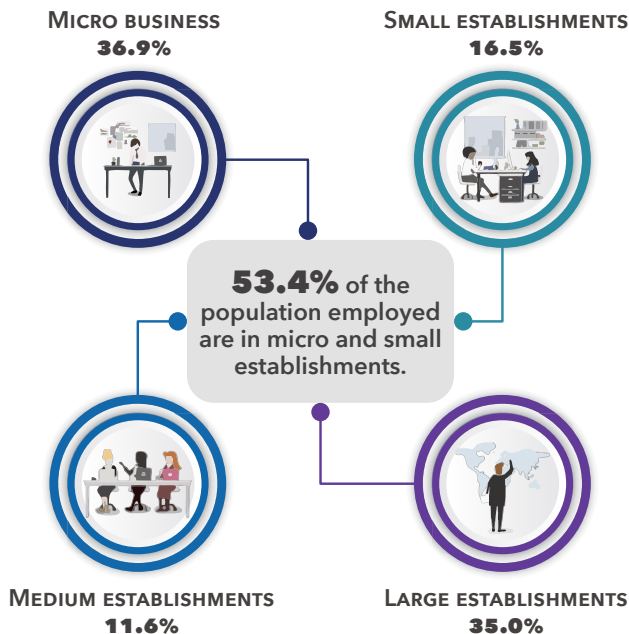
POPULATION EMPLOYED BY ECONOMIC ACTIVITY SECTOR Q4 2022

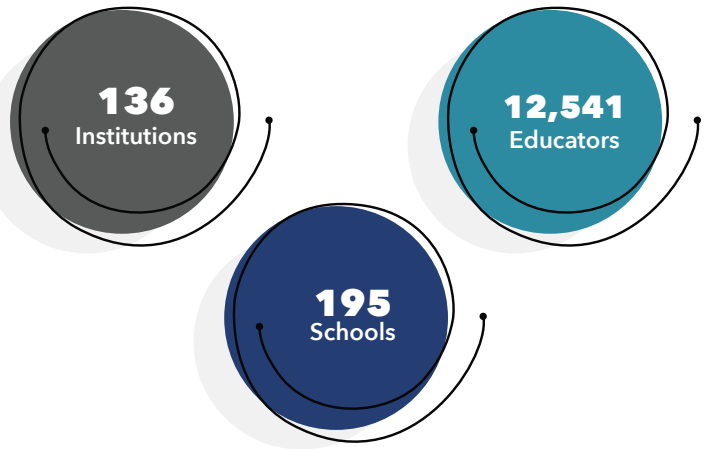

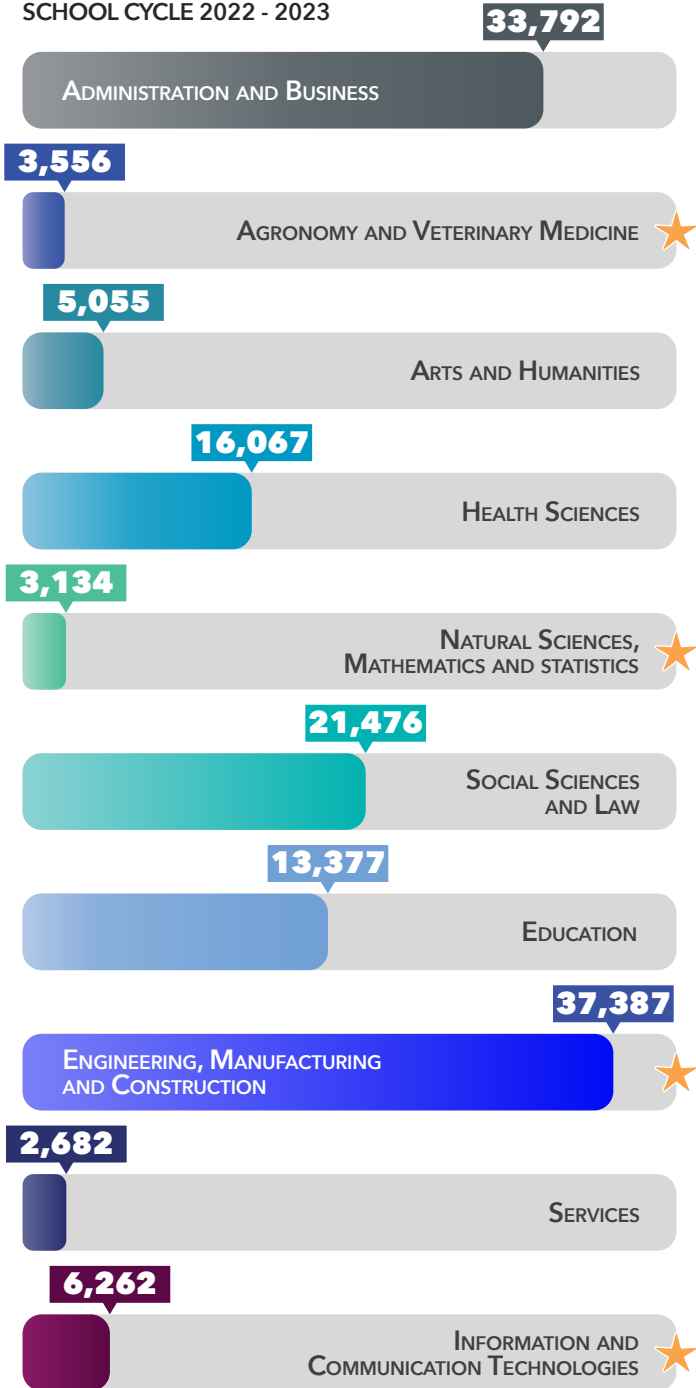

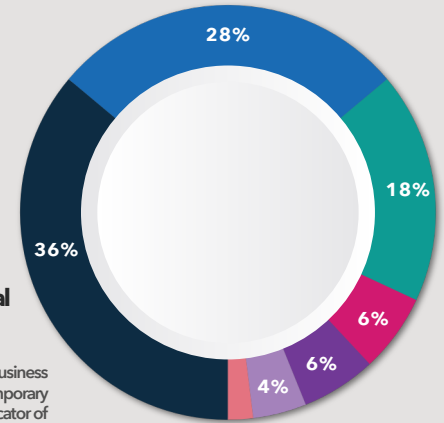

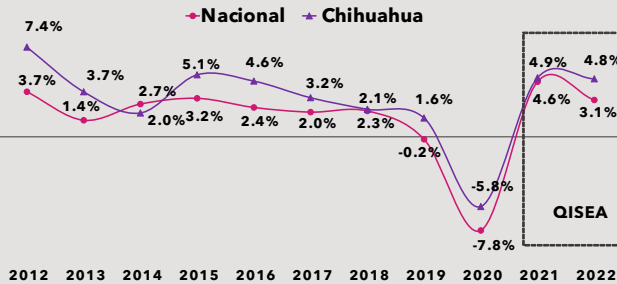

2012 TO Q4 2022*



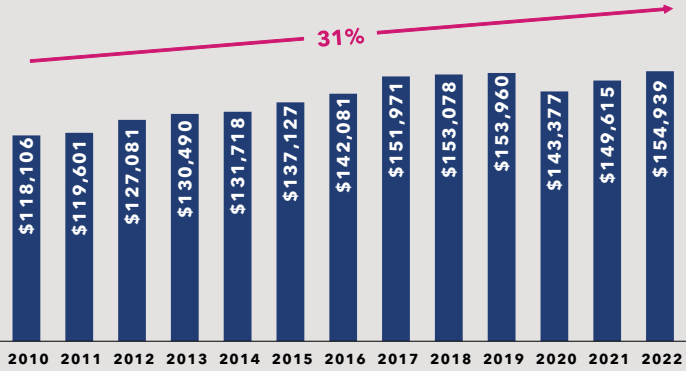

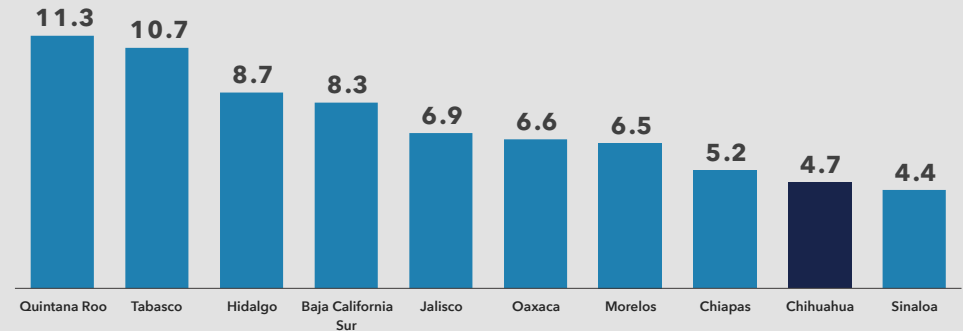

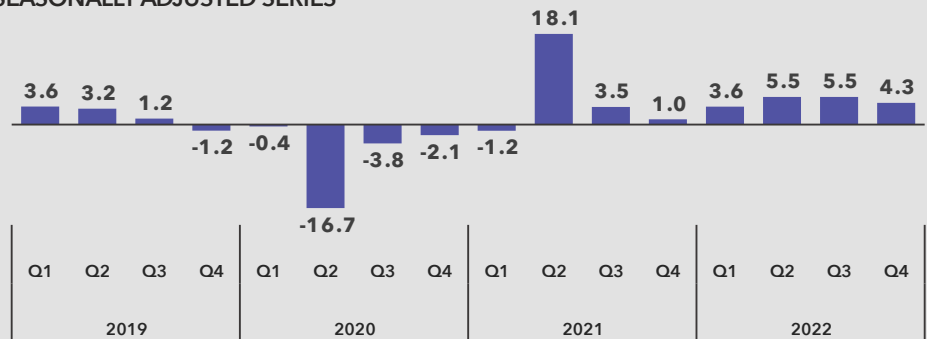
AVERAGE ECONOMIC GROWTH BY STATE

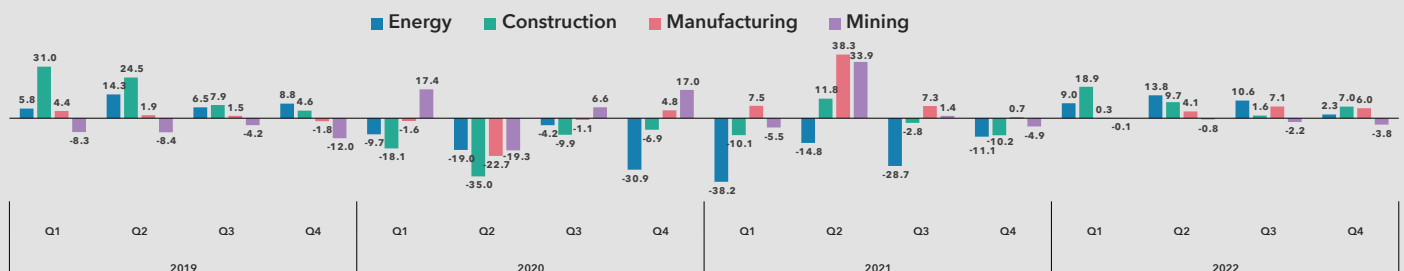


ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN CHIHUAHUA

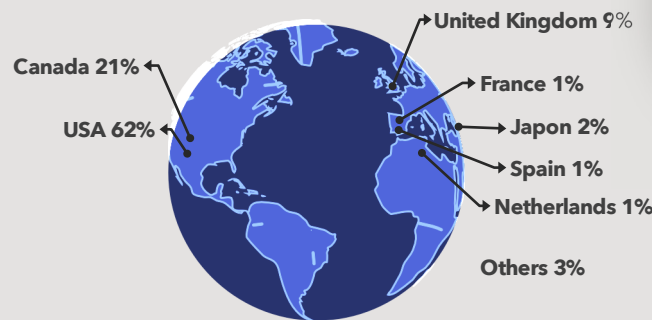

FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT ORIGIN IN THE STATE OF CHIHUAHUA - Q4 2022

Based on the Federal Secretary of Economy data, Mexico registered 35.3 billion dollars in Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) as of the fourth quarter of 2022.

During the same period, Chihuahua received 1,875.9 million dollars, contributing 5.3% of the national total, and the state is ranked 5th as the recipient of FDI after Mexico City, Nuevo Leon, Jalisco and Baja California.

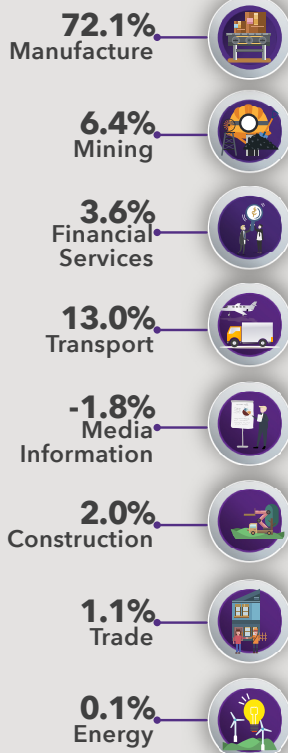

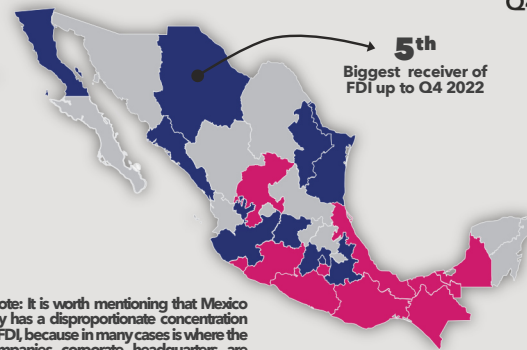

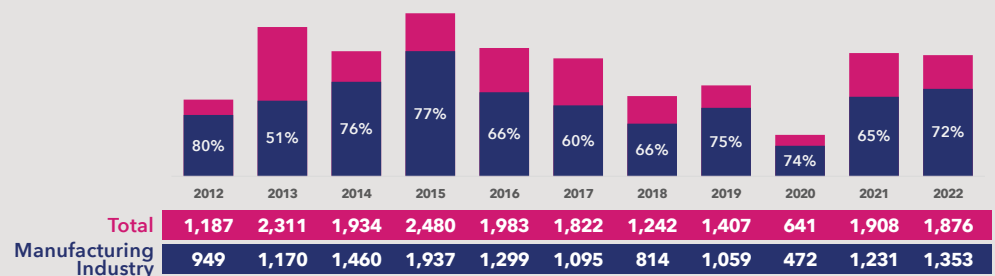

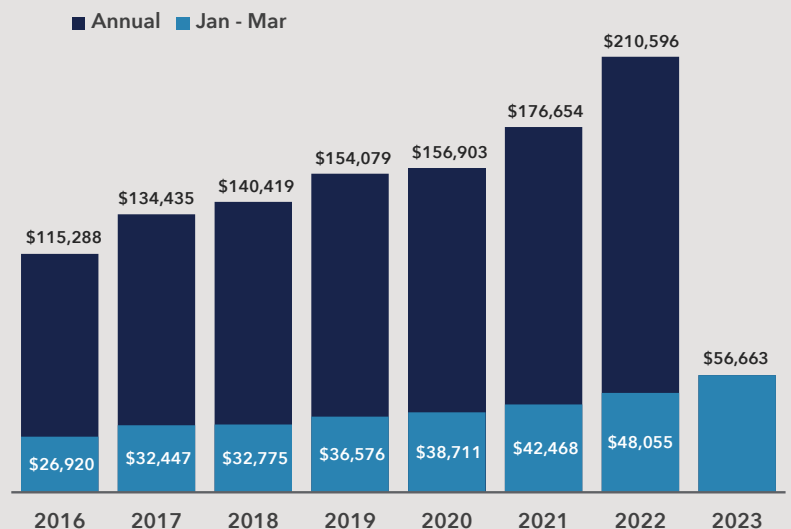

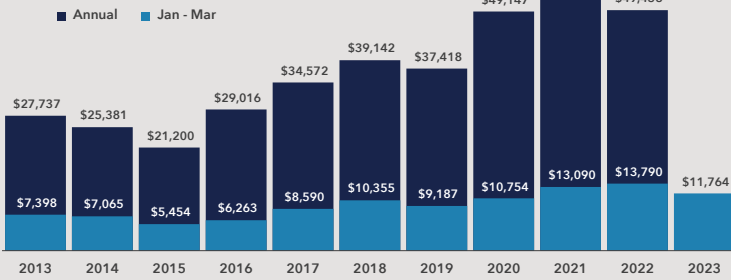

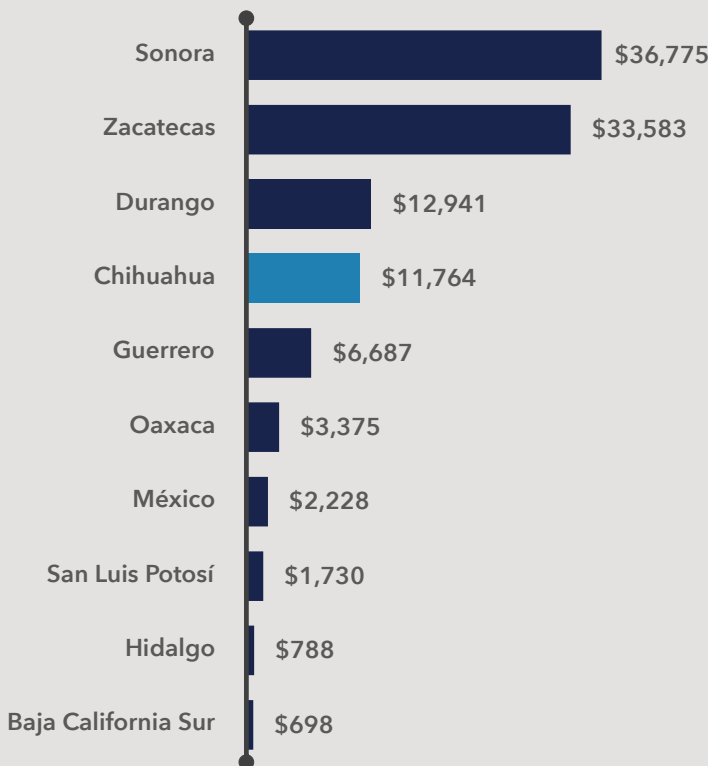

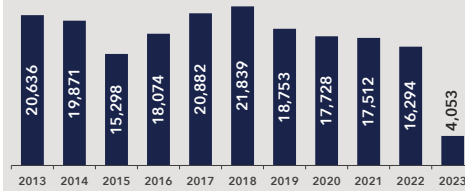

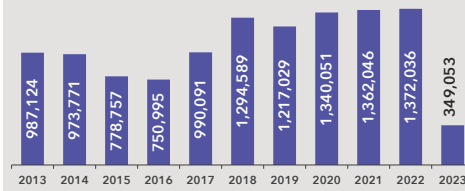

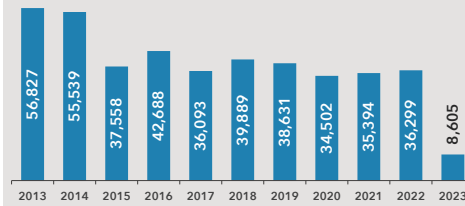

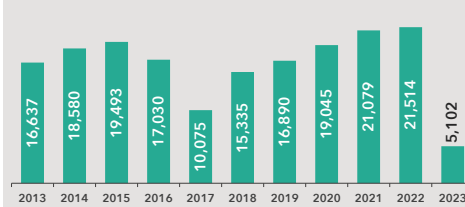

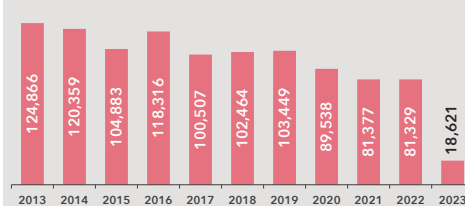

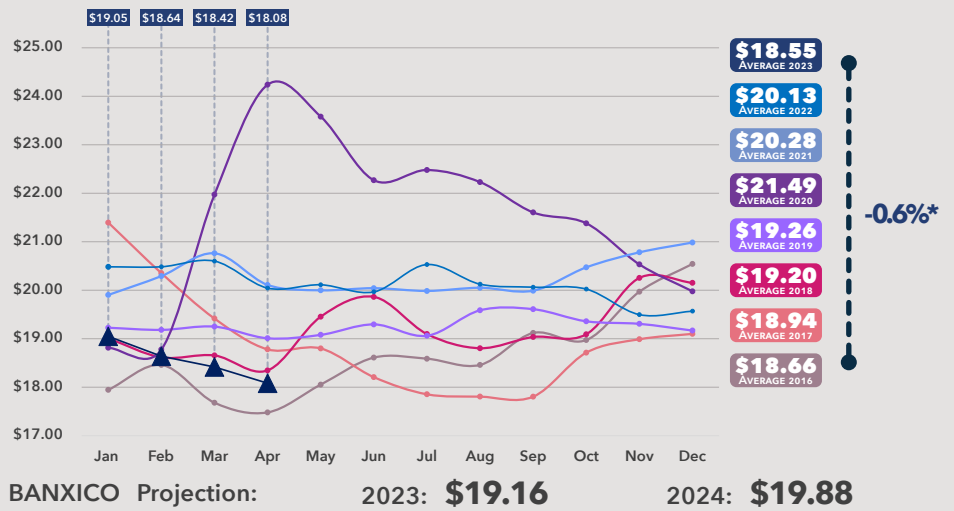

MONTHLY AVERAGE EXCHANGE RATE VARIATION 2016 TO APRIL 2023. - FIGURES IN PESOS

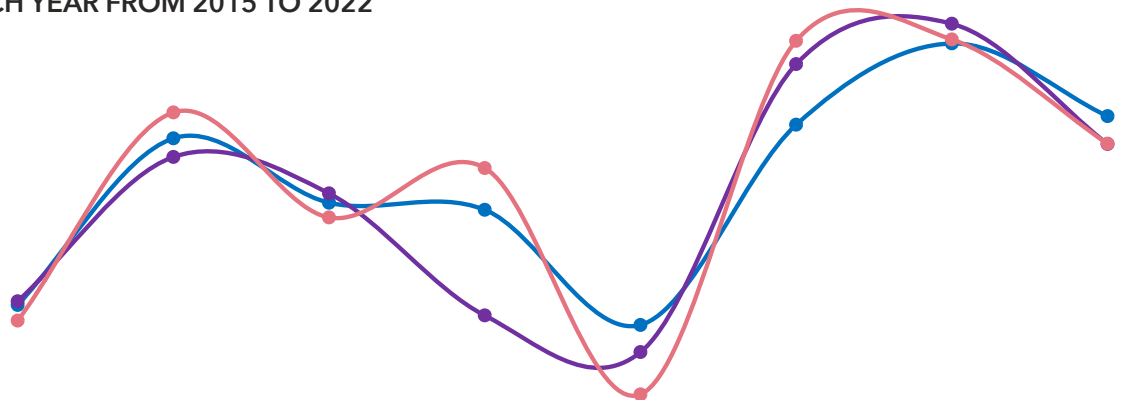

In April 2023, Juarez presented an annual inflation of 5.7% lower than it was during the same period in 2022 by 2.4%. The value for Chihuahua is 5.7% lower than in April 2022, which was 7.8%; while the national inflation is 6.3%.

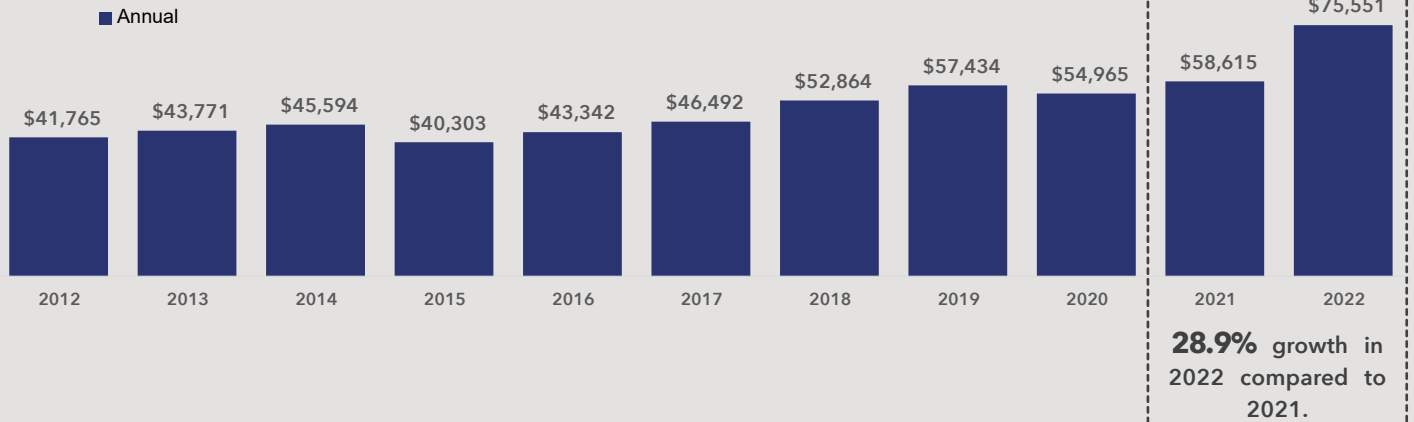

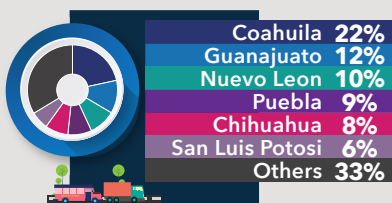

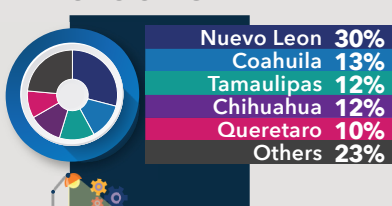
EXPORTS BY MAIN SUBSECTORS

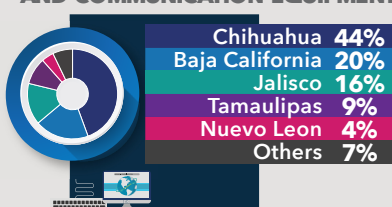

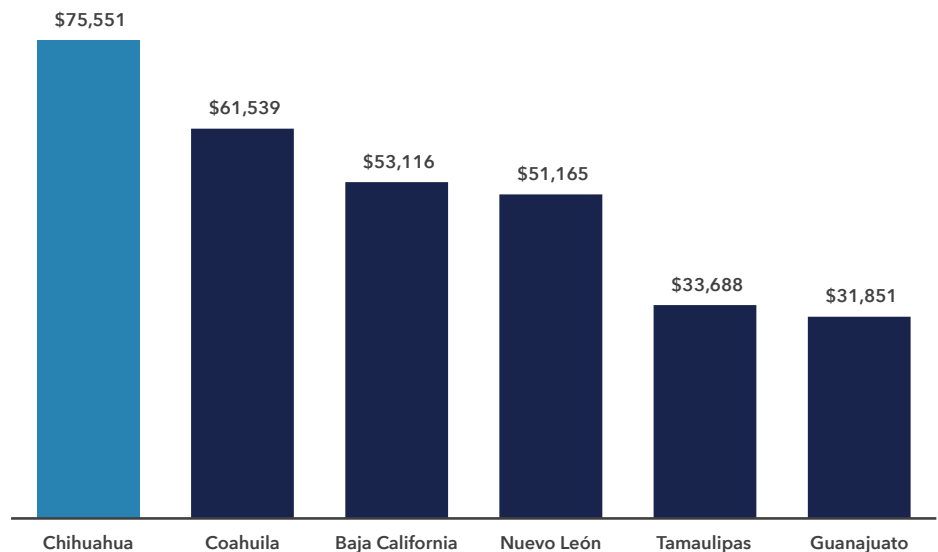

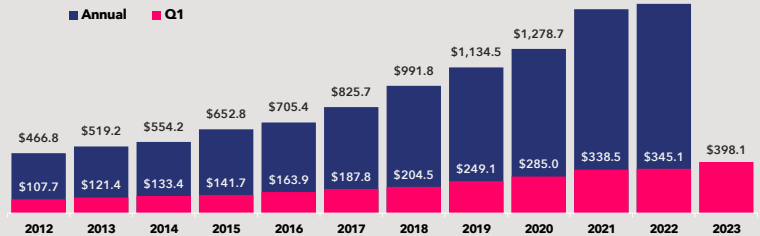

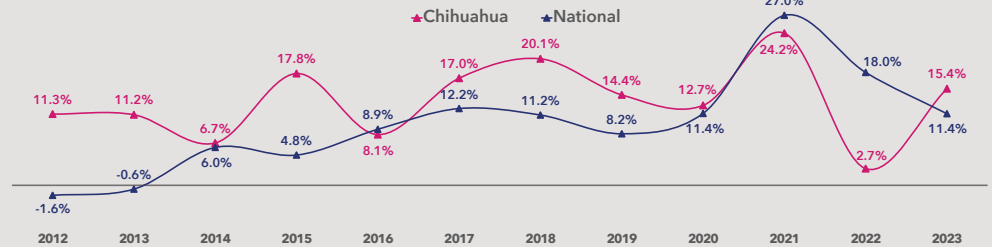

REMITTANCE INCOME IN THE STATE 2012 TO Q1 2023 - FIGURES IN MILLION DOLLARS

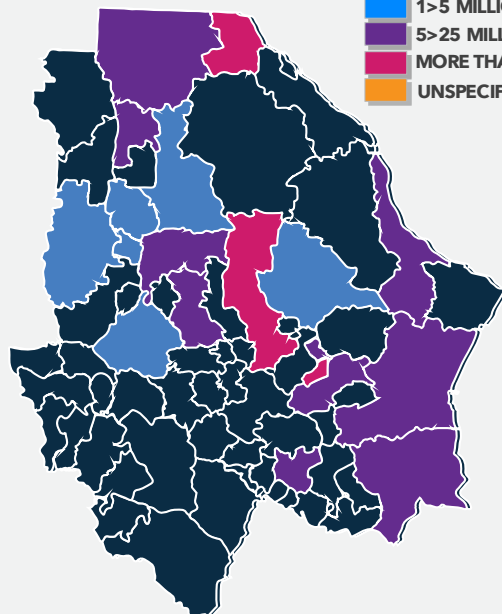

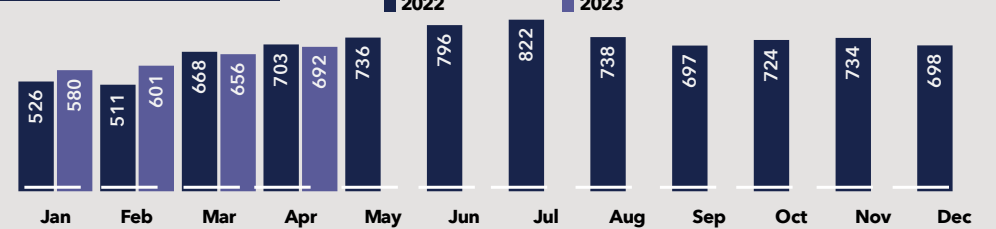

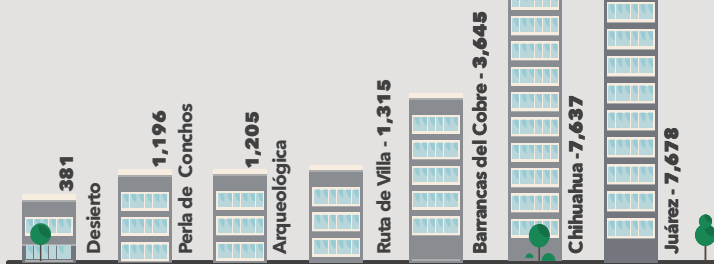

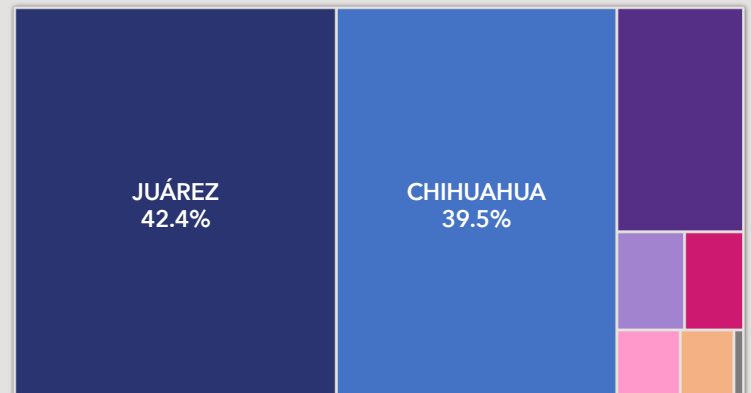

BY TOURISTIC REGION



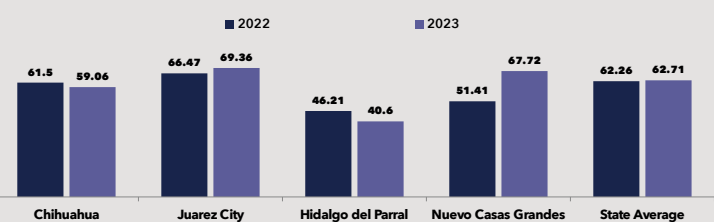

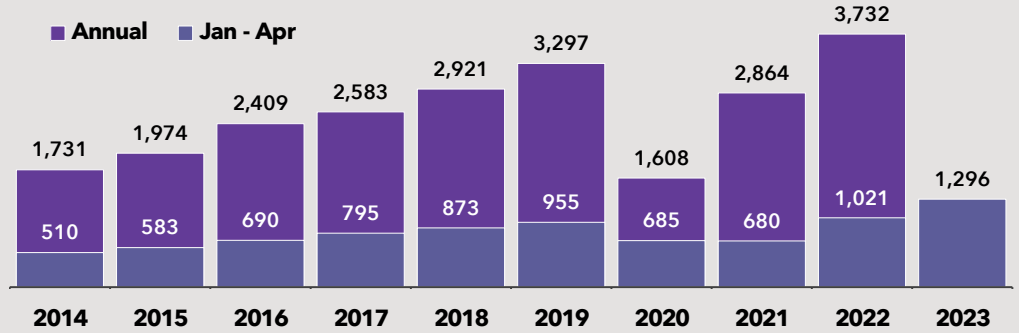

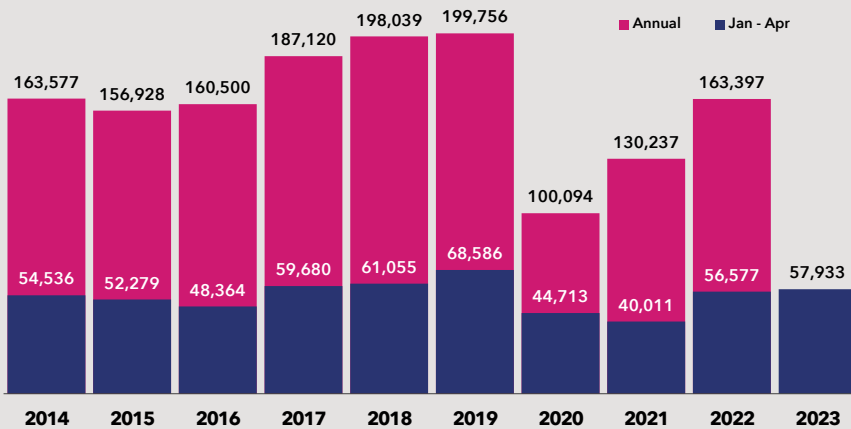

2014 TO MARCH 2023



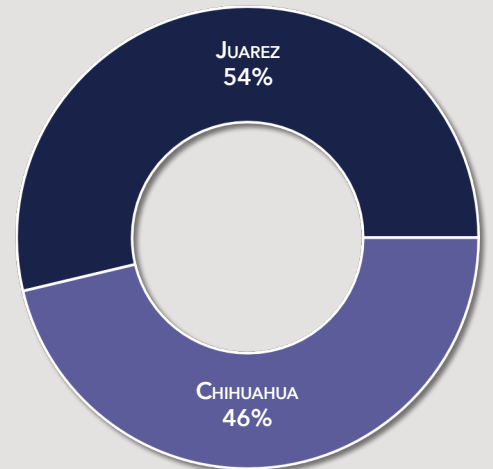
PASSENGERS TRAFFIC
