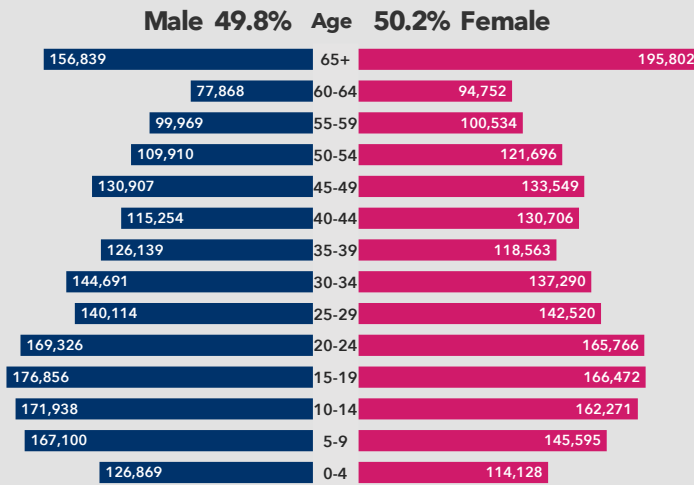

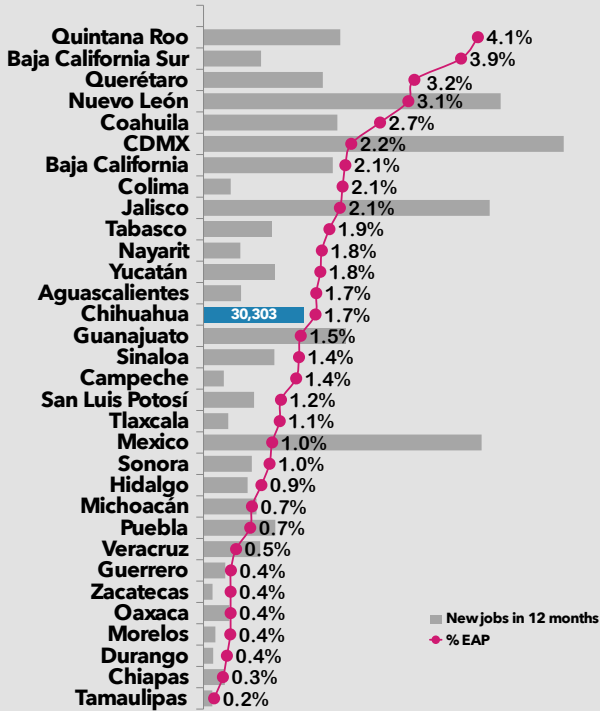

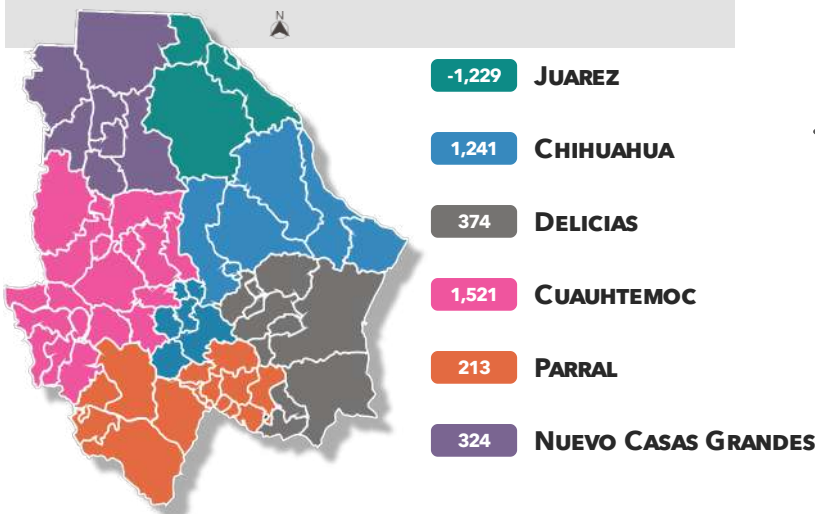

## GENERATED IN THE LAST 12 MONTHS BY STATE PROPORTIONALLY TO THE EAP\*



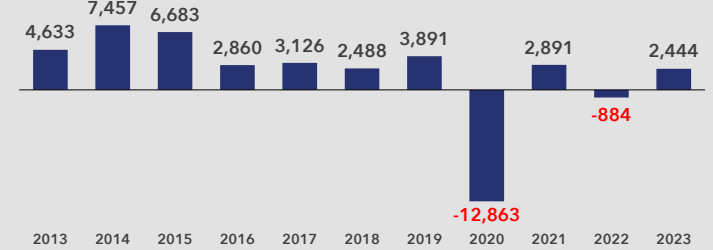
In the period from May 2022 to the same period of 2023, there is a growth of **30,303** jobs, being the state with the tenth place in jobs created as a proportion of the EAP.

## PER REGION (MAY 2023)



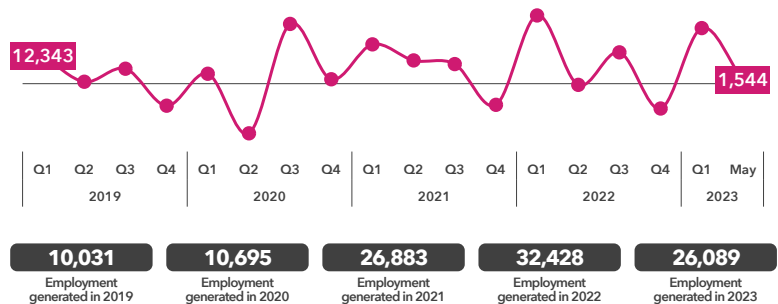

### ANNUAL COMPARISON MAY OF EACH YEAR

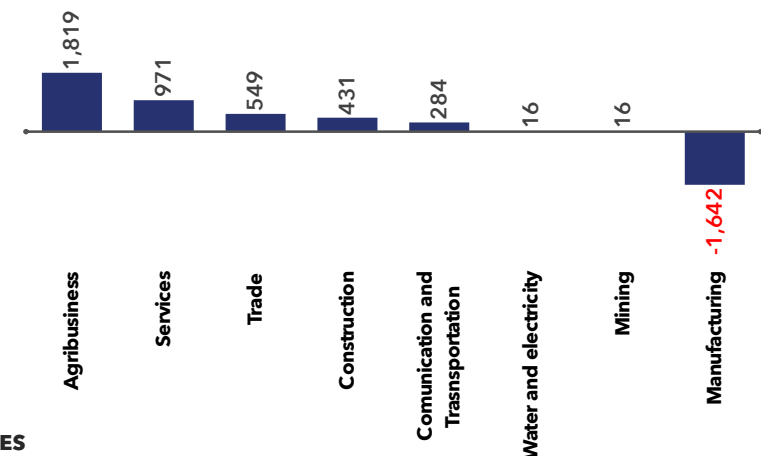

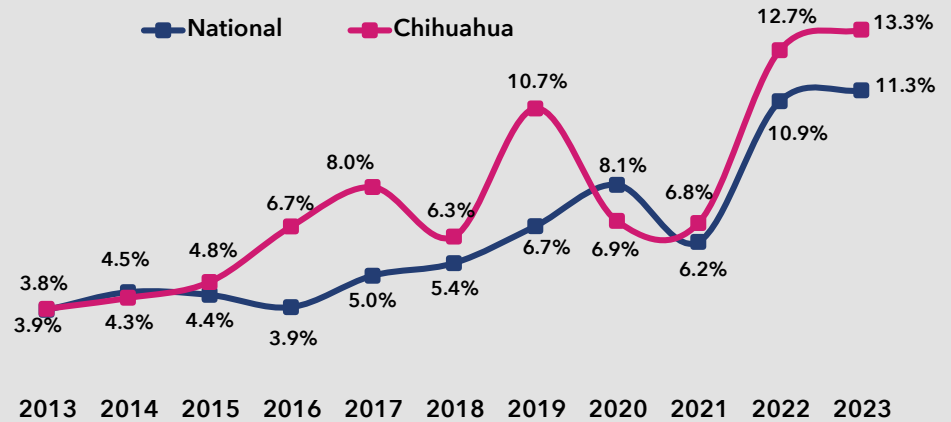

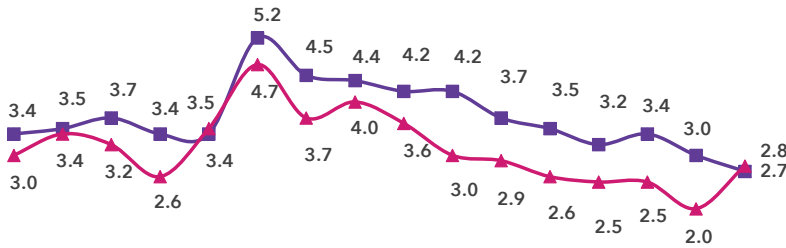

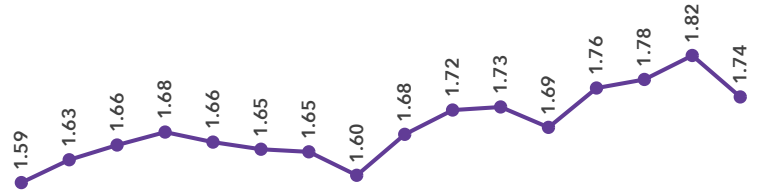

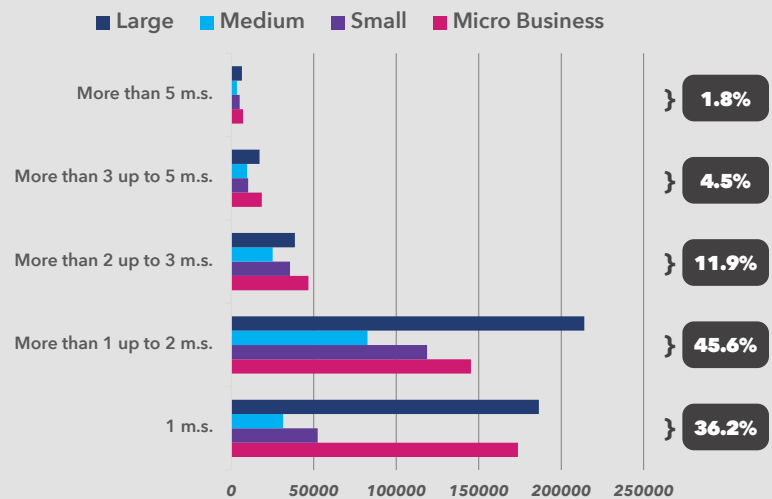

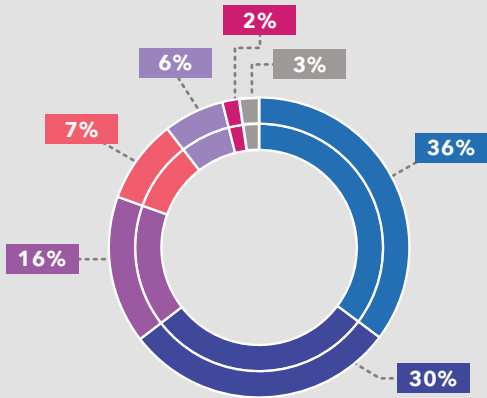

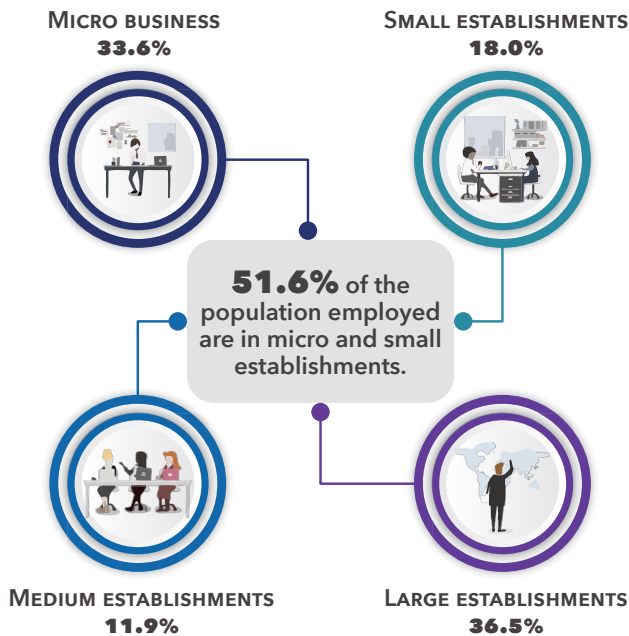

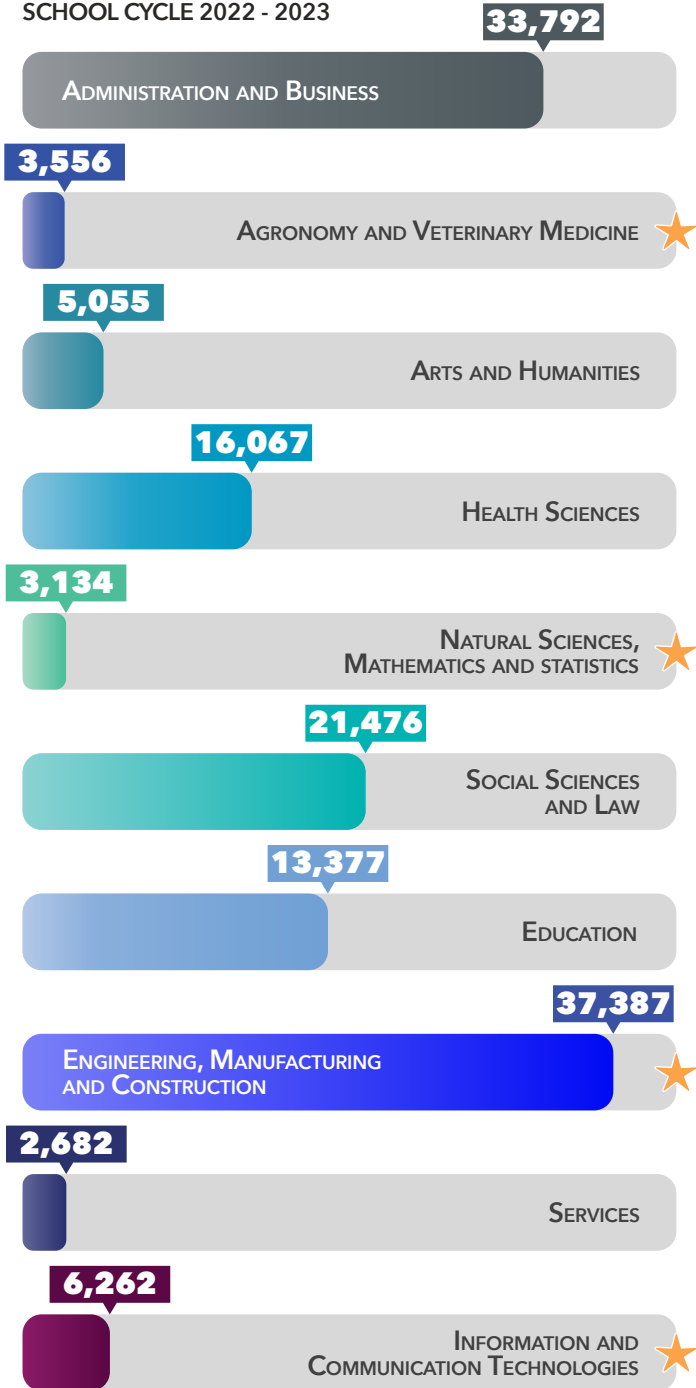

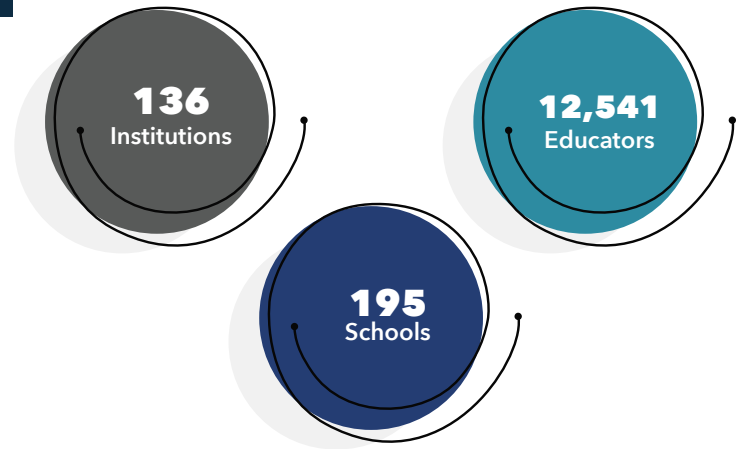
## SUPERIOR EDUCATION ENROLLMENT

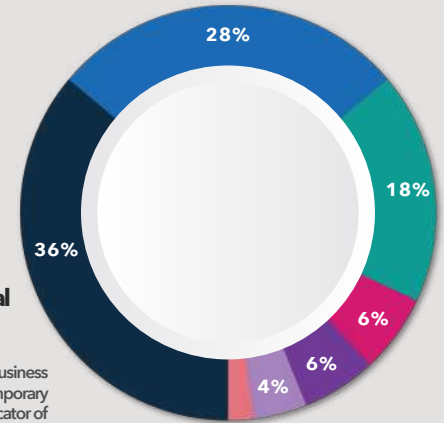

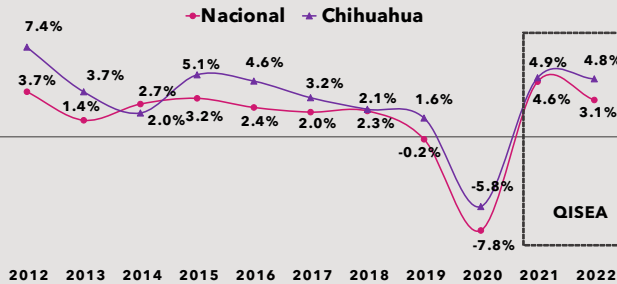

2012 TO Q4 2022\*



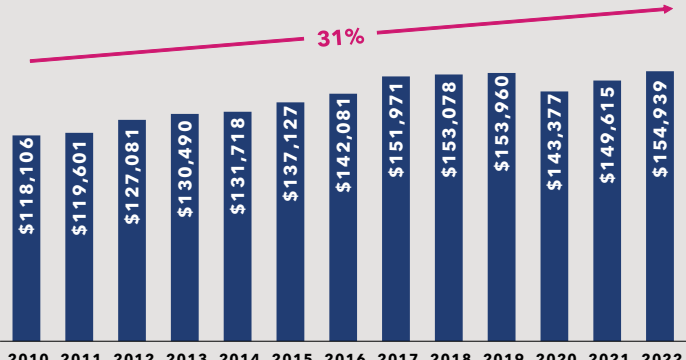

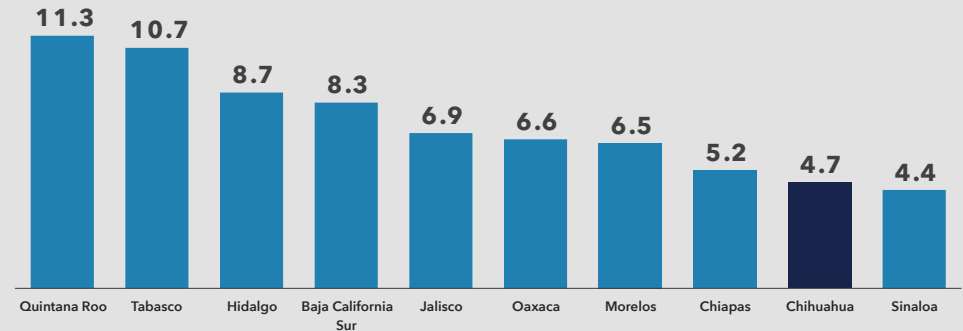

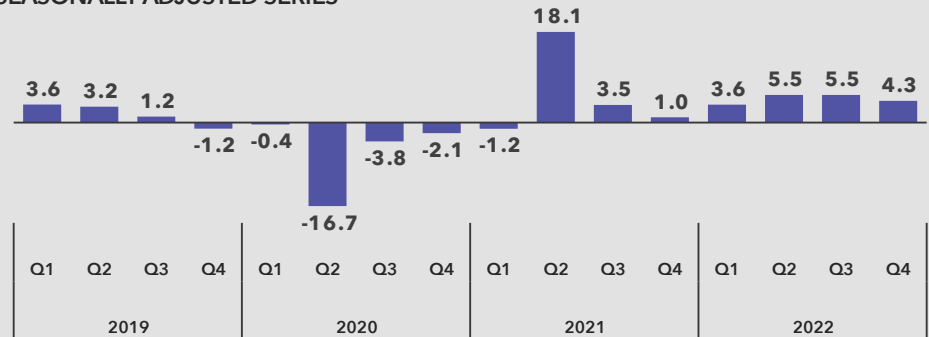
## AVERAGE ECONOMIC GROWTH BY STATE

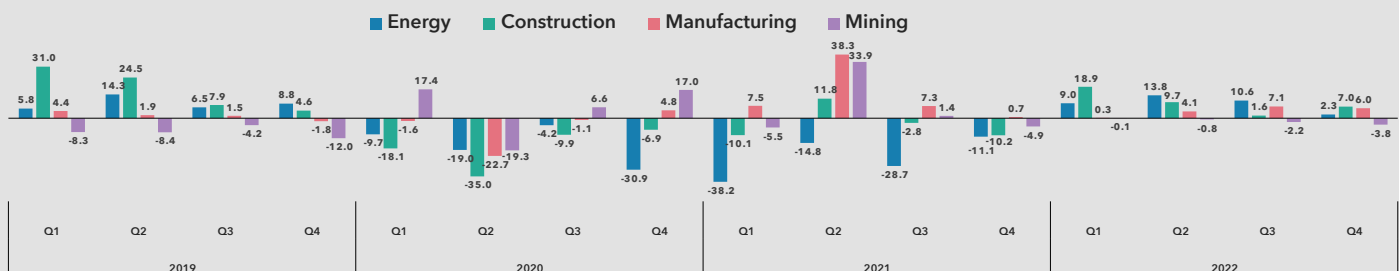


## ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN CHIHUAHUA

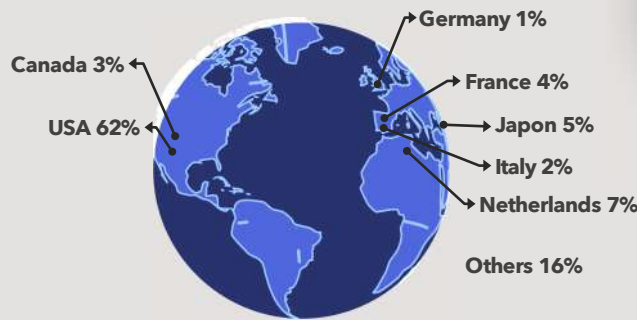

## FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT ORIGIN IN THE STATE OF CHIHUAHUA - Q1 2023

Based on the Federal Secretary of Economy data, Mexico registered 18.6 billion dollars in Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) as of the first quarter of 2023.

During the same period, Chihuahua received 562.4 million dollars, contributing 3.0% of the national total, and the state is ranked 8th as the recipient of FDI after Mexico City, Nuevo Leon, Jalisco, Puebla, Mexico State, Veracruz and Baja California.

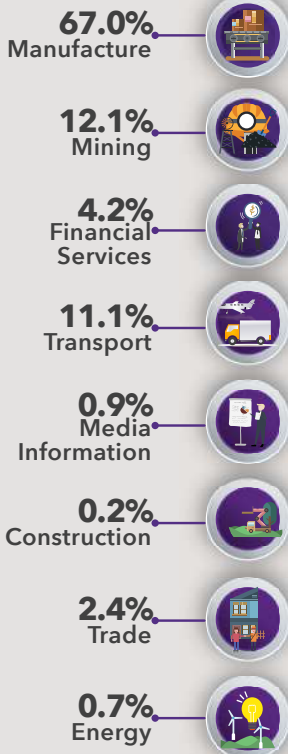

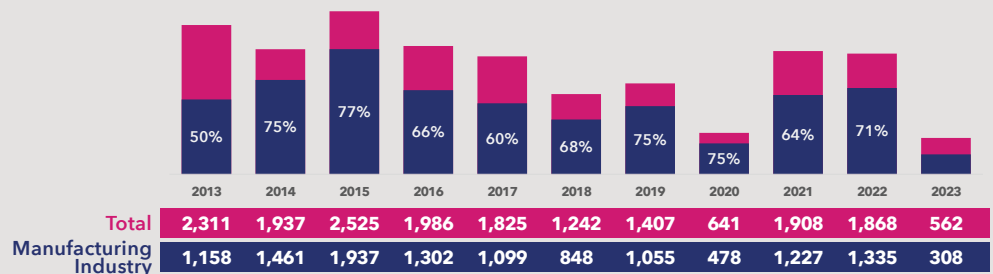

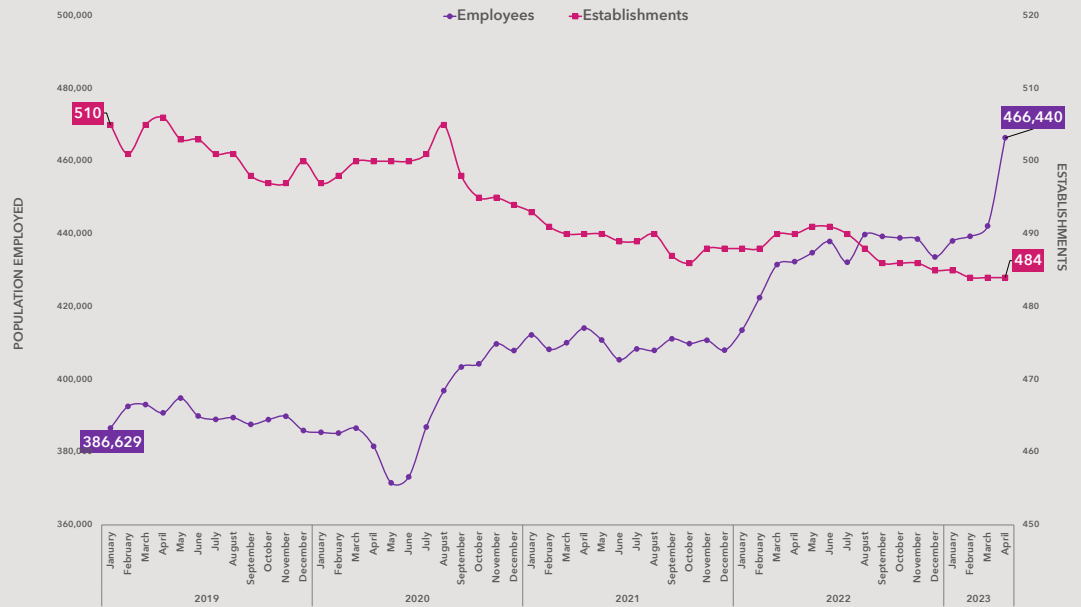

## IMMEX ESTABLISHMENTS AND POPULATION EMPLOYED IN THE STATE - 2019 TO APRIL 2023

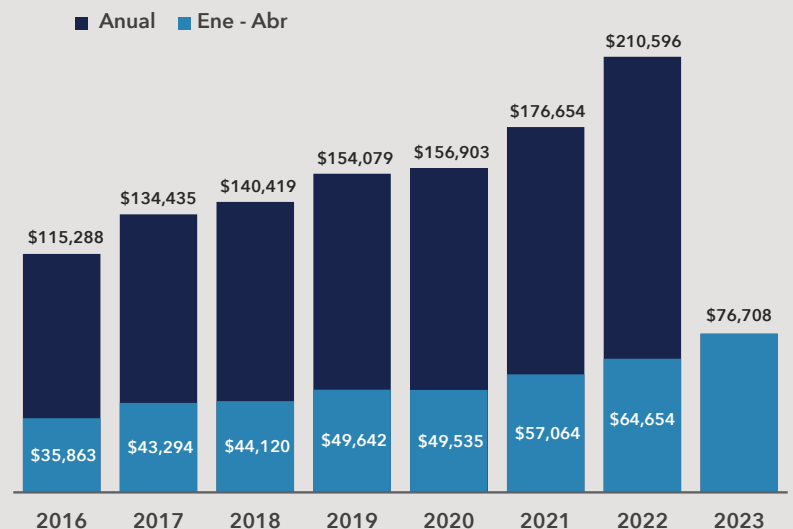

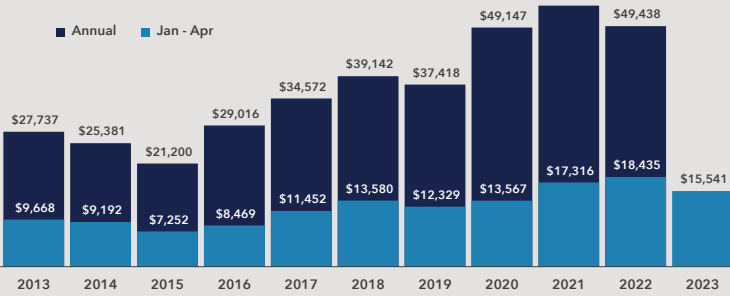

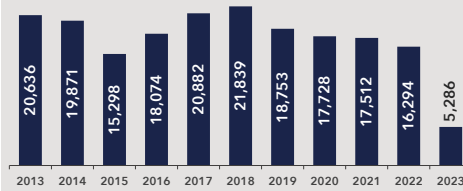

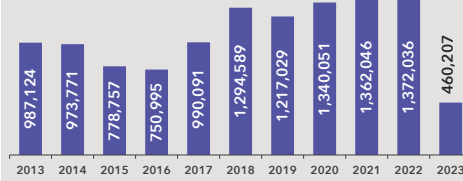

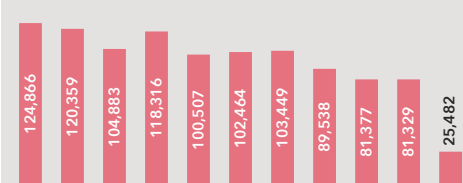

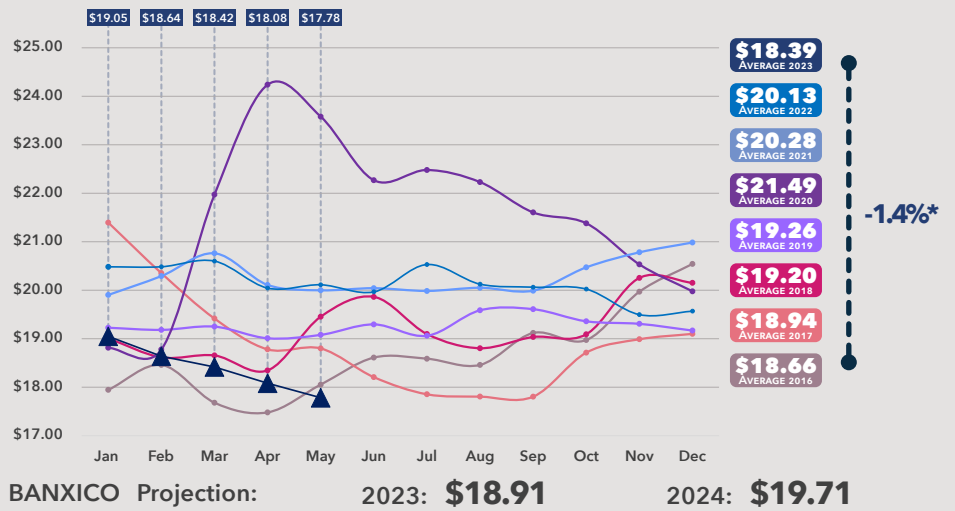

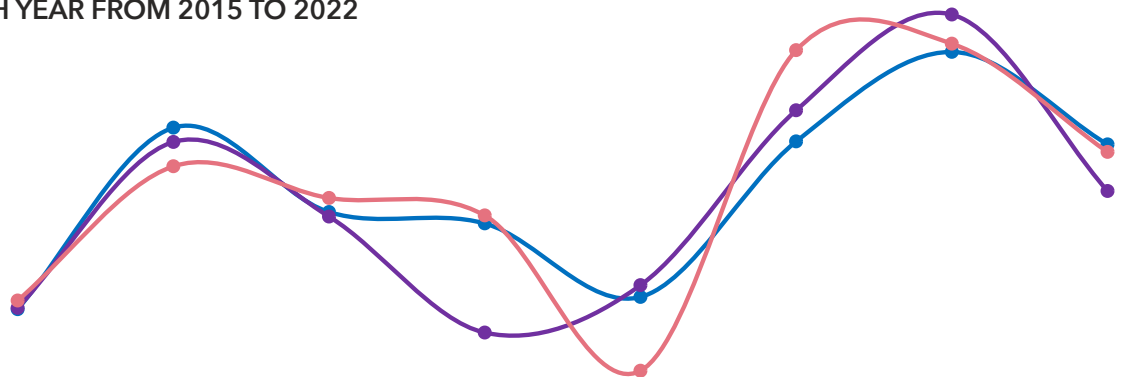
## MONTHLY AVERAGE EXCHANGE RATE VARIATION 2016 TO MAY 2023. - FIGURES IN PESOS

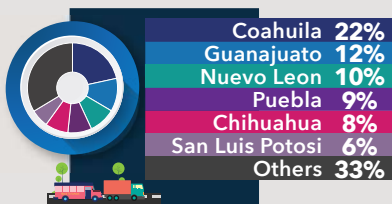

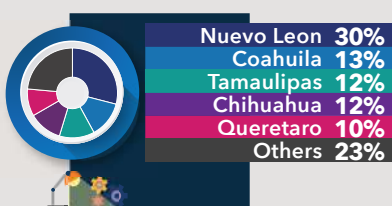
## EXPORTS BY MAIN SUBSECTORS

TO Q4 2022 - PERCENTAGE PARTICIPATION

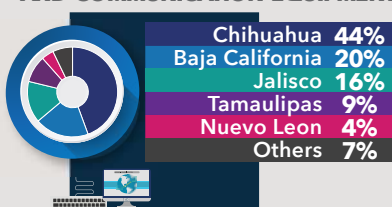

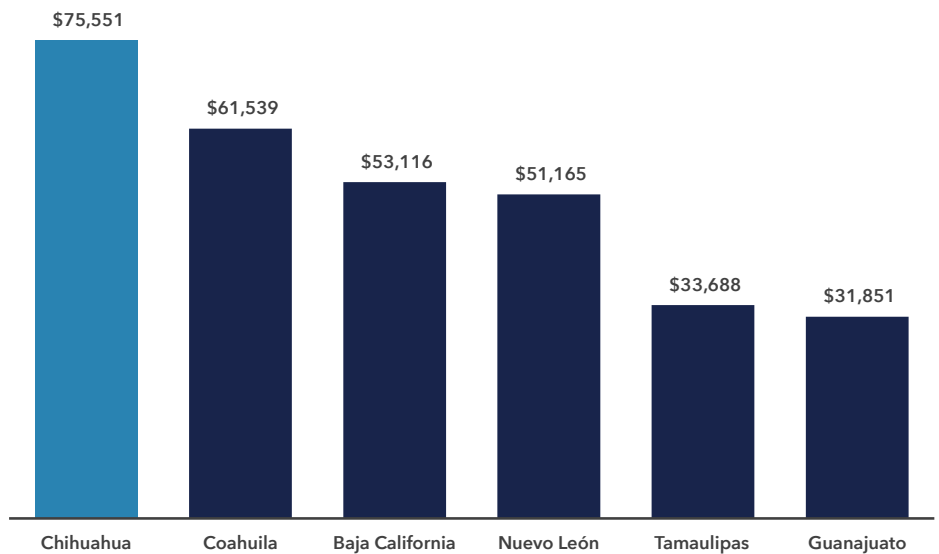

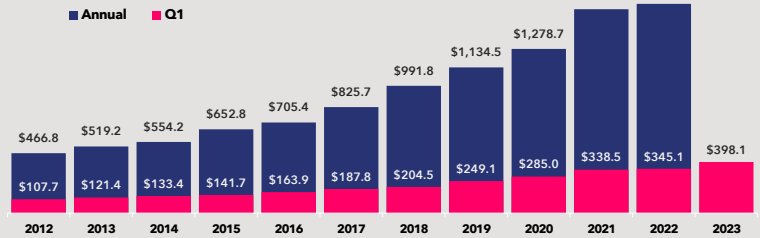

## REMITTANCE INCOME IN THE STATE

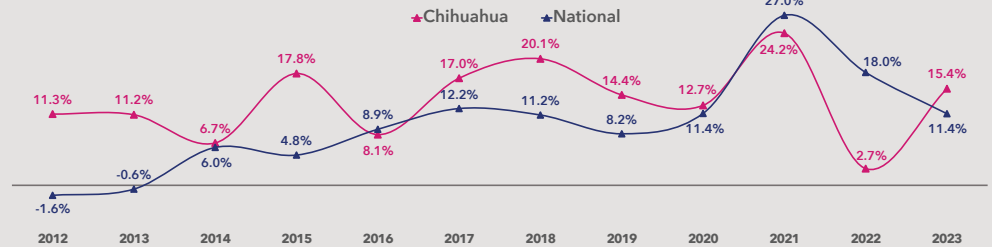
2012 TO Q1 2023 - FIGURES IN MILLION DOLLARS

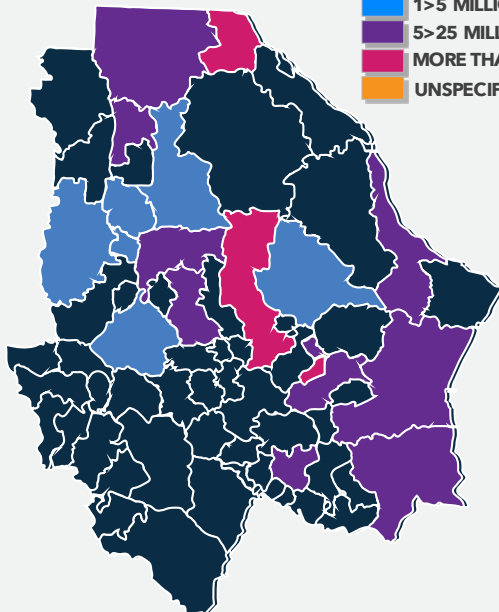
## ANNUAL VARIATION IN REMITTANCE INCOME

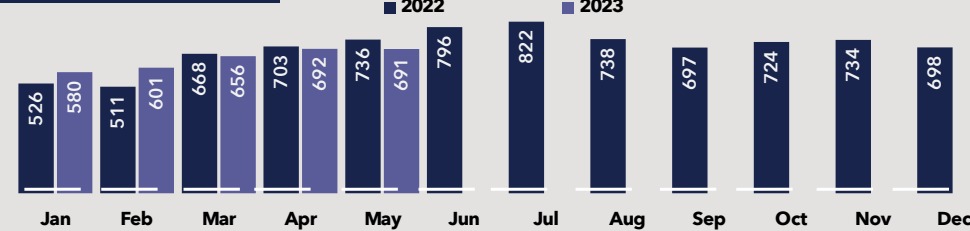

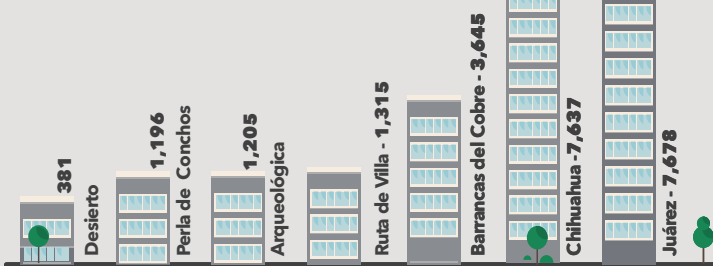

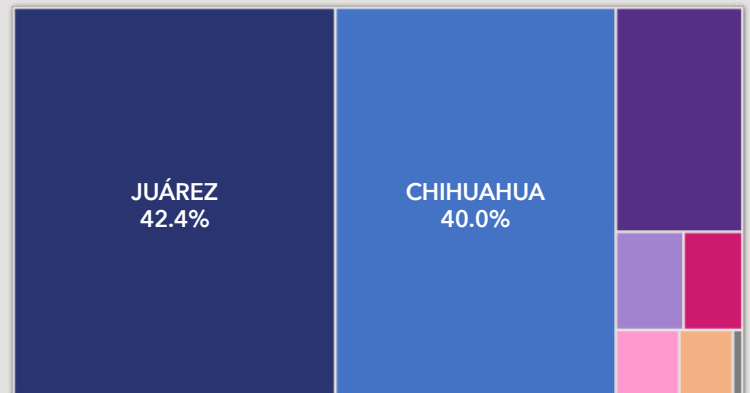

BY TOURISTIC REGION



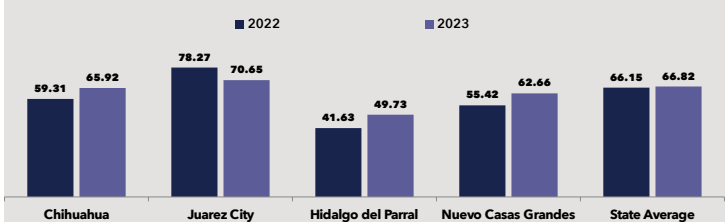

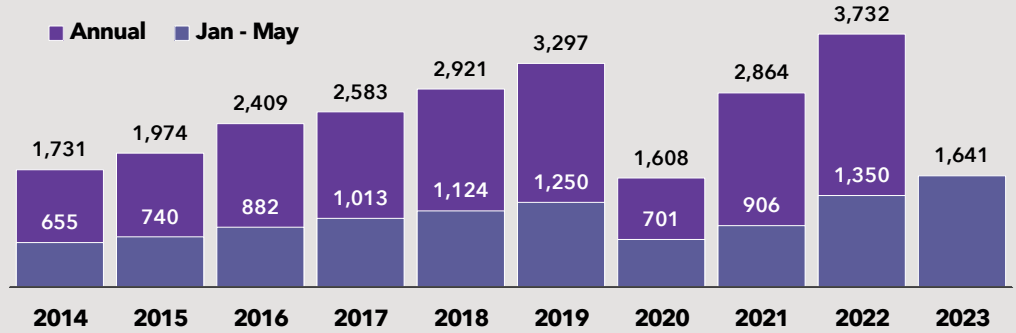

2014 TO 2023 - FIGURES IN THOUSANDS PASSENGERS

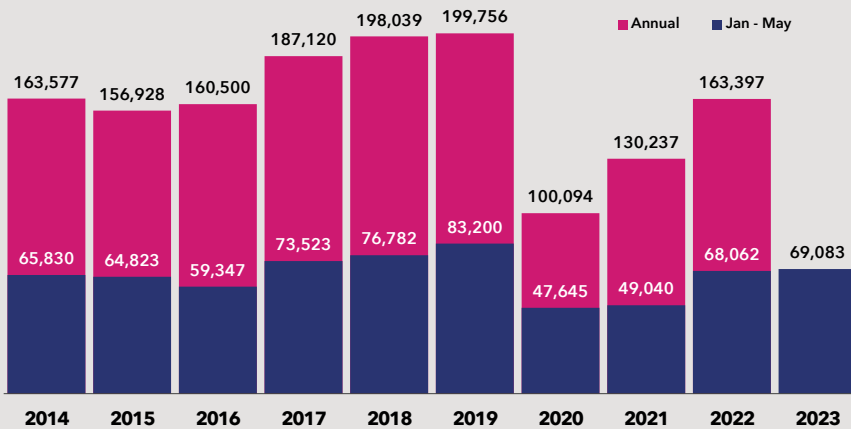

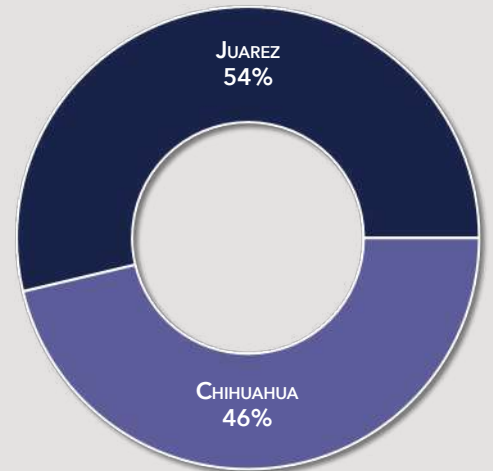
