










ANNUAL SALARY GROWTH








EMPLOYMENT AND OCCUPATION ON THE MEXICO NORTHERN BORDER STATES Q2 2023





POPULATION EMPLOYED BY COMPANY SIZE




EMPLOYED POPULATION







NUMBERS IN CONSTANT PESOS AT 2018 PRICES - 2012 TO Q1 2023





ANNUAL PERCENTAGE CHANGE - AVERAGE AS OF Q1 2023 SEASONALLY ADJUSTED SERIES








FDI BY SECTOR

FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT CAPTURED BY STATE



2013 TO Q2 2023 - NUMBERS IN MILLION OF DOLLARS






MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY AND EXPORT SERVICES





JULY 2023 - MAIN METALS FIGURES IN MILLIONS PESOS



2016 TO AUGUST 2023. - FIGURES IN PESOS



In Auguts 2023, Juarez presented an annual inflation of 2.6% lower than it was during the same period in 2022 by 7.6%. The value for Chihuahua is 4.5% lower than in August 2022, which was 9.1%; while the national inflation is 4.6%.


TOTAL EXPORTS IN THE STATE OF CHIHUAHUA

TO Q1 2023 - PERCENTAGE PARTICIPATION




TOTAL EXPORTS BY MAIN STATES

Remittances consist of all current transfers, in cash or in kind, from non-resident households to resident households, generated mainly by the migration of people to foreign economies or vice versa.


REMITTANCE INCOME IN THE STATE

From 2012 to 2016, remittances in Chihuahua showed a countercyclical trend compared to the national figure. The highest point recorded for the state in the last 12 years was in 2021, with a growth of 24.2%.






AIRPORT TRAFFIC


