



Q3 2023





### HEMPLOYMENT GENERATED PER MONTH









It is composed of people who have a paid job or engage in independent activity and have worked at least one hour during the reference week, and those who, although not having done so, maintain a formal link with their employment.


### **CHIHUAHUA STATE EMPLOYMENT**






# **GROSS VALUE ADDED**

The Gross Value Added (GVA) is defined as the sum of the monetary values of goods and services, free of duplications, produced during a specific period, typically a year. It has been calculated by the difference between total gross output and total inputs.

NUMBERS IN CONSTANT PESOS AT 2018 PRICES - 2013 TO Q3 2023









ANNUAL PERCENTAGE CHANGE - AVERAGE AS OF Q3 2023 SEASONALLY ADJUSTED SERIES




### **ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN CHIHUAHUA**








DECEMBER 2023 - MAIN METALS FIGURES IN MILLIONS PESOS



2016 TO JANUARY 2023. - FIGURES IN PESOS



In January 2023, Juarez presented an annual inflation of 4.1% lower than it was during the same period in 2022 by 2.9%. The value for Chihuahua is 5.4% lower than in January 2022, which was 5.2%; while the national inflation is 4.9%.




2013 TO Q3 2023 - FIGURES IN MILLION DOLLARS



### EXPORTS BY MAIN SUBSECTORS


TO Q3 2023 - PERCENTAGE PARTICIPATION











2015 TO 2024 - FIGURES IN THOUSANDS PASSENGERS






#### **PASSENGERS TRAFFIC**


