










EMPLOYED POPULATION - 97.7% 1,860,675









QUARTERLY INDICATOR OF STATE ECONOMIC ACTIVITY















Based on data published by the Bank of Mexico in August 2025, the expected growth of the national GDP for 2025 **0.46**% and for 2026 is **1.34**%.

For Chihuahua, the figure is the average of the variations of the Quarterly Indicator of State Economic Activity (QISEA) as of QI 2025 with seasonally adjusted figures, and for the national level, the figure is the average of the annual GVA as of QI 2025. Note: INEGI indicates that the average of the quarters of the year in the QISEA can be considered a preliminary indicator of the State Gross Domestic Product trend for that same year.



FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT ORIGIN

IN THE STATE - Q2 2025

Based on the Federal Secretary of Economy data, Mexico registered \$34.3 billion dollars in Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) as of the second quarter of 2025.

During the same period, Chihuahua received \$936.1 million dollars, contributing 2.7% of the national total, and the state is ranked 6th as the recipient of FDI after CDMX, Nuevo León, Estado de México, Baja California and Querétaro.

IN THE STATE - 2016 TO Q2 2025


































NOTE: AN UPDATE WAS MADE TO THE LODGING UNITS IN 67 MUNICIPALITIES, WHERE 834 UNITS WERE IDENTIFIED WITH A TOTAL OF 24,576 ROOMS. THIS UPDATE ALLOWED FOR THE DETERMINATION OF CATEGORIES RANGING FROM 1 TO 5 STARS. CONSEQUENTLY, THE METHODOLOGY WAS REVISED: VISITORS STAVING IN 3-5 STAR ACCOMMODATIONS WILL NOW BE CLASSIFIED AS TOURISTS, WHILE THOSE STAVING IN 1-2 STAR ACCOMMODATIONS WILL BE CONSIDERED VISITORS.
