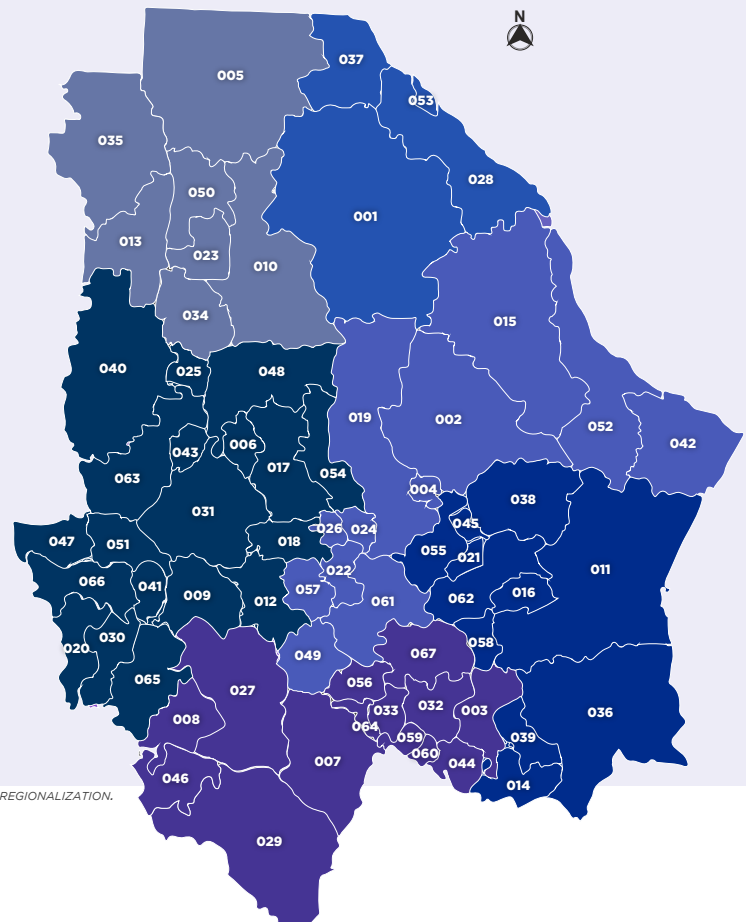

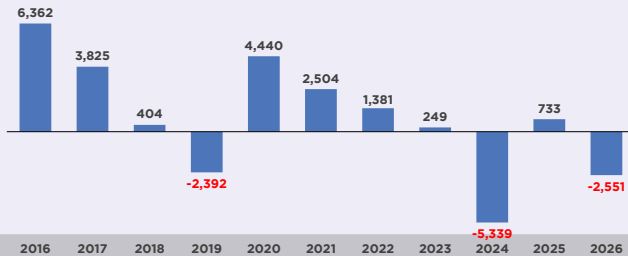

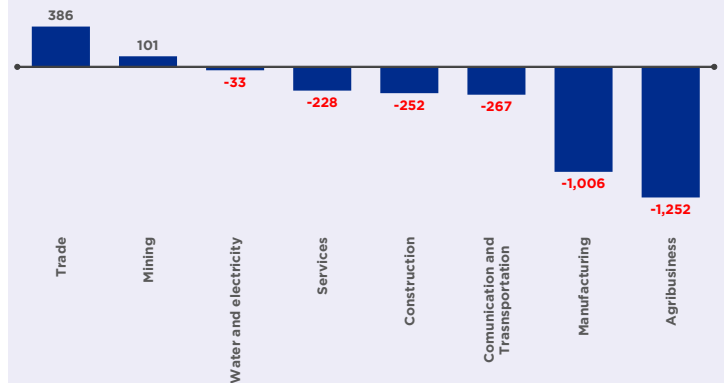

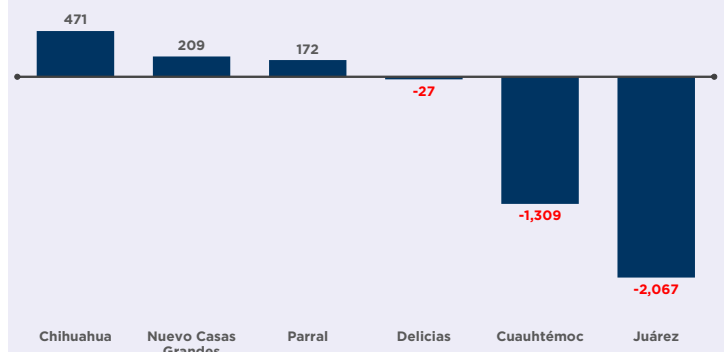

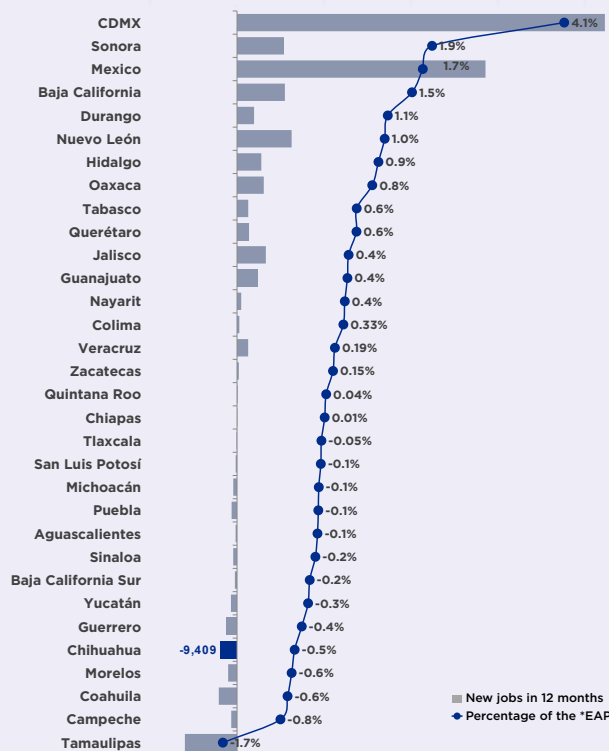
STATE EMPLOYMENT GENERATED BY SECTOR DURING JUNE 2026

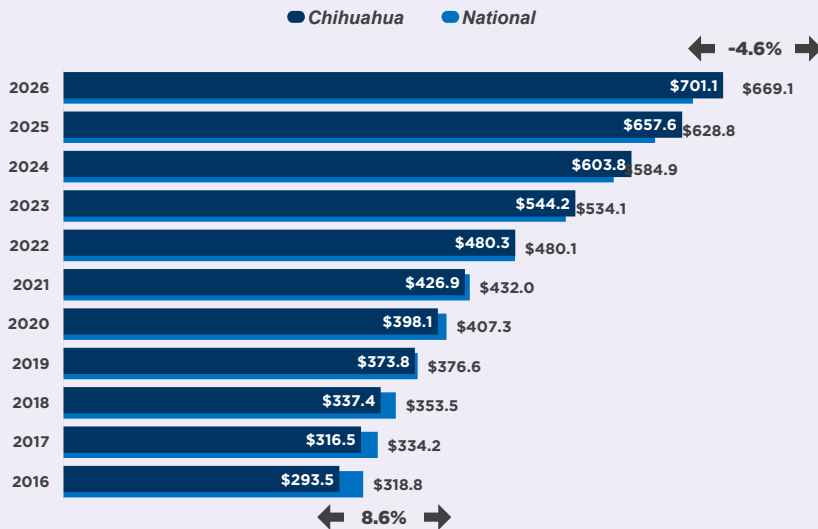

COMPARISON WITH THE NATIONAL AVERAGE AS OF JUNE OF EACH YEAR (PESOS PER DAY)



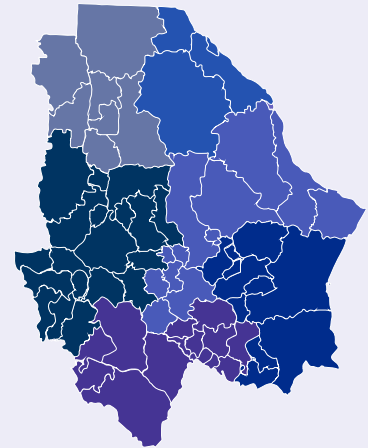

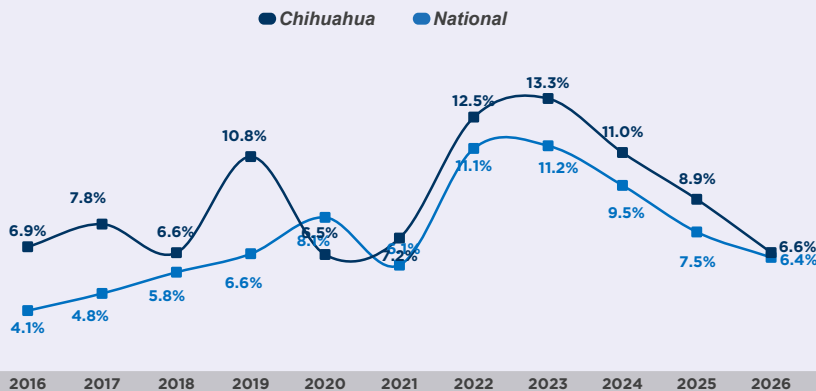

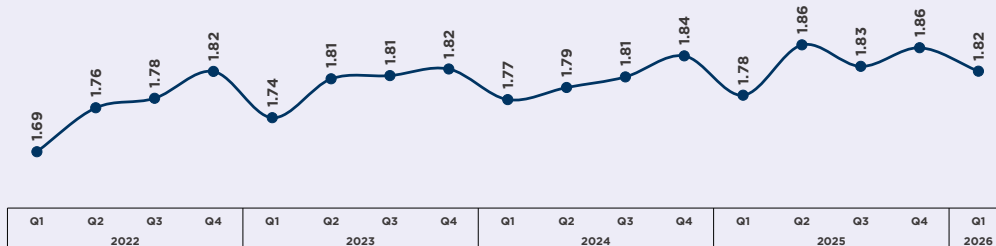

Q1 2022 TO Q4 2026 - FIGURES IN MILLIONS OF PEOPLE

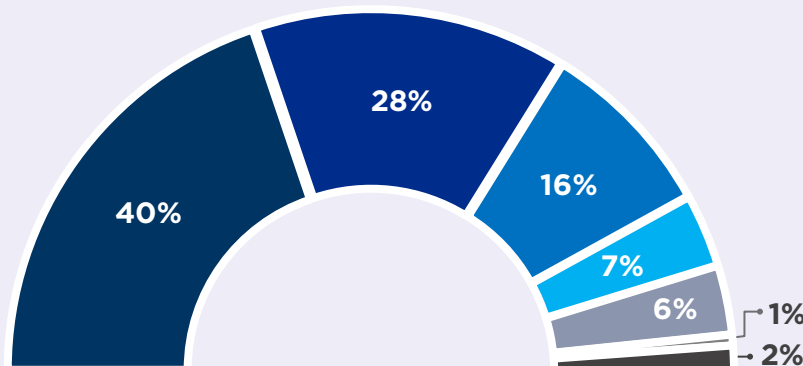

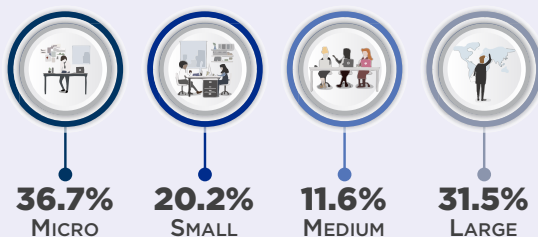

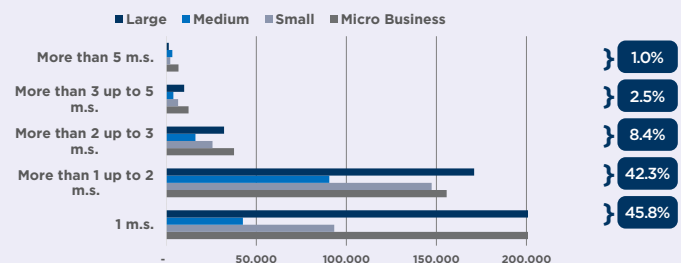
POPULATION EMPLOYED TO Q1 2026 BY SIZE OF THE ECONOMIC UNIT

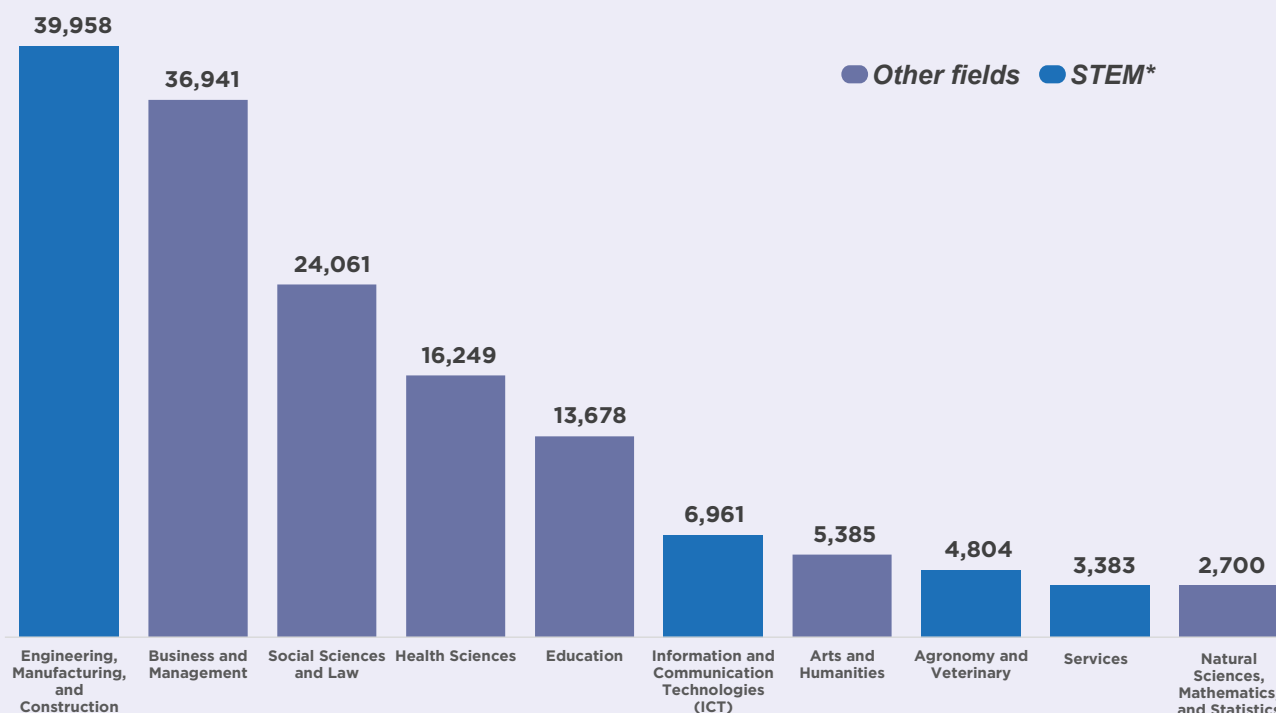

ENROLLMENT IN HIGHER EDUCATION BY FIELD OF STUDY SCHOOL CYCLE 2025 - 2026



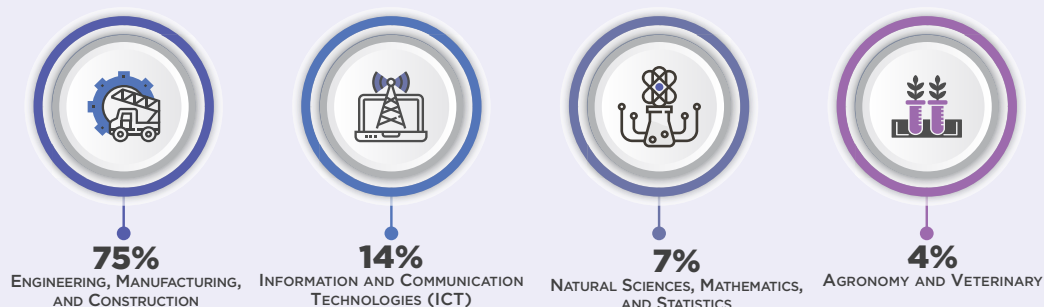

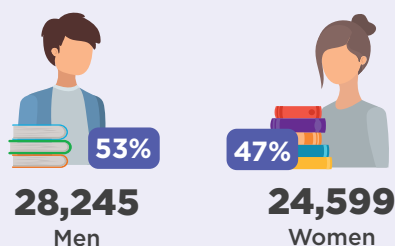

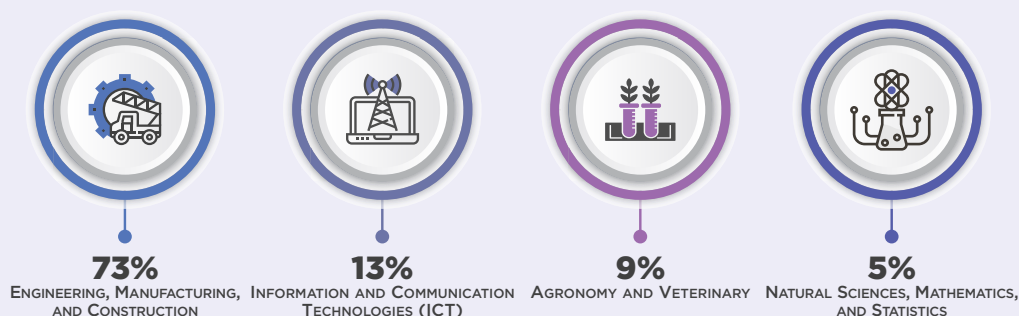

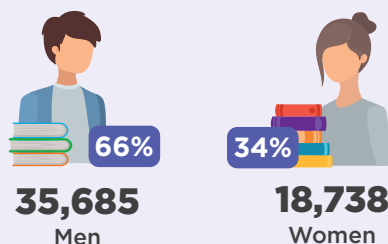

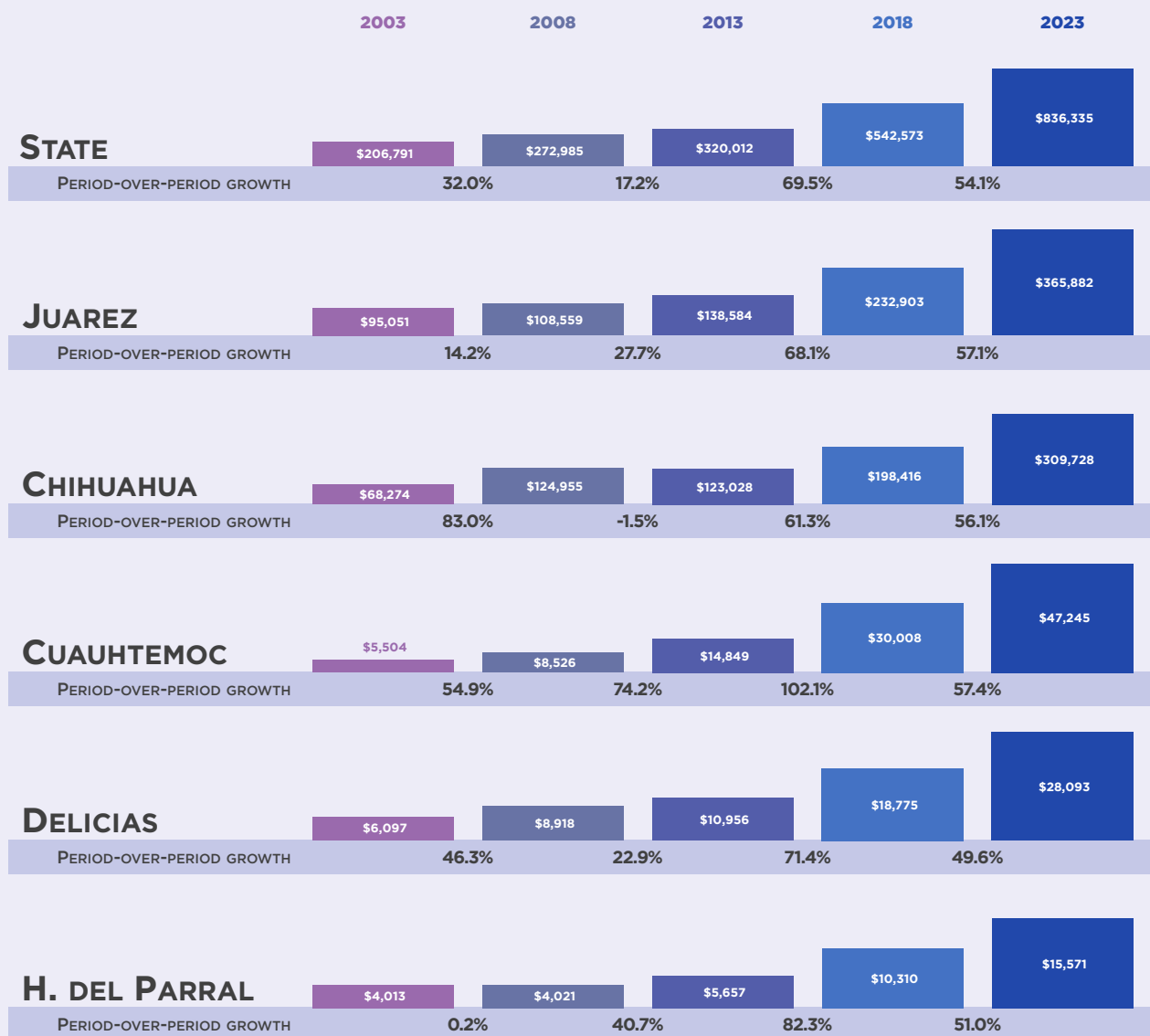

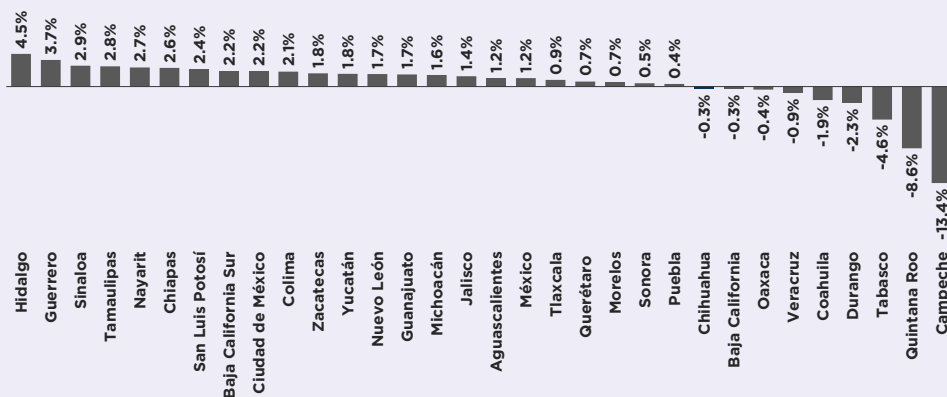

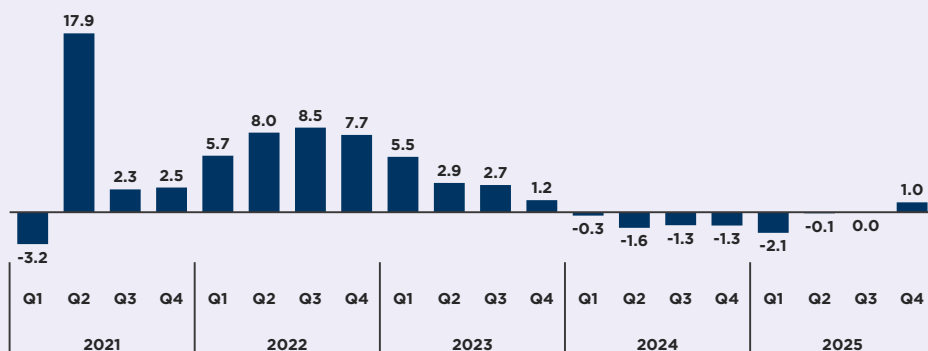


AVERAGE ECONOMIC GROWTH BY STATE ANNUAL PERCENTAGE CHANGE - AVERAGE AS OF Q4 2025

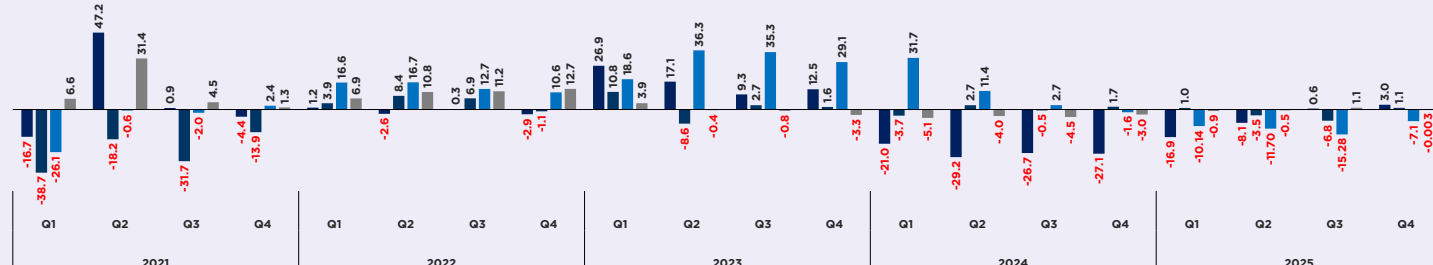

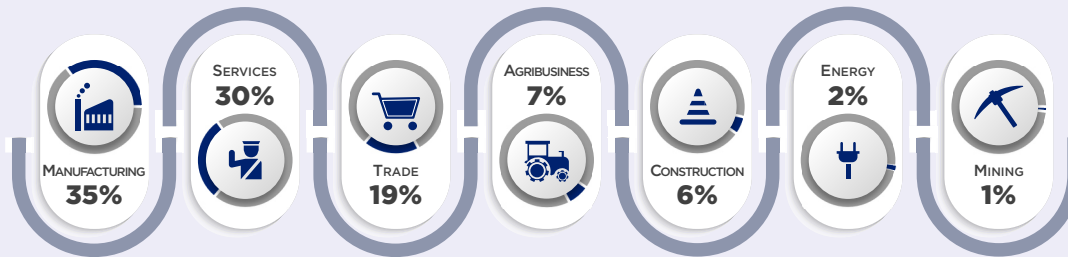

GROSS VALUE ADDED BY SECTOR ESTIMATED TO Q4 2025



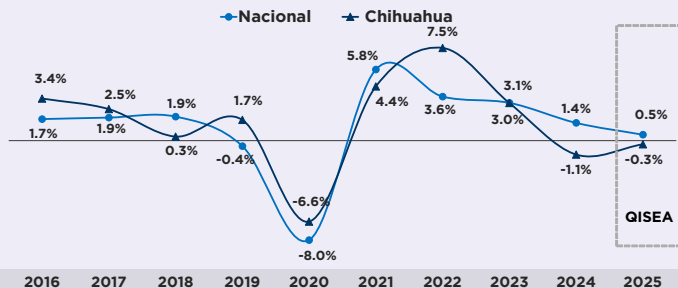

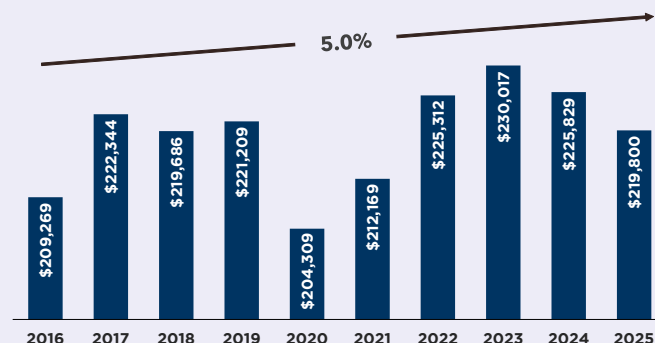
GROSS VALUE ADDED VARIATION 2016 TO Q4 2025

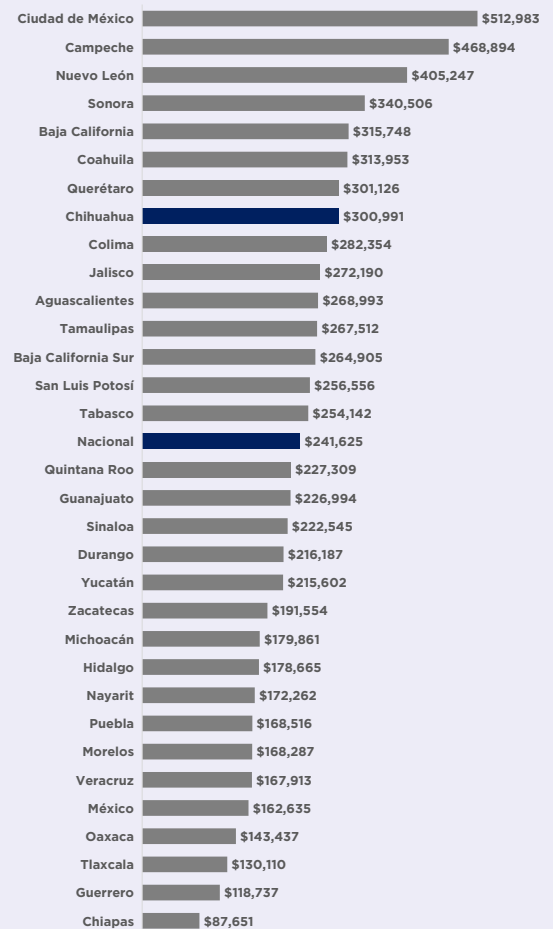

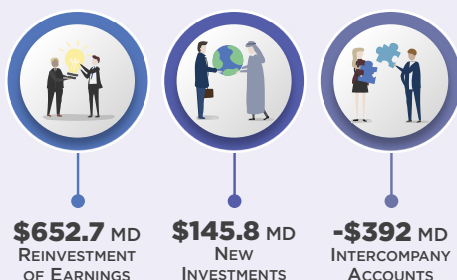
ABC OF TERMS

FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT



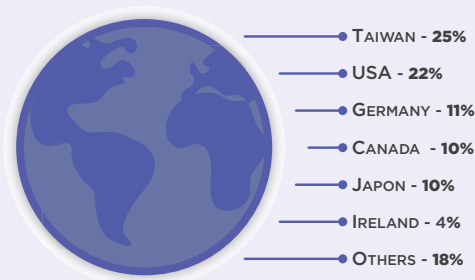
TYPE OF FDI IN THE STATE - Q1 2026



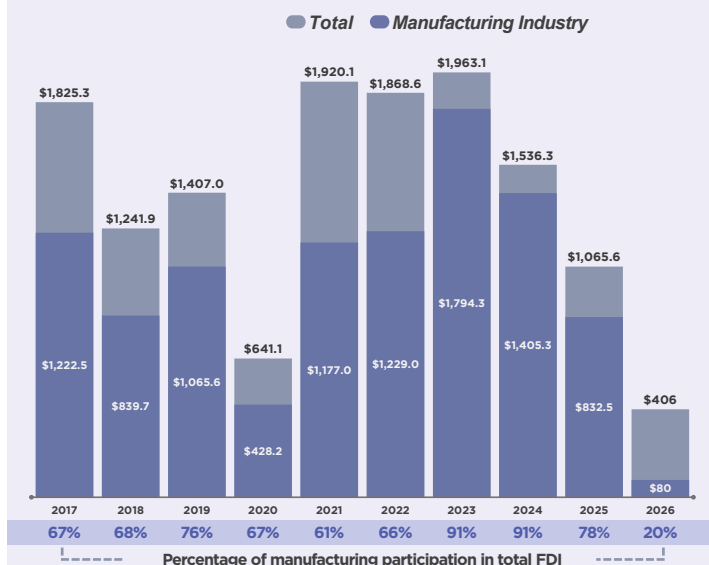
FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT ORIGIN IN THE STATE - Q1 2026

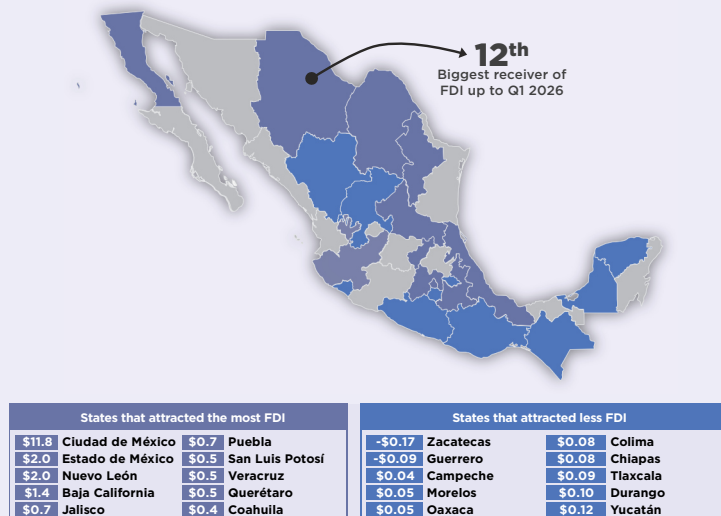
During the same period, Chihuahua received **\$406.4** million dollars, contributing **1.7%** of the national total, and the state is ranked 12th as the recipient of FDI after CDMX, Mexico State, Nuevo León, Baja California, Jalisco, Puebla, San Luis Potosí, Veracruz, Querétaro, Coahuila & Guanajuato.

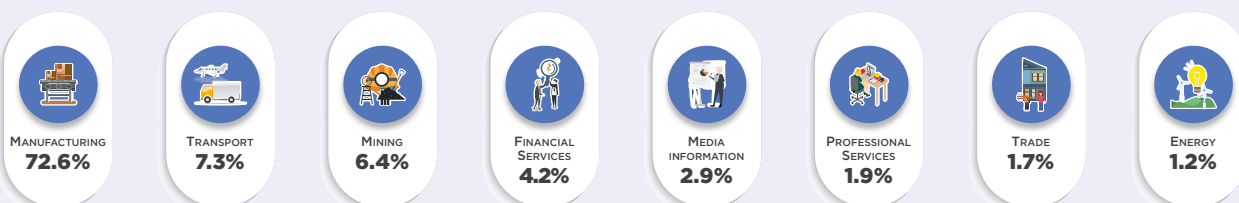


FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT CAPTURED BY STATE 2026 - FIGURES IN BILLION DOLLARS

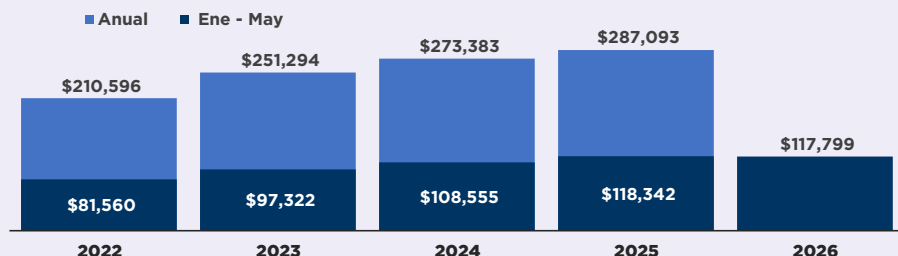

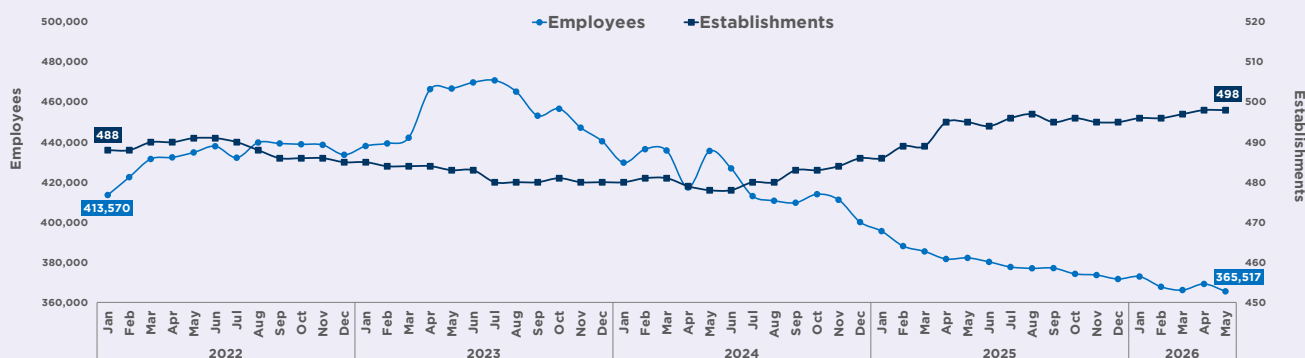

IN THE STATE - 2022 TO MAY 2026



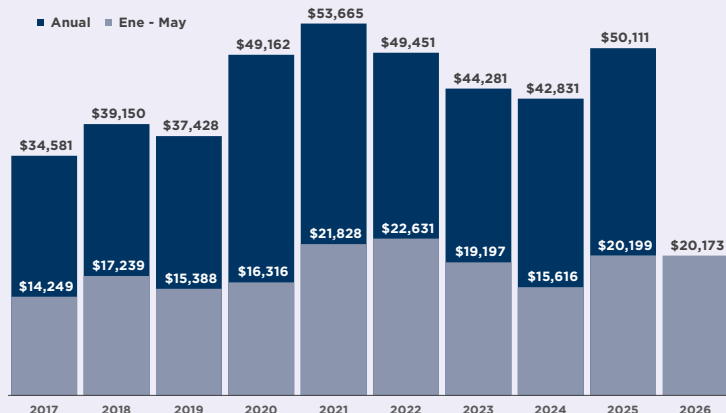

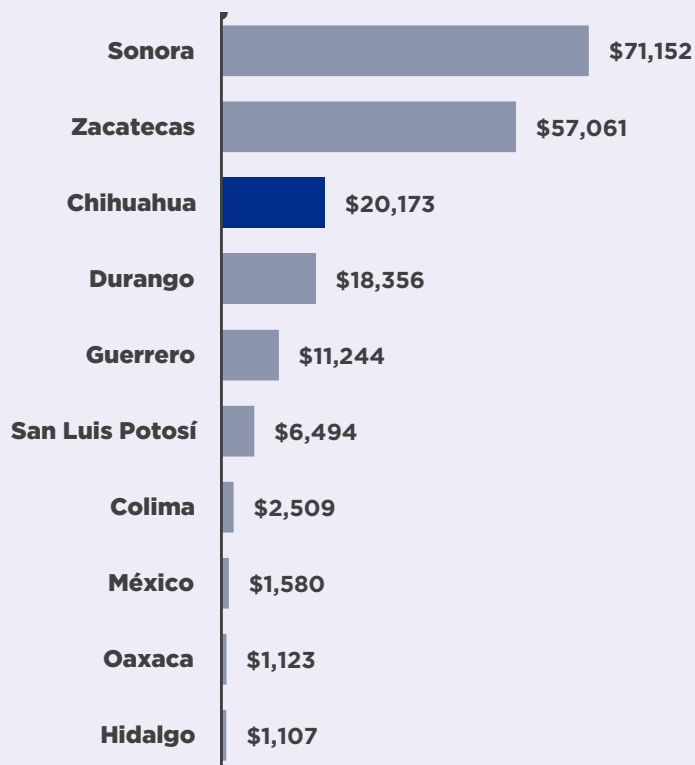

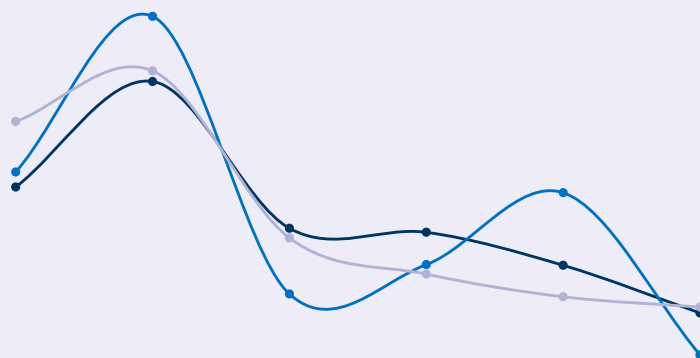

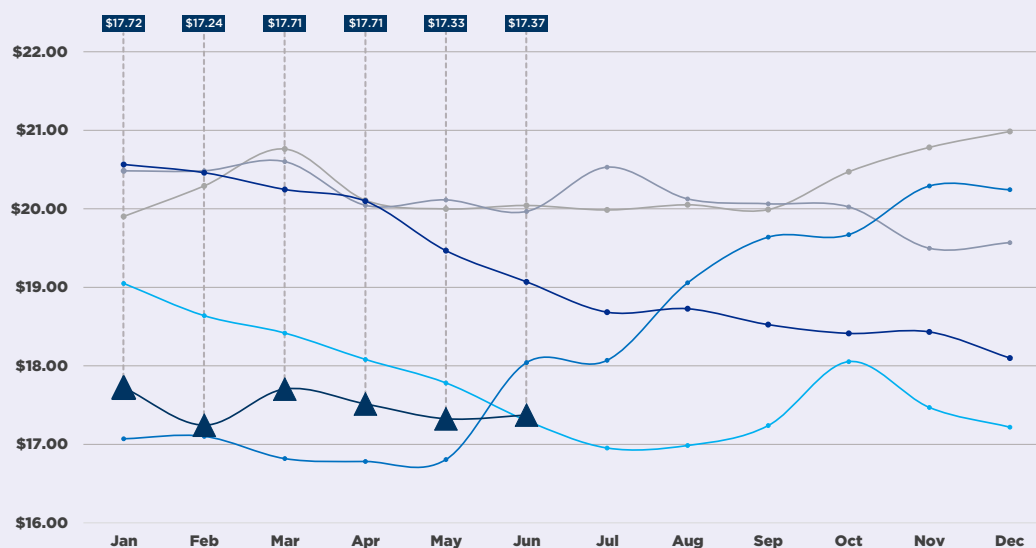

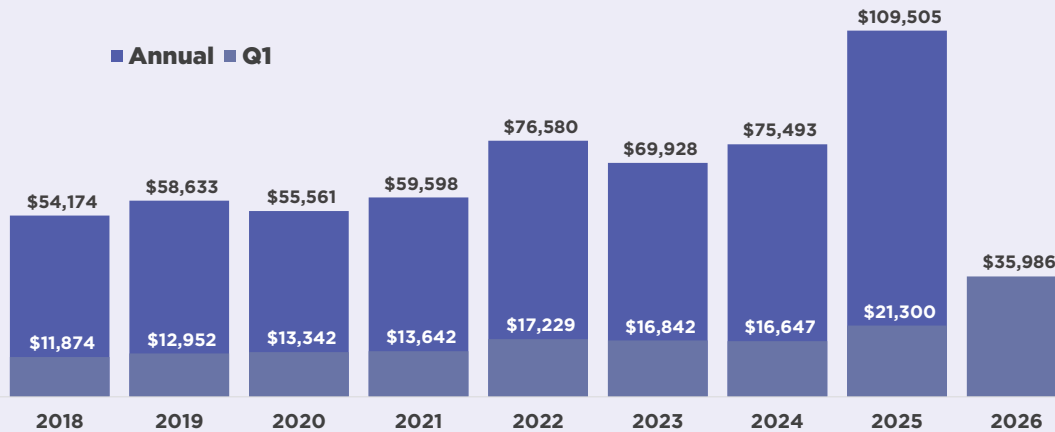

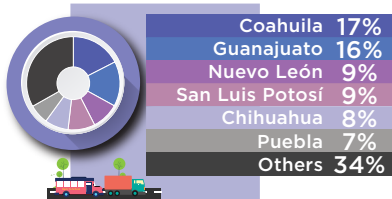

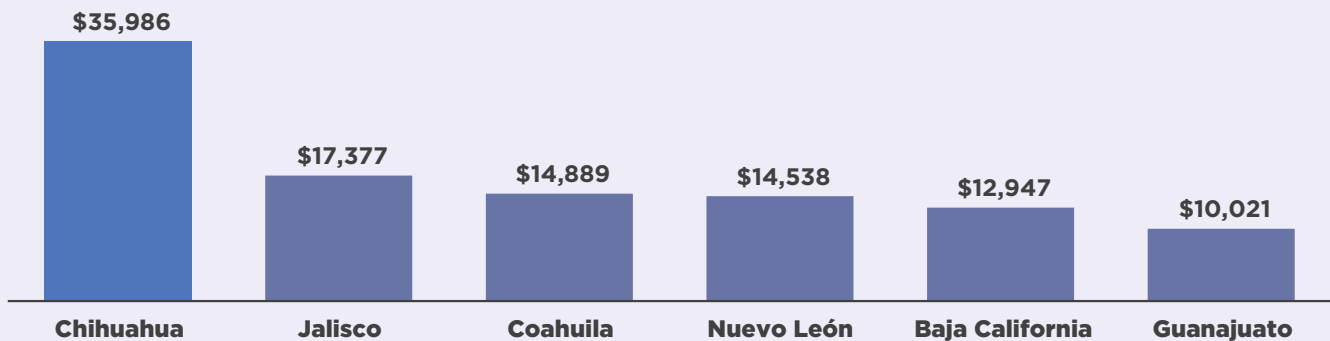

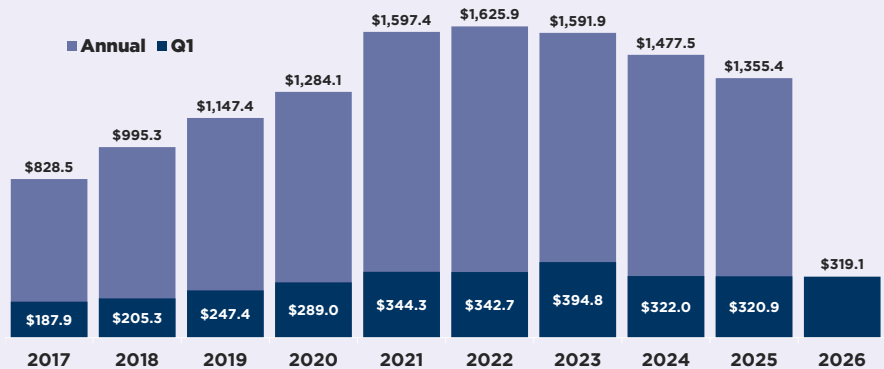

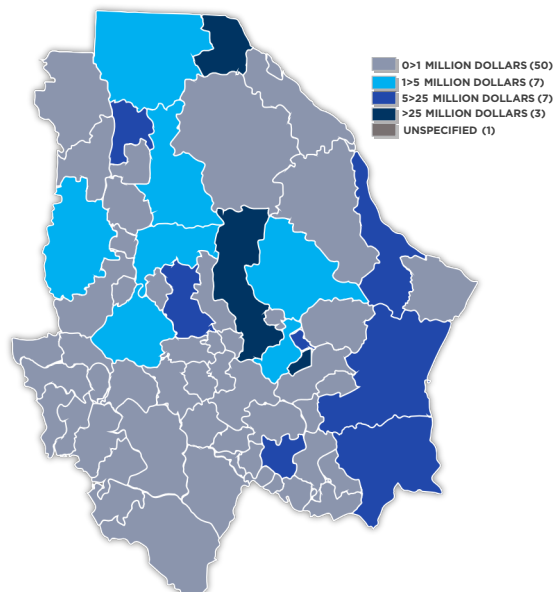
ANNUAL VARIATION IN REMITTANCE INCOME

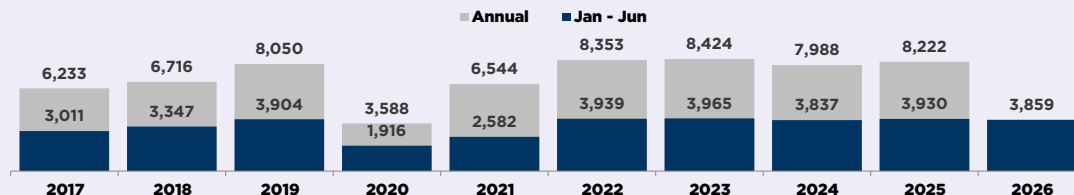

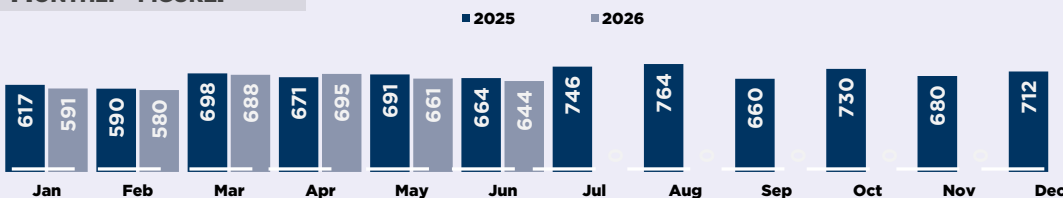

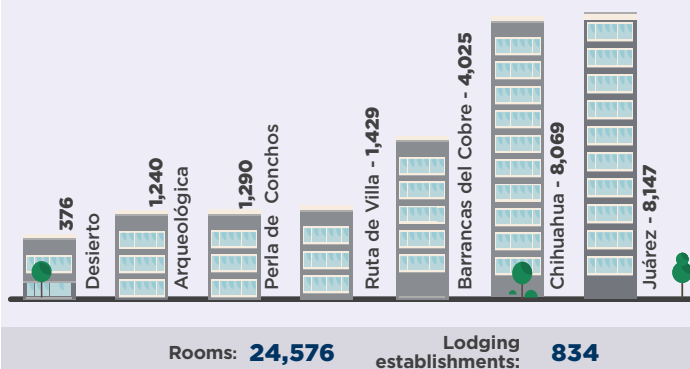

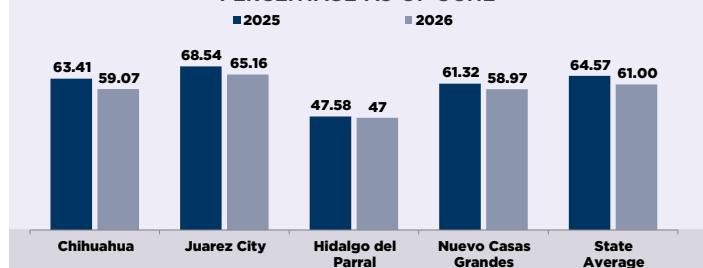


ROOMS BY TOURISTIC REGION To JUN 2026

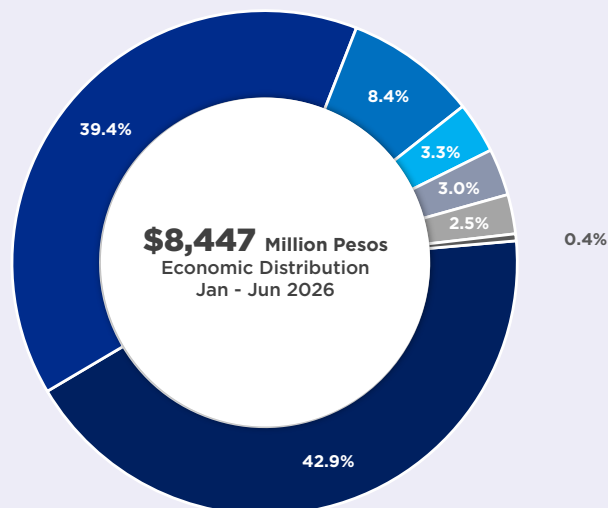
HOTEL OCCUPANCY RATE PERCENTAGE AS OF JUNE

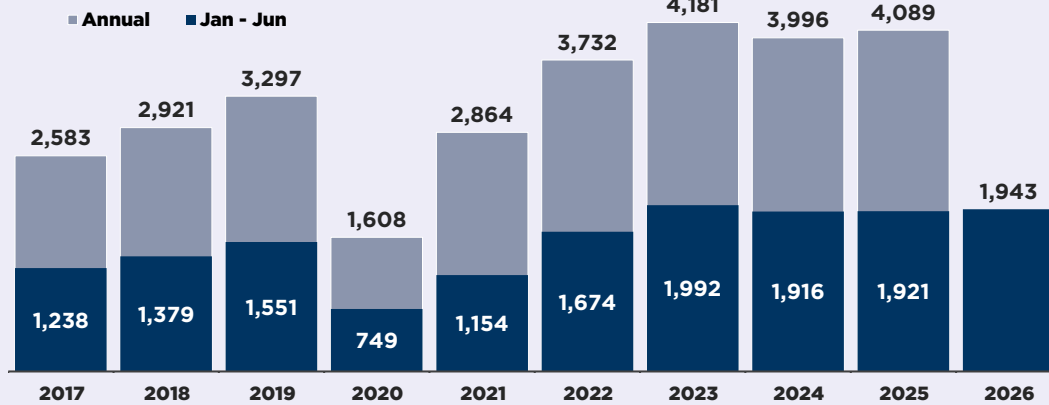

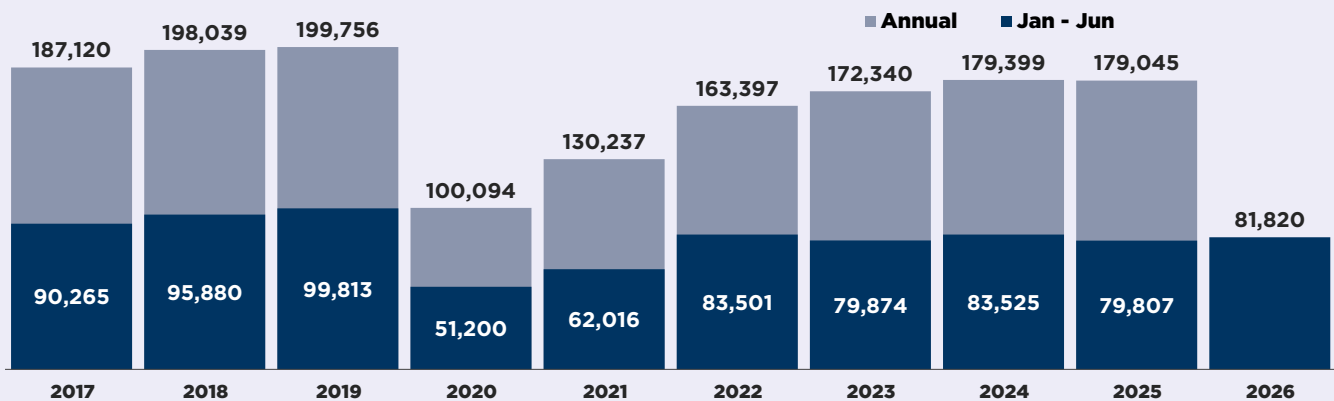

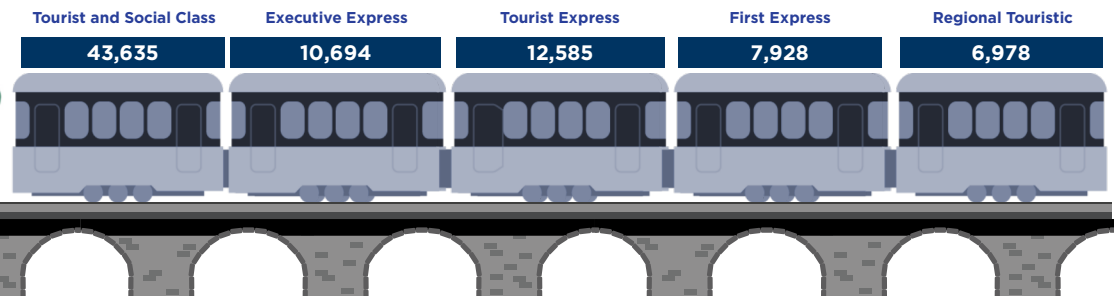
